To-Night's Films

Capitol Theatre
A fine cast, headed by Helen Hayes, Gary Cooper and Adolphe Menjou appears tonight in a Paramount Picture "A Foreign Affair" at the Capitol Theatre. This is the film version of Ernest Hemingway's novel of the same name, and it tells most magnificently the story of a man and woman who loved greatly against the grim background of the Great War. Gary Cooper plays the role of Frederick Henry, an American lieutenant in the Italian ambulance corps, who had been a typical "hard case" until the day he met Catherine Barkley (Helen Hayes) a gorgeous and beautiful English nurse. The two meet through luck (Adolphe Menjou), an Italian army surgeon and Frederick a lost friend and war brother. Even the best part of the story suggests endless possibilities which are all most effectively spiritualized in "A Foreign Affair" and the setting, war scenes in the Alps in picturesque and realistic detail, and the love scenes of Frederick Henry and his leading character, lends interest to the story. Mr. Hemingway's novel served in the Italian Ambulance Corps during the war and was the basis for the film. The film was transferred to the Italian scene where he served for some time. So he is, in "A Foreign Affair" is re-creating his part in his life and, as always, he plays his role excellently. The film was very well reviewed in the Press.

During the wet weather of the season, when the rain filled the holes from which the earth had been dug, the walking process, as well as all other operations, was possible. Nevertheless, according to Mr. Down, a great deal of alluvial gold has been obtained in payable quantities.

Untroubled Areas
Mr. Down expressed his confidence in the great possibilities of the future development of the fields of northern Tanganyika. He quoted the opinions of mining experts who had visited the country and who had definitely stated that there were hundreds of square miles of land which was gold-bearing (alluvial), and was completely untroubled, while in addition, small reefs—probably string reefs of a great untroubled reef—were continually being found. It was not, however, purely as a gold mining district that this part of the Mandated Territory was going ahead, according to Mr. Down. It had very considerable agricultural possibilities.

Coffee Planting
In regard to coffee, there were some wonderful farms, which produced a very high figure of quality coffee, it is believed owing to the amount of decomposed manure and peat in the soil. At present Mtwara and Mbege coffee was fetching excellent prices on the market.

Mr. Down expressed the opinion that this would become an important coffee district. There were about 60 farms in production, and with the exception of a small patch planted during the days of German occupation, there were no trees over 10 years old.

Maize Possibilities
Another field for agricultural activity was maize growing. Although there was a big demand by the mining community for maize, only native grown was available, and that at a very high price, which sometimes reached a figure of Shs. 25 a bag. Much of the soil around the Lupa was very suitable for the planting of maize, but the considerable local market could be sold on the spot at an economic return.

In view of the possibilities of the production of this much needed cereal, Mr. Down stated that he understood that Government was considering a scheme of leasing parcels of land to private individuals at a reasonable rental, to be held for 20 years, on terms for the purpose of maize growing. Additional to the large supply made by the mining industry, there was the possibility of facilities being forthcoming for export to and through Nataland. With

A Dinner Speech
At the dinner given by Sir Neville Pearson and the London Chamber of Mines, the following oration was delivered (Goldfields, Mr. Murray Hughes, after tracing the history of gold alluvial mining in Kenya with the geological structure of the Kenya Goldfields. Wherever in Africa the formation of the Young Granite made its appearance, there was the source of the porphyry richly mineralized zones of ore which took different forms in different localities. Working on this knowledge he had, while in Government service, mapped out areas where the contact of the Young Granite appeared, and his suggestions, fully noted upon, led to immediate finds. "This was also proved in the Concession awarded to the Kenya Consolidated Goldfields, wherein a belt of Young Granite, about 120 miles in length with an average width of about two miles exists, in which system of gold-bearing veins is being opened up, an aggregate strike of 10,000 ft. reef having already been proved."

Similar to Canada

Progress of British Flying Clubs in 1934

More Members and More Aircraft Used

London, Feb. 5.
British flying clubs reached a high point of activity in 1934. More than 100,000 flights were set for hours and days, and aircraft employed and aviators trained. On every hand a big advance is shown over 1933.
Thirty clubs, of which two are at present only in the early stages of formation, receive a measure of government subsidization. Between twenty-six of them stand an aggregate membership of 7,116 (31 against 4,800 for all subsidized clubs, one year ago). Subsidized flying members totalled 4,010 against 2,565 on December 31, 1933. Hours flown were 23,008, compared with 20,005. Incidentally, the 1934 figures are equivalent to a conservative estimate of more than three million miles. Number of flights made shows a similar increase from about 70,000 to more than 73,000.
The work of these twenty-six clubs engaged 97 aircraft, or thirty-two more than were required by all the subsidized clubs in 1933. Amateurs alone trained 24,000 pilots, of which 17,000 are commercial, second-class navigators 9, against 52 and ground engineers 17, against 5. Unsubsidized clubs are still well.

