THE CITY PARK

No Unfair Competition with Tradesmen.
The suggestion implied by the press—made by Council and inaugurating unfair competition with the other exhibitors—was the opinion expressed by Council in connection with a minute of the Park Committee. Superintendent is instructed to the effect that the Park for sale to the public. This suggestion, made by Council, has been adopted by the Committee for recommendation to the Council and is made a part of the Tuesday, Councilor Smithson and that he had not intended that there should be competition with trade in general. The City Park was a considerable expense and, as a keen amateur gardener, he realized the possibilities in the direction indicated, which was a source of reasonable income also.

The Deputy Mayor had suggested that it might meet the case if the meeting of the Park Committee's minute were amended to include surplus seedlings and through trade channels it was proposed by Councilor Tyson, and seconded by Councilor Tyson, that the surplus seedlings should be sold to the public. The Park Superintendent is instructed to the effect that the surplus seedlings in the City Park for sale to the general public through recognized trade channels. This was accepted. It was also noted that the Council of four years ago had not re-engaged after the completion of his present contract of service, but that he be appointed to act as Parks Superintendent during the absence on leave of Mr. R. Mountford.

road. As it was too late to telephone or telegraph the P.W.D. I tried a similar device to that on the wireless, which was packed up by the road foreman who was working somewhere near Nairobi, and at dawn next morning he had it going with all requisite tools and parts. By time of check deviations and repairs had been made, so the road was again open to traffic.

Kisumu Road
This road has been improved out of all recognition and is now used in the past, but a considerable amount of money will still have to be spent on it must be "hard surfaced." In January of this year our road survey "from Nairobi to Mombasa and Arusha" in one day which gave a speed of 12 miles per hour. In February we had torrential rains and for several days it was impassable. It was only used as a "dry weather" road. It would have been a great improvement if it had been "hard surfaced" and the road would have been used for a great deal of traffic.

Tanganyika Road
The Tanganyika roads have also improved greatly during the last few months and one is able to proceed to practically any part of the territory in the dry weather without any trouble or inconvenience. Here again the "dry weather" is of great importance as that the roads could be used during the "rainy" season. It is especially to emphasize the progress which has been made from Mombasa to Tanganyika and which is a great asset in bringing visitors from South Africa.

Uganda Road
Uganda roads are practically all now being cleared with railway all the available means of road construction. The wonderful Kulu—Bahirwa Road has been used by scores of visitors, and recently has opened up one of the most interesting parts of East Africa.

Kampala—Juba Road
It is well known that the Uganda Government will not construct more than 20 miles of road so as to connect up existing roads between Juba and Kampala, and this would give a straight run from Kampala to Juba. Government officials on the matter is however that it would not be worth the heavy expense, and it is therefore not to be done. It is however a very important road, and it is hoped that it will be done in the future.

Sigheh Road
Again this year on June 20th the Uganda Government Department sent us and others with eight lorries, each with four men, to carry our total in nearly 25,000 tons. We also supplied many thousands of supplies, which can be relied on the neighbours and which proved very successful. Only one lorry had a breakdown, and this was due to a breakdown in the engine, but this was not only not important, but absolutely necessary.

Mombasa Road



BRITISH CONVERSATIONS WITH RUSSIA

SMOOTHER WAY TO BETTER UNDERSTANDING

A Friendly Atmosphere

SIGNIFICANT REVELATIONS CONCERNING GERMANY'S POLICY

Mr. Anthony Eden received a very cordial welcome on his arrival at Moscow, and his first conversations with M. Litvinov were conducted in an extremely friendly spirit. ROAD AND WEATHER REPORT

Mr. Galton-Pearl writes as follows: The rains this week were not very satisfactory. There have been irregular showers in the Lake Victoria area, and a fair amount of rain in the Hauri, Thika and Fort Hall districts. In the Mweya, Jidonya, Arusha area is fairly dry. Colony, and other parts of Kenya.

The Meteorological Department tells me that I must not be too optimistic as to the outlook for the long rains arriving shortly, as this is a most unlikely thing unless some signs whatsoever of the south other winds setting in are blowing from Uganda, to the south, instead of from south to north.

