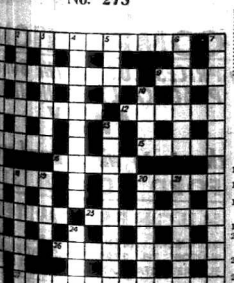

Governor opens Embu water scheme

A £80,000 water scheme which will supply 1,300 farms was opened by the Governor, Sir Patrick Renison, at Kabara in the Embu district yesterday.

Throughout the ceremony and a tour of the scheme which followed a heavy drizzle fell continuously, turning the main road into muddy tracks.

The scheme, which draws its water from the Thiba River, also supplies three villages and eight schools in an area with a population of about 10,000.

Following the project yesterday, the Governor referred to the "remarkable" development taking place in the Embu district and said that this was due to the excellent co-operation between the people of the district and the Government.

Despite the difficulties experienced in the past, the Embu district has prospered financially and has even been able to make its own contribution to the national fund of development.

Sir Patrick praised the advance made by the people in agriculture, horticulture and in stock raising.

"After a rather hesitant beginning the farmers in this part of the district have shown an enthusiasm in the planting of tea as well as the building of a factory in 1962 to produce coffee."

BEST COFFEE

The quality of the coffee was also lauded by the Governor, who said that the Embu district produced the best coffee in the country.

At the end of the ceremony, the Governor had a coffee in the Embu district and was accompanied by the local officials.

He also pointed out that the Government had made land available for development in the Embu district and that the Government was prepared to assist the people in the district in the development of a profitable project and its success.

The district council spent over more than £700,000 on water schemes in the district and the Governor said and he thought that the people had given good value with the new Kabara scheme.

This scheme was the outcome of a pilot project and its success was a result of the ability of the people to say "GO-HEAD".

"I am aware that there is a feeling that the Government has high bid. I must be remembered that the Government is not to be reduced an additional pound would have to be shouldered by the council and indirectly come out of the pocket of the district as a whole," Sir Patrick pointed out.

GO-HEAD

This project was a tremendous success and the Government is bound to be a champion for the people of the district and the financial benefits. It had to be a success, however, as the Government was difficult to secure and in Kenya's present circumstances it had to be successful.

The Member for Embu, Mr. J. N. Mwangi, who is also chairman of the A.D.C., said that the people of the area were a grateful people and they had to be remembered that the Government had to be successful in the land consolidation work. The first step was to have a better standard of farming and to have a better supply of water.

Mr. Mwangi had had a tour of the scheme in Kenya in its plans for water supply and he had seen that the water was not only used for the people in the local area but water was also used for other stages or in their homes.

Sir Patrick and other officials, who included the Minister for Agriculture, Mr. Harcourt, and the Local Government, Mr. Mwangi, were present at the ceremony.

The project which was begun last September was completed in six months and it was estimated that it will give a daily supply of 1,300,000 gallons in terms of water in size from 2 to 44 acres.

The Governor of Kenya, Sir Patrick Harcourt, is seen driving through the scheme. He is officially opening the Kabara water scheme. When Sir Patrick turned the wheel he started a supply of water in the clearing in front of the crowd watching the ceremony.

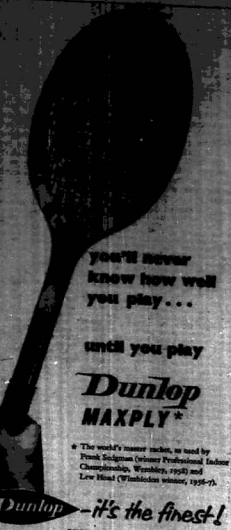

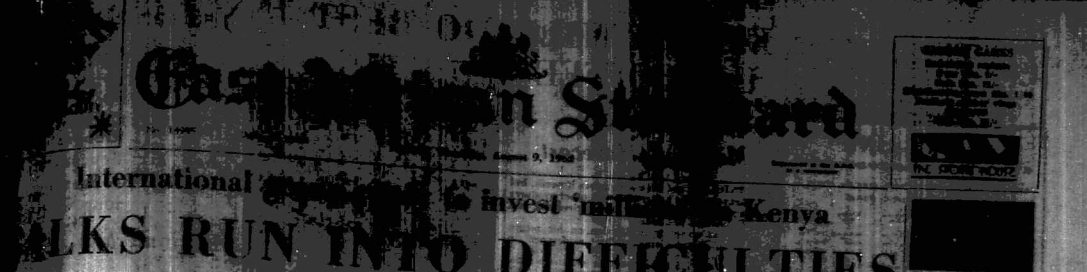

Britain scraps £25m. Blue water missile

BRITAIN yesterday scrapped a major defence project which has already cost £25,000,000 to develop the surface-to-surface guided missile, Blue Water.

The British Defence Ministry said that in view of the increasing numbers and yield of tactical nuclear weapons and also in view of current developments in the Atlantic Pact, the Government do not consider it possible to continue with the project.

The Blue Water, nicknamed the "Blue Water" because of its extremely mobility, was to have been developed in 1954-1956. It is a tactical nuclear missile which can be launched from the sea.

The announcement also said that hopes that this weapon would be adopted and purchased by other NATO countries had not been realized.