Returned from eleven of these show membership aggregating 2,292, of which 772 make up flying members; 8,237 hours done; and 24 aircraft in use.
Considering only subsidized clubs, the average club added 100 to its membership, a substantial improvement on earlier years. Some of the clubs used their aircraft much more intensively. The Brooklands club and school flew 3,200 hours with five aircraft, an average of 640 hours per machine. The Bristol and Wessex Club, using four aeroplanes, flew 1,704 hours, averaging 430 hours per aircraft; the Hereford and Gloucestershire club with five aeroplanes flew 1,300 hours, with an average of 260 hours per machine. How Companies Are Faring

Some Recent Reports from London

RAILWAY BUILDING SOCIETY AND COLLIERIES

By Mr. H. H. WILKINSON, Correspondent, London, Feb. 25.

As was forecast by the chairman of D. Napier and Son, makers of the prototype engine, at the meeting last March, the company has again had a lean year. After transfer of £10,000 from reserve for contingencies towards special development expenditure on an account of the loss on trading for the 12 months ended September 30 of £23,011, compared with a loss of £27,198 for 1932-33, but thanks to income from the company's large holdings of gilt-edged securities and from other sources the profit and loss account shows a credit balance of £20,229, and a 12 months dividend is again paid on the £200,000. Seven-and-a-half per cent. Preference shares of £100,000 less than a year ago, the company's holding of British Government securities still shows an impressive showing of £654,000, or 4 1/2 per cent. of the total assets. In addition there is a cash holding of £119,000, while £84,000 is due from other sources. The total of stock-in-trade and work in progress has risen from £22,000 to £147,500. At the last meeting the chairman indicated that the company was engaged upon the development of certain types of aero engines on which great hopes were held. No reference to the outcome of the experiments is made in the report, and for further information, shareholders must await the chairman's speech at the general meeting.

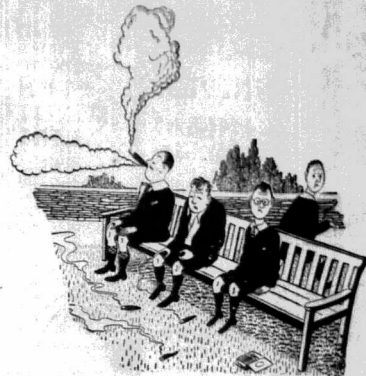

Full View into Commodity Speculation

GOVERNMENT SUPPORTS DEMAND BY THE OPPOSITION

Purity of Public Life

"WE CAN GET DOWN TO THE BOTTOM
OF THIS EPISODE"

—Mr. Runciman.

In reply to a suggestion by the Labour Party that a special enquiry should be held into the recent speculation in commodities, the British Government has given an undertaking that the Press Official Receiver will make the fullest possible investigation into the cause of failure of the two companies concerned.

Mr. Walter Runciman, President of Board of Trade emphasizing the purity of British public life defied any one to connect any member of Government or of the House of Commons with the speculation.

Protecting Reputation of the City

[THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCY.]

London, March 7. Mr. David Grenfell (Labour) opening the debate in the House of Commons today on commodity speculation, said that sensational statements published in the British and Foreign Press had created an utterly wrong impression that a British Standard affair had been discovered. But, he said, things were not as they seemed, and he was concerned with the damage inflicted on the City, business people and British credit.

On behalf of the Labour Party he urged the Government to institute a public enquiry into the circumstances. He said he was convinced the Official Receiver's investigation had not met the occasion.

The Hon. Member contended that the close connection between the money and stocks was not accidental. There had been a kind of conspiracy against the common interest to provide additional, mainly high profits for a few individuals.

Was the Government with its list of directors of John Stock Banks should be regarded as a committee of the House of Commons and heard the lives of the members who were supposed to have been connected with the money and stocks?

Government's Reply

Mr. Walter Runciman, President of the Board of Trade replied.

ing for the Government announced that he was concerned not with individuals, but with the fair name of the City of London.