In Kenya the wettest place this week was Malindi with 22 inches followed by Naranya with nearly 2 inches. Kericho with three quarters of an inch to an inch. All roads are as fair to good condition with the exception of the Kajjido, Lalgorien and Salla roads which are extremely rough. In Tanganyika last week, Tabora takes pride of place with 62 inches of rain followed by Mahenge 44 inches, Tanga 37 inches, Morogoro 29 inches, Mwa 18 inches and Moshi and Arusha 12 inches. The Great North Road to Johannesburg has dried up considerably and I am told a car came through from Mbera to Arusha in four days.

In Uganda there have been some very heavy showers during the week, but all roads are in good to fair condition. The following is the state of country roads and per telegraphic information just received: Nairobi-Voi (direct)—Impassable. Nairobi-Kajiado—Passable but rough. Forms of Relief

RENT SUBSIDIES, WRITING-OFF OF DEBITS AND REVALUATION OF LAND

The Commission appointed by the Government of the Union of South Africa to enquire into the question of the granting of relief to settlers on the land, who have completed its report.

The recommendations include a subsidy of 11 per cent. on the rent or interest paid by the settler on mortgages, a substantial writing-off of capital debts owing to Government, and the revaluation of land in circumstances where the land has depreciated in value owing to soil erosion or other causes.

The terms of reference of the Commission were very wide, and included all the forms of the position of those people who had been placed on the land under the original Land Settlement Act.

Rectifying Earlier Mistakes

A rent subsidy of 11 per cent. on the interest paid on mortgages, and extensive revaluation of land under certain circumstances are among the recommendations likely to be contained in the report. The Settlers' Relief Commission, a special political commission of the Government, has completed its report.

This report has been completed and will probably be laid on the table of the House of Assembly. The writing off of debits and the revaluation of land are among the recommendations.

The writer is a member of some 300,000 motorists for whom London's traffic holds no terror, but who profess to walk for fear, shopping and wondering how long she will be allowed to drive that.

AN ECONOMIC PROBLEM

To the Editor "E.A. Standard."—Sir,—A number of letters published in your paper recently have pointed to the fact that the present world-wide economic depression is due to the faulty functioning of the banking system. It has been pointed out that producers are vainly trying to sell

their products at a reasonable price, while neither buyers nor consumers are able to buy the goods produced because they do not possess the money. The only conclusion to be drawn is that mankind is able to produce a superabundance of the necessities and luxuries of life, but has somehow prevented himself from producing the money with which these goods and services can be exchanged.

Let us follow a typical banking transaction and see how this money shortage arises. A bank will be asked to supply his factory. His banker, in lending him the money, merely by a ledger entry increases the manufacturer's balance with him by £100,000. The manufacturer then orders his machinery and raw materials in cheque to the bank. The machinery is in operation it turns out, say, 1,000 pairs of shoes. The manufacturer then repays the £100,000 to the bank by a certain amount of interest. We have seen that at least 10 per cent. of a loan is paid in interest. As they are always afraid of oversteering the margin of safety and being called upon to pay out cash, they do not release, they automatically deposit a hundred or more per cent. of their interest as they repay. So when our manufacturer repays his £100,000 by another bank entry it was wiped out of existence. The banker, then, has created and destroyed £100,000 so that after the transaction there is the same amount of money in circulation as before. The machine-maker, however, has made machinery with which the manufacturer is turning out twice as many boots as before. There are more goods in circulation but far more money; in a same economic system any increase in the amount of goods produced should be met by a corresponding increase in the money issued so as to enable these goods to be bought. There are, of course, other causes of this money shortage besides the one outlined above.

In a sane economic order the Government would by means of a census of production such as is now held in the Iron Pits State gauge the delinquency of money and so be able to issue further money to wipe out the delinquency. The money thus issued could be used judiciously to do away with taxation and later to carry out schemes such as establishing a network of central banks or to enable these banks to be bought. There are, of course, other causes of this money shortage besides the one outlined above.

In a sane economic order the Government would by means of a census of production such as is now held in the Iron Pits State gauge the delinquency of money and so be able to issue further money to wipe out the delinquency. The money thus issued could be used judiciously to do away with taxation and later to carry out schemes such as establishing a network of central banks or to enable these banks to be bought.

Inflation could be avoided by either price regulation or by issuing those employed by Roosevelt and Hitler.

