Gold Clause Decision in United States

GOVERNMENT WINS 'ALL ALONG THE LINE
An Unconstitutional Act
COURT TAKES STEPS TO PREVENT CLAIMS BY BONDHOLDERS

The Government of the United States has won the important Supreme Court case involving the legality of the abrogation of the Gold Clause under the "New Deal."

The Court has held that the Government has no right under the Constitution to make monetary changes but in the bond holders' decision to prevent any claim from being made for payment in gold or its equivalent instead of devalued dollars at the current rate and by this prescription has saved the country from a grave emergency.

The commodity and security markets immediately reacted to the restoration of confidence resulting from Government's victory.

Colossal Sum Involved

Washington, Feb. 18. — The Government has won all the time in the important case involving the issue of the power to devalue the United States dollar.

The victory applies to private bonds, State and Municipal gold certificates, and all other securities which have been issued by the Government to raise money for the war.

The Administration has decided that no litigation is necessary. The Supreme Court has already completely severed the connection between the Gold Clause and the issue of devaluation.

Court's Decision

The Court decided: 1. In favour of the Government, that the Gold Clause does not apply in the case of private bonds.

2. Against the Government in the case of Federal bonds.

Mr. Charles E. Hughes, Chief Justice of the United States, said in his opinion that the Gold Clause obligation need not be paid off in gold or its equivalent amount of devalued currency.

Regarding Government Gold Bonds, the Court held that the Government must pay in gold or its equivalent amount of devalued currency.

The Court ruled that the Government is not bound to pay off in gold or its equivalent amount of devalued currency.

This decision means in effect that to every one thousand dollar of Gold Clause bonds the Government must pay \$100 dollars.

The Chief Justice declared that the Court was not concerned with the question of the Government's power to pay; the question was whether the Government had the power to alter the currency which was one of the important factors in the "New Deal" programme. The Court has held in fact that the action was unconstitutional but by its prevention of claims it has prevented the Federal bonds from presenting a serious crisis which would have required special action by Congress to deal with the emergency.

Private Provision

One of the questions which brought the question to a head was an action by a bondholder who had bought a \$100,000 Federal bond in 1917 and had paid for it in gold. He now claims that the Government should pay him in gold or its equivalent amount of devalued currency.

ORIENTAL MUSIC BANNED IN TURKEY

Some of the Recent
Sweeping Reforms

BAN ON CLERICAL ATTIRE

The closing weeks of 1934 witnessed several startling changes in Turkey, says the "Observer" correspondent in Istanbul.

One of the most important of these concerned Turkish women. They have been given the public-sensory role. Atatürk himself maintained that Turkish women should be on an equal footing with men, and he has already granted them numerous privileges and favours which were denied them by the Sultan during the days of the Ottoman Empire.

It was necessary to amend the Constitution in order that Turkish women should have this privilege: the new law allows all women of twenty-three to vote, while those over thirty one stand for Parliament.

The desire to grant women the vote was a sudden one and has occasioned considerable surprise. They were accorded the municipal vote five years ago, but their desire to obtain parliamentary suffrage were not successful. The fact that an International Women's Congress is being held in Istanbul in the spring of 1935 may have weighed with Atatürk. He may have wanted Turkish women to meet their sisters from other countries with the knowledge that they are Marxist at the Government of the Republic. In any case, Turkish women are heartily grateful to Atatürk, and he has received thousands of telegrams of congratulation from all parts of the country.

Oriental Music

A second reform affects music. Atatürk has never been fond of Oriental music. He has condemned its melody, its sadness and its heavy influence on the people. When opening Parliament, he always declared, "Our music does not do us honour; we must have music which is better suited to the new Turkey."

An immediate result of this declaration was that Oriental music

was forbidden in cafes, restaurants and all public places of amusement. Even the Istanbul stadium was not allowed to broadcast any Oriental airs. The Ministry of Education urged Turkish composers to set to work and produce music which would express the sentiments of the Republic.

