The Somali Minister for Education, Mr. Mohamed Ali Egal, sends the following message:—  
 In presenting this special supplement to mark the Somali Republic's second birthday, we wish to send our congratulations to our neighbors in East Africa who are doing so well in the progress we have made since 1960, when the former British Somaliland Protectorate and the former Italian Somaliland united to form the Somali Republic.  
 Very few new nations in Africa have had to face so many problems even the official language of the two regions is different—Italian in the North, English in the South.  
 But much has already been done to solve the problems of the two regions. We hope to continue to work in the future so that our people may well follow in the future.  
 A country's future depends on the quality of its leadership. As Minister of Education, I have a special responsibility in the education system which will contribute to the development of the country.  
 I therefore, the output of qualified students will be geared to keep pace with the expanding economy in the fields of agriculture, science, industry and commerce.  
 We will apply equal rules in Somalia's steadily march toward a bright and prosperous future.

## FRUITFUL LAND OF MYRRH AND MILK

The Somali Republic has been known in Africa and the world as the Land of Myrrh and Milk. The name is derived from ancient Egypt. It is a land of frankincense and myrrh and milk, as referred to in the Bible.

## Bananas widely exported

The main produce of the Somali Republic comes from stock farming and agriculture, which provides sufficient quantities of cereals—hard and the soft wheat, maize and sorghum—and also many different kinds of oleaginous plants.  
 The Somali Republic figures abundantly in the records of the Chinese chroniclers and includes the Somali banana which is a reputation and is widely exported.  
 Cotton, one of the Egyptian type, is one of our most important products. It is one of our national needs. The sugar cane is also very important and satisfies national needs, while the by-products are exported.

Among the natural resources there is frankincense, the best in the world market, myrrh and gum arabic, and the Republic is the largest world producer of these precious products.  
 Animal husbandry is the Republic's great strength. The Republic's herds are estimated to number about 10 million head, including 3,000,000 camels and 2,000,000 goats.  
 The Somali sheep industry is also an important feature of the country. The finest jacks for the manufacture of Somali leather are produced in 60 per cent of the sheep and goats raised in the Republic. The U.S., Great Britain, France and Italy are the main markets for the Somali leather.  
 The Somali leopard skin of Kismayu is the most valuable in the world. The Somali cheetah skins are also highly valued.

The Somali Republic today is triangular in shape and stretches from 11 degrees 59 minutes North to 1 degree 36 minutes South and from 41 degrees 38 minutes to 51 degrees 23 minutes East. The Northern and the Eastern coasts are washed by the Red Sea and by the Indian Ocean.

It is bordered in the north-west by Kenya, Ethiopia, and Somalia, and in the north-east by the Northern Frontier Province of Kenya.

## EDUCATION MINISTRY WORKING TO UNIFY DIFFERENT POLICIES IN THE TWO REGIONS

By the Somali Republic's Minister for Education, Mr. Mohamed Ibrahim Egal.

Education was to wed these two policies together. On top of these two conflicting educational policies it must be remembered that there were also two different social languages in the two territories.

The first thing the Ministry of Education had to do in the face of this tremendous difference was to ask for expert and technical assistance from UNESCO, who in response to the appeal of the Somali Government, has established a UNESCO mission in Mogadishu.

With the help of this mission, the Ministry of Education has been able to lay down educational programmes extending over a period of ten years.

Anglo-Somali legislation has been enacted, and we envisage that over the next 10 years, a gradual process of replacing Italian with English will be completed.

These have been the educational problems posed by the young Somali Republic. It is of great magnitude, it appears that the country has been faced with a task which early and steady work will be expected to solve.

The question of needed staff has been solved, and available has been recruited. A modern, one-room secondary school has been built in the capital in the Somali Union. This school, with 1,000,000 project and it will accommodate a second school students.

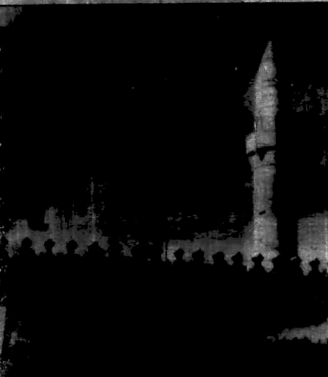