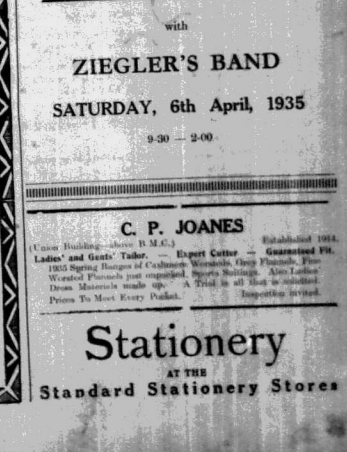

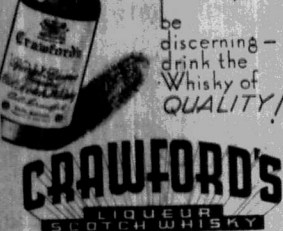

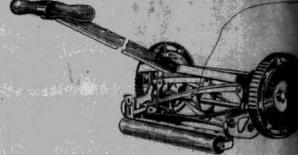

Moscow Conversations a Big Success

DEFINITE RESULTS ACHIEVED BY EXCHANGE OF VIEWS

Positive Progress

RUSSIA'S DESIRE FOR INCREASED FRIENDSHIP WITH BRITAIN

The visit of Mr. Anthony Eden to Moscow has been a big success and it is generally stated that the exchange of views with the leaders of the Soviet has already achieved definite results.

Questions put by the British representative which in Berlin received negative or indefinite answers were met in Moscow with a cordial affirmative.

The Lord Privy Seal was received by M. Stalin at the Kremlin and they had an hour's heart-to-heart talk which it is believed covered not only the issues mentioned in the Anglo-French Declaration but the improvement of Anglo-Russian relations.

A Talk with M. Stalin

[THROUGH RUSSIA'S AGENCY.]

Moscow, March 29.

A change in Mr. Anthony Eden's programme suggests to him a very important day of conversations. He is now meeting M. Stalin this morning after M. Litvinov, instead of the usual time when he will see M. Molotov.

In contrast to yesterday's meeting today there is brilliant sunshine. Mr. Eden led the Embassy at 8.30 a.m., G.M.T., to continue his talks with M. Litvinov at the Foreign Office. It is believed that Anglo-Soviet relations and possible trade questions will be the chief topics, after which he will have heart-to-heart talks with M. Stalin to see the latter's private sentiments, a plan finally furnished long ago with military officials. Mr. Eden is expected to be in the charge in the Polish Government, and there is speculation as to whether it will be more or less pro-Russian, especially in view of the fact that M. Litvinov is Mr. Eden's visit to Warsaw.

A later message says that Mr. Anthony Eden and M. Litvinov had conversations which lasted for an hour and a half. Both the political and economic aspects of Anglo-Soviet relations were discussed, and it is understood that both Ministers meet with satisfaction an improvement in their relations, and that they will have their further negotiations.

Heart to Heart Talk

DEVALUATION OF THE BELGA

By 30 per cent. Minimum

Government Granted Special Powers

[THROUGH RUSSIA'S AGENCY.] Brussels, March 29.

The Government has announced that the Belgian franc is to be devalued to a degree not below 30 per cent. A Ministerial declaration says that the Government recognizes that it is impossible to defend the franc at the level hitherto adopted, and the parity of the franc will therefore be modified. The obligation of the National Bank to meet sight and bearer notes in conditions laid down by the statutory regulations of 1920, will be suspended. The declaration adds: "We propose to ask all the means in our power to hasten the establishment of an international court, whereby the principal nations of the world will again be stabilised on gold."

The gold reserves of the National Bank will be evaluated provisionally at the level of the depreciating value by 25 per cent as compared with the present value.

'A Serious Blow'

Berlin, March 29. "A serious blow to Germany's export trade and the further degeneration of her already difficult position on the world market" said a leading member of the League of German Traders and Exporters, in a statement today, when he said that the devaluation of the Belgian franc would be a serious blow to the German export trade.

STABILISATION OF PRODUCTION

[THROUGH RUSSIA'S AGENCY.] New York, March 29. The International Copper Conference has agreed to a six-point programme for stabilising foreign production as follows:

Italo-Abyssinian

Tension Increased

ETHIOPIA TO BREAK OFF DIRECT NEGOTIATIONS

Serious Situation

The Italo-Abyssinian situation has become more critical during the week-end and is now generally regarded as very serious.

Although his announcement had no direct reference to Abyssinia, the Italian Under Secretary for War in the course of a speech indicated that war material was being manufactured as quickly as possible.