During the composition of this music European melodies are being avoided. The melodies of leading Viennese composers and musicians are being omitted, and classical opera is to be given to Anatolian artists. It would be difficult to estimate the degree of Oriental music is popular with all classes of the older Turks among the change. But the younger generation like the same tunes as Atatürk and welcome the introduction of light operetta and jazz music.

The Turkish language has also escaped Atatürk's attention. In the years ago he changed the alphabet, substituting Latin characters for Arabic ones. The result was that millions of Turks learnt how to read and write. But, despite the change of character, thousands of Arabic, Persian and foreign words and phrases remained in the Turkish dictionary. The way led to Atatürk's liking, and, in consequence, his language reform has not mastered the new language "from Turkey" and a dictionary will shortly appear. This reform is the unpopular with the older generations, but it has done its day.

A Religious Reform

Lastly, the religious representatives of the Moslem, Orthodox Catholic, Jewish, Armenian and Protestant faiths have been forbidden to wear their clerical robes in public. The law will not be applied for six months, but Orthodox Catholic clergy have already expressed their disapproval. The position of Greek Orthodox priests in Turkey—and there are many of them—offers the fact that the Dimanchi Patriarch has said he will be the Pharis in Istanbul—has

ANOTHER NATIONAL PARK

Proposed Forest Area
in the Union

THE TETZEKAMMA RESERVE

(BY SYDNEY'S CORRESPONDENT).

Plans are afoot for the establishment of a National National Park in the Union.

It is likely to extend over approximately 100 square miles, but it is not yet settled whether it will form a single area or be in two separate blocks.

The Tetzekamma National Park is the name suggested for the new playground which holds promise to be one of the most attractive tourist resorts in the country. Even now the neighbourhood attracts hundreds of visitors yearly to the Johannesburg "Sunday Times".

Situated between the Orange Mountains and the sea, the proposed National Park is for the most part covered with dense natural forest, controlled by the Government. For if any disturbance of this area is anticipated.

Mount Funtswana, one of the highest peaks in the Cape Province, remaining 5,000 feet will be in the heart of the Park.

Principal Bush

Hunting Ban

By virtue of the Forest Regulations shooting and hunting are forbidden in the area. A distance of some 40 miles separates the heart of the elephant country from the most valuable parts of the Tetzekamma bush, for which reason certain difficulties of hunting exist. The Krugers Publishers Association is strongly fostering the National Park project, which may ultimately cover far more than 100 square miles.

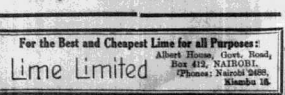

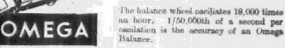

Broken Lease of a Godown Site

Important Judgment At Mombasa

QUESTION OF COMPENSATION

An important judgment was delivered by Mr. Justice W. H. Horn on February 11 in the case of the Mombasa Bonded Warehouse Co. v. Liquidators of the Mombasa Bonded Warehouse Co., in liquidation.

The facts before the Court were that the Mombasa Bonded Warehouse Co. had acquired the lease of a plot of land under which lease there was still approximately 30 years to run at a rate of 60 cents per sq. ft. per annum (1/20th of a pound) for the first 15 years. The tenant had to pay the landlord a rate and the tenant had erected a building of 12 godowns on the site which under the lease was limited to the sole property of the tenant.

The landlord's claim was for compensation for breaking the lease, including his claim on the full aggregate of the rents payable under the lease for thirty years amounting to £3,772, making a total claim of £7,789 from which he was prepared to make a deduction of £1,789, leaving a net claim of £6,000. It was also stated that the tenant had been prepared to pay the rent which he had estimated from the plot during the 30 years term as he had headed back to him.