He contended that an investigation should do good and the only question was the form it should take. Mr. Runciman emphasised that wide powers were possessed by the Official Receiver who personally would make the fullest possible investigation into the cause of failure of the two companies concerned and of everything pertaining to their business. "We can get down to the bottom of this episode," said Mr. Runciman.

He suggested that until the whole of this process was explained there was an end of a special investigation of an extraordinary character. Mr. Runciman added, "I shall say that the investigations go to the utmost limit. He said that on the Committee the 'dreadful word' 'Slavery' which could only mean corruption had been mentioned. There anyone say, asked Mr. Runciman that anyone connected with the Government or the House of Commons was involved? There had not been a whisper of suspicion in regard to any Member. It would be, however, for the sake of the world to know, that the purity of our public life had been maintained.

THE DEFENCE DEBATE

Government Amendment to Labour Cause

[THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCY.]

London, March 7.

In the House of Commons today the Defence Secretary, Sir John Simon said that after the visit to Berlin had received an intimation that a British ministerial visit to Russia and Poland would be welcomed.

The Government had gladly accepted the invitation and would be glad to accept the invitation to Moscow and Warsaw would be paid by Mr. Anthony Eden, the Lord Privy Seal.

Government supporters have handed in an amendment to the Labour vote of confidence on the defence policy (which is to be debated on Monday) declaring that the House is satisfied as to the obligations of the country as a member of the League of Nations and in desiring to receive limitation of armaments by international agreement recognizes that these objects cannot be attained by unilateral disarmament and approves the Government's policy as equally necessary for the defence of the people and the discharge of international obligations.

WHITE STAR LINE

"An Incredible State of Affairs"

[THROUGH REUTER'S AGENCY.]

London, March 7.

Following shareholders' demands for compulsory liquidation of the White Star Line Company today, the meeting was adjourned for a fortnight.

The Chairman said liquidation appeared to be inevitable. There was only half a million pounds of assets to show for over six million pounds invested in the company, which had borrowed three million pounds. He admitted that it was a very incredible state of affairs.

Shareholders opposed voluntary liquidation and only a threat of a court order for winding-up was accepted.

An amendment in a previous published meeting, this company has no connection with the recently formed Great White Star Company.

This amendment will be moved by Sir Austen Chamberlain and will be supported by the National Executive Council of the National Labour Movement.

SIR MALCOLM CAMPBELL'S NEW RECORD - 276.8 M.P.H.

Thrilling Experiences on Daytona Beach

[BY WIRELESS.]

Rugby, March 8.

A new land speed record of 276.8 miles an hour was established at Daytona by Sir Malcolm Campbell yesterday in his "Blue Bird" car.

The record was achieved in two runs. Proceeding southward, he reached 272.727 miles an hour and on the return run his speed was 281.000 miles per hour. The average of these super-speeds, the record Sir Malcolm established two years ago of 272.108 miles per hour.

At one time he struck a soft patch of sand when travelling at 260 miles an hour and the "Blue Bird" swerved and travelled for 30 feet with all six wheels in the air. The tyres were torn and scratched and Sir Malcolm Campbell rebuffed his rival which caused him considerable pain.

"300 Miles Aim"

The "Blue Bird," which has 2,000 horse-power, built by Royce, Schneider, trumps engine, was designed by Mr. H. H. Holton.

Sir Malcolm hoped to achieve 300 miles an hour, but the unsatisfactory condition of the ground prevented such a result. It is an open question whether he will make a further attempt.

The newspapers' war tributes to his daring and skill, and refer to the value to the British Motor Industry of the data his high speed achievements have produced.

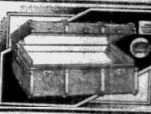

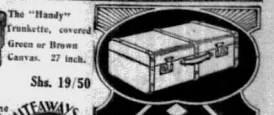

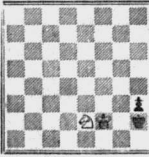

PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES FOR PROTECTION

Warships Despatched

SNOW AND FLOOD PREVENT GOVERNMENT ACTION AGAINST REBELS

Snow and floods are holding up the movement of Greek Government troops against the rebels, although aeroplanes have succeeded in bombing the town of Serres, where rebel forces are concentrated. A report that rebel warships bombarded Salonika is denied.

Precautions are being taken by foreign countries to protect their interests and nationals in Greece, and British, French and Italian warships are proceeding to Greek waters. Italy has also proclaimed martial law in the Dodacanese Islands, which are Italian territory, but are inhabited chiefly by Greeks, and where an anti-Italian revolt was reported.