Preparations for War

[THROUGH RUSSIA'S AGENCY.] Rome, March 29. War material is being manufactured as quickly as possible. Hand grenades, bombs, cannon and machine guns are being turned out, and by the spring they will have been distributed to the troops. Artillery material is being manufactured more suitably for rapid movement. This information was furnished yesterday by General Bissolati, Under Secretary for War in a stirring speech to the Senate in regard to Italy's preparedness for war.

He said that nobody could tell when war might break out. It might be expected unexpectedly within a few days after a period of political calmness.

He expressed a reduction of military services was not possible at present and recognition was necessary.

He revealed that the vessels which in the past had been used for the invasion of Italy, would be allowed and granted as effectively as possible; and by next spring Italy would have about 600,000 men.

Meanwhile the general opinion is that the Abyssinian situation is very serious indeed.

Official circles here state that it is still hoped that direct negotiations will continue with Abyssinia and consider it necessary to discuss negotiations so far as possible.

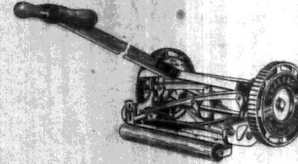

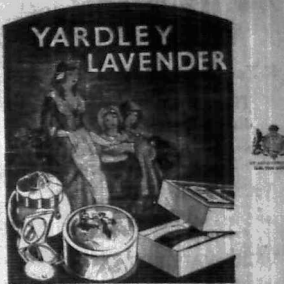

Mr. A. Bradley considered that the dams were not so bad as the impression was given by the reports thereon. The papers were, he considered, somewhat watered down to give the impression that the dams were not so serious as they were. It was necessary to regulate the drawing of water by means of a dam without any regularity to control the water.

An Advocate of Dams Mr. F. A. Wood said not agree with the condemnation of natural dams. 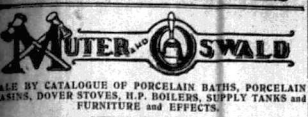

Anglo-Russian Accord on International Policy

TO BUILD UP A SYSTEM OF COLLECTIVE SECURITY

No Isolation

PARTICIPATION OF GERMANY WOULD BE WELCOMED

An official statement issued in Moscow at the conclusion of Mr. Anthony Eden's visit... complete accord between Britain and Russia on main issues of international policy.

The communiqué adds that the two governments are confirmed in their opinion that friendly co-operation in the organization of peace and security is of primary importance.

In reply to Mr. Eden's expressions of thanks for the Soviet's hospitality, M. Litznevsky said: "I wish you success and your success will be our success now."

Cordial Exchanges

[By Wires.] Moscow, March 31. Mr. Anthony Eden left for Warsaw on 10:45 p.m. today... Mrs. Eden exchanged views with Marshal Pilsudski and other Ministers—British Official Wireless Service.

On the course of the conversation, which was conducted throughout in an atmosphere of complete friendliness and frankness... and agreed that these had helped in the reconstruction of Europe.

Peace the Objective

Anglo-Russian co-operation for peace is the keynote of a communiqué issued today in the conclusion of Mr. Anthony Eden's visit.

The communiqué says that the conversations between Mr. Eden and M. Litznevsky dealt with the principal elements of the international situation including the proposals for the East-West Pact and other questions raised at the Anglo-French summit of February 23 and also the future development and improvement of Anglo-Soviet relations.

Mr. Eden, who returned from Warsaw shortly before midnight and will there have conversations with Marshal Pilsudski and other Ministers—British Official Wireless Service.

During the course of the conversation, which was conducted throughout in an atmosphere of complete friendliness and frankness... and agreed that these had helped in the reconstruction of Europe.

Collective Security

Mr. Eden, M. Stalin, M. Molotov and M. Litznevsky were all of the opinion that in the present international situation it was more than ever necessary to pursue the endeavor to bring about the building up of a system of collective security in Europe.

Mr. Stalin, M. Molotov and M. Litznevsky emphasized that the organization of security in Eastern Europe and the present part for mutual assistance did not mean the isolation or the encirclement of any state but the creation of equal conditions for participation in the participation of Germany and Poland in the Pact would be welcomed.

The representatives of the two governments were in full agreement that as a result of the full and frank exchange of views... as present a number of interests between the two governments on the main issues of international policy and this provides a basis for the development of their future collaboration in the course of peace.