The Official Receiver on behalf of the tenant maintained that the compensation for loss of rent under the lease should be fixed at a sum of money as an investor would be prepared to pay for the 30 years term, so that the investment cost of the rents would be 10 per cent per annum on the amount which he was able to lay aside as annual sinking fund at 3 per cent, which, on the expiration of the 30 years term, would return to him the capital sum he had laid out. The Official Receiver stated that the rate of interest higher than the rate, was not claimable for the site, it was a risky investment and the investor would require at least 10 per cent interest to cover the risk. On this basis the calculation for loss of rent worked out at £1,872.

"A Reasonable Assumption"

The Official Receiver further estimated that the rent obtainable today for the site was at least 10 cents per sq. ft. per annum and it was a reasonable assumption that the rent would slowly increase and that the tenant had made a speculation showing a gradual increase up to 30 cents per sq. ft. which was only half the rental actually received under the lease. As however this was a calculation based on rent paid and not on a risky lease, the investor would require only 5 per cent on this investment and a 3 per cent sinking fund. On this calculation the Official Receiver claimed a deduction of £1,000 and he also claimed that the building was worth £975.

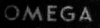

CAPE SILVER TREES

Five Years' Plan to be Put into Effect

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT].
Durban, February 23
(By Air Mail.)

Systematic efforts are at last to be made to save the South African silver trees by systematic planting.

Experience has shown the vastness of all efforts to grow these anywhere but at the Cape, and then only in certain spots. One military expedition from the Witwatersrand University grounds, a few miles from Keimoes, and some others make a tactic for survival at Mafeking.

The only place where they are really flourishing is on certain parts of Table Mountain.

Work has just started on the planting of a substantial area in the grounds of King's College, Botanic Gardens, on tracing the substantial areas infested with a peculiar silver tree disease, and on roads and various more visible spots of trees which have established themselves and are covering up the silver trees.

The Botanic Gardens work which is partly controlled by the Union Government, partly by the Botanical Society of South Africa and partly by the City of Cape Town, have formed a "Five Year Plan" to save the most famous feature of the local flora.

Clearing Area

Klaarfontein Valley, an area above the main Kloofbosch Park, is being cleared by a costly durable labour gang (says the "Sunday Times"). Some 100,000 over 20 acres are at the outset to be reserved as "Silver Tree Country".

With great care plants are being grown from seeds and the seedlings planted on the mountain. Labourers are engaged in clearing away brambles, any poplars, cluster pine, larch, and sycamores which are regarded as deadly enemies of the trees. Much valuable help has been promised by the owners of neighbouring estates, notably by Mr. H. Twiss, who, on his large property, has succeeded in saving a unique forest of this type from destruction.

A Novel Scheme in Belgravia

AUSTRALIAN TARIFFS

New Duties and a New System

In December the Australian Commonwealth Government introduced a new tariff schedule, as recommended by the Official Tariff Board. Generally the duties were reduced by 25 per cent, a favourable balance on the Australian trade of about 3 million pounds was given additional advantages.

Sir John Simon to Visit Berlin

NEGOTIATIONS TO COVER GROUND OF ANGLO-FRENCH AGREEMENT

It has been decided that Sir John Simon will visit Berlin early in March for the purpose of discussing with the German Government the question of international co-operation in securing the pacification of Europe.

The outlook is very hopeful as a result of Germany's attitude to the problem, and her expressed readiness to discuss all matters arising out of the recent Anglo-French agreement.

It has also been suggested that Sir John Simon should extend his journey to Moscow and Warsaw, as it is considered that such a tour would advance the cause of a general European settlement.

Exchange of Visits

That the Ministers should visit each other is the general feeling in the Anglo-French entente. The French Government also sees the advantages in the reciprocal visits of Ministers.

It has not yet been settled whether the negotiations will be conducted by the John Simon in London, through the French Embassy in London, through the French Legation in Paris, or through the French Legation in London.

The question of the duration of the visit at present appears to be the most difficult question in the way of general European settlement.