Although Bulgaria denies any desire to interfere in affairs in other countries, particularly in view of her limited armaments, all posts along the Greek frontier are being strengthened.

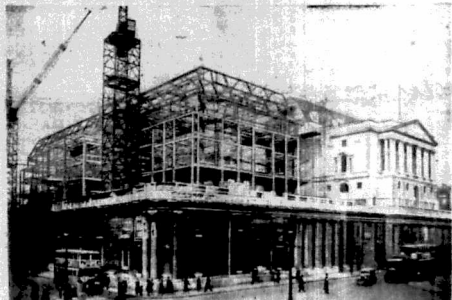

Give Encouragement to Young Women

Lady Sidney Farrar's Plea to E.A.W.L.

A LEAD WANTED

In the course of his address on 'The Responsibility of Women in East Africa,' at the annual meeting of the East Africa Women's League, Canon Wigglesley expressed the pleasant surprise that he had experienced in discovering the extent of the scope and the 'East Africa Women's League. He believed that its many and varied activities constituted a most valuable asset to the life of the Colony and, in fact, was a very real and to progress and advancement. He touched hands with the advancement of women and the healthy work which the movement had done at the outset and instructed how, even in such out-lying and remote parts of the Empire, Japan, China and India, for its work for enlightenment and true progress. Organized womanhood had become a vital force in the life of the nations and even among the natives of Africa their influence was becoming more and more pronounced. The speaker said that he was old-fashioned enough to believe in the history of the late Queen Victoria and that the word of Britain's greatness was in her home life and her women in Kenya, although men yet outnumbered women by three to one, four, to one, the balance was being redressed and the increase in a new era would have nothing but the most beneficial repercussions upon public opinion.

Sunday Observance

Kenya, he said, stood in need of a strong and healthy public opinion and to this end the women of the Colony could contribute to a great extent. The speaker touched upon the need for a 'day of rest' and added that Sunday was the day set aside from the others in the need for recreation and rest, but with out a proper observance it was quite impossible to observe it. Native relations, the care of children, particularly with regard to the insensibility of leaving them too much to the care of native servants; the vital need for unity and co-operation among all sections of the community were other matters dealt with by the speaker. He appealed for 'less work' and urged his hearers to 'pull their weight'; to encourage the younger element and the local town youth to participate in the life of the Colony; and to be charitable in their thoughts and words.

Lady Sidney Farrar

Replying to Canon Wigglesley's address, Lady Sidney Farrar said that it gave her the greatest pleasure to thank the revision speaker for his outspoken comments and criticisms, which could be taken as an appreciation of women's sense of fair play. Lady Sidney Farrar expressed her belief that the development of Kenya was analogous to that of every other Colony, the only possible difference being that progress was being made at 'almond' pace instead of along the more deliberate lines of a past generation. Women were taking their share in this development and though they might be making many of the mistakes that had been made before, and might be guilty of certain slackness in standards of behaviour, they were weighing down the scales on the side of good and doing their share as they were

A Lead Needed

"But," she said, "the older members of the community must give a lead; this is a form of social service to which members of the E.A.W.L. are pledged and which I believe they must study and carry out far more conscientiously than they are doing at present." There was a noticeable absence of a response to her plea.

meeting, but the idea that they were not interested in the League's work was an utterly false one. Almost every girl on leaving school, was imbued with the idea of social service, the platform—'Oh! she's a bit too young to care to attend the district meetings, she will come later'—was a deliberate incentive to young women to adopt a slack attitude of mind and was smacking of that interest and capacity for organization and leadership that had a steady hand in some measure, acquired. First, a systematic, ever-growing, combined with leadership, they found their feet, the untiring generation in Kenya would prove their worth as organizers, as they were doing at home. In the P.A.N.Y.S. said Lady Farrar, she saw ample evidence of a spirit of leadership, initiative and loyalty and a true idealism of comradeship and self-sacrifice. Given a lead, the younger generation will tackle many forms of social service; though they might not talk about it many of them are very well read and educated and would organize districts with domestic science qualifications would assist their less fortunate contemporaries in the outlying districts (who had not the former's opportunities) by lectures and practical demonstrations. They would be willing to visit the homes of girls who have hardly ever left their own households and the conditions pertaining there and would give them an insight into modern ideas of home and child management. Mothers' and organizations and ereb-on a small scale could be organized, and would be a great boon to women working in offices, etc. who could feel happy that their children were not being left to the care of natives. Social factors and Red Cross lectures could be organized.

Changed Conditions

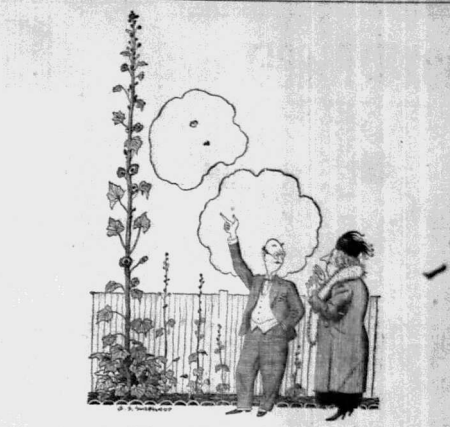
Conditions were changing and had changed of all recent years in the past few years, said Lady Farrar. The older women, in any case, had more time and lived under easier conditions, despite financial difficulties with which they were still faced. "To my mind," she added, "we have now in the Colony a considerable body of young women and girls who are representative of the very finest material that England has ever produced; physically finer than previous generations, more active, better educated; with more logical and better trained to think clearly and independently, more ambitious to fit themselves for the job in life with which they are faced and with a real loyalty and idealism behind their natural nerve that needs only a little encouragement and leadership to develop."

Belief in White Settlement

Lady Farrar added, "I believe in Kenya as a land for white settlement; I believe that women's influence, in spite of all the opposition that we and the English papers make in the latest in the Colony in the quietude of public opinion that is given to this side of the picture, has in fact a public opinion and that to this is due the marked improvement in tone that has taken place in the few years. I believe that the younger women are showing a sense of real responsibility and are facing the most tedious and dangerous course of the country—service, ill health, and the permitting of white children to be entrusted to the care of native servants, whether ayahs or boys. I believe that if we will genuinely encourage the younger women to take their part in the work of the League from the time that they leave school, that we are going to see it become more and more a living factor in the life of the Colony. That is provided the older and more experienced members will give a lead with example and patience with those who drop them. Our President has done it and has proved that it can be done in one year after another. I think that it is time we worked her up more and carried out our ideals as regards the work that should obtain in the League for 'the field'." (Applause.)

Associated Countrywomen

Mrs. Arthur Baines gave a brief address regarding the prospects and aims of the Associated Countrywomen of the World. Copies of the Association's journal were circulated among the members present and also copies from the Association have been sent to the International Council of Women, which was held in 1923, and received its present name and constitution at the Stockholm conference of 1923. Tri-annual conferences are held in various countries and the women of many nations meet and exchange views. The conference have proved that the cause of international friendship is no hallucination, but a practical and proved fact. Mrs. Baines appealed to the members to keep in touch with the Association and their fellow-women of the great world, that vision might be broadened and national-mindedness obliterated. Mrs. Delany, who has appointed a representative in Kenya of the English Speaking Union, summarized its objects, which are to further friendship between all English-speaking peoples, but especially between Britain and the United States of America. The headquarters of the Union are at Dartmouth House, Charles Street, London.

A FORCED LANDING IN WILD COUNTRY

Trek of Ninety Miles

MISHAP TO COMPASS CAUSES MACHINE TO FLY IN WRONG DIRECTION

It was further arranged that collecting boxes be placed on the counters of the principal shops in Nairobi. The Heads of all Government Departments were interviewed by Rotarians and supplied with the collecting forms.

In the near future every office in Nairobi will be called upon by a Rotarian with a view to impressing on the community the importance of the occasion.

They will particularly impress on the people the importance of the celebration of the King's Silver Jubilee such a success that thousands of children will remember it for the rest of their lives.

Children of all castes and creeds will be entertained. The King is the head of an Empire that embraces peoples of many nationalities.

Mr. England appeals to the people of Nairobi to give their support to the Appeal, however small may be the contribution they are able to make.

It is essential, he adds, to keep the hands of the Clock turning. Yesterday only registered Shs. 708.

Everest boxes which were opened on Saturday contained only Shs. 33.

This meagre contribution contained 125 one-cent pieces, 200 twenty-shillings in ten and five-cent coins and only eight shillings.

That is not a credit to Nairobi as the Capital of a young Colony which prides itself on its loyalty and is jealous of its reputation.