It was an objective that both countries possessed that the integrity and prosperity of peace are necessary to build up a system of collective security in Europe... the governing of mutual relations by a spirit of collaboration and loyalty to their obligations as members of the League of Nations.

ADMIRAL NASMITH OF THE E11

Appointed to be Second Sea Lord

HOW HE WON THE V.C.

Exploits in Dardanelles Recalled

[By Wires.] London, March 31. Admiral Sir A. Dudley P. R. Pound, K.C., has been appointed Commander-in-Chief of the Mediterranean Fleet in succession to Admiral Sir William W. Fisher, the appointment to date from September 30, 1955.

Vice Admiral Sir Martin Eric Dunsar-Nasmith, V.C., has been appointed to be the second Chief of the Naval Personnel in succession to Admiral Sir Dudley Pound.

"Vice Admiral Sir Martin Eric Dunsar-Nasmith, V.C., C.D., Commander-in-Chief of the Royal Indian Navy, 1942 until 1954, is one of the most romantic heroes in the British Navy.

In May 1915, Last Commander Nasmith, as he then was, took the submarine E11, manned by 20 officers and men, through the Dardanelles. The submarine had just arrived from the surface after passing through the Narrows when two Turkish battleships were sighted.

Commander Nasmith immediately dived and made all preparations for launching torpedoes.

The Torpedoes hit the port side of the submarine, and before Nasmith could get within torpedo distance, shells were falling round the submarine. There was nothing for it but to dive.

The battleships, being faster than the submarine, escaped.

Approaching Constantinople, Nasmith sighted a Turkish gunboat at anchor. A torpedo sank the gunboat within five minutes, but a party sent from the gunboat had the submarine's periscope and did considerable damage.

The following day the E11 sighted a big steamer. Nasmith brought his ship to the surface and fired a torpedo which proved to be a Turkish transport.

The vessel was given time to load and ammunition ship. The Turkish vessel was then sighted in the place, a bomb missed the ammunition. The transport was blown up.

One morning the submarine penetrated the port of Constantinople. Two torpedoes were fired. One hit a large and old steamer and she held a big fire.

The "Pines" was hit and launched later. The second hit destroyed a considerable length of the pier.

The above exploits opened his fame and he was widely and considerably lionized.

Mine Draggled Along Nasmith then started on his return through the Narrows. During his voyage he had sunk one large gunboat, two transport ships, three other mines and one ammunition ship and had reserved one torpedo for the meeting.

Fortunately they kept on sight, and, as despairing of meeting them, the submarine turned back and used the last torpedo to sink a transport.

In all he destroyed 11 vessels. The submarine did not destroy 11 ships. But the submarine's adventures were not over. As she was making her way through the Narrows, Nasmith, as noted in the above paragraph, met a strong resistance in the ship's pressure. She also heard the faint strapping of a chain against the hull.

The submarine had fouled the cable which a floating mine was chained to an anchor on the sea bed. She was dragged by the mine with her.

German Armed Forces to Number 750,000

NATIONAL DEFENCE COUNCIL CREATED

Conscripts Called Up

OLDER MEN TO UNDERGO SHORT PERIODS OF TRAINING

Under the new conscription scheme in Germany, it is expected that the armed forces will number 750,000. The 1915 class has been called up, while older men will undergo short periods of training every year.

The Ministry of Finance is finding great difficulty in supplying the enormous sum required for military purposes, special laws are being promulgated to meet the existing circumstances.

Financial Difficulties

[By Wires.] Berlin, March 31. It is now thought that the German armed forces will number 750,000. The 1915 class will be called up on April 1, numbering 280,000 of whom 300,000 will be kept with the Cabinet.

The class 1901 to 1907 will be trained in short service periods not exceeding an eight weeks' course during the next few years. The 1911 class will be called up on October 1 and another class on April 1, 1956.

A National Defence Council will be created of which Marshal von Ludendorff and General von Seeckt will be the most influential members.

In view of the enormous sum of money required for the Army and Navy the Ministry of Finance is said to be working its brains to find means to balance the Budget. In order to enable Germany to secure monthly deliveries, it has been promulgated authorizing (inter alia) the Minister of Finance to assume certain privileges; as, for example, for the promotion of Germany's export trade; up to 200,000,000 marks will be made available. Up to 100,000,000 marks will be allowed for social-welfare purposes and up to 80,000,000 marks for agriculture.

GENERAL SMUTS' SPEECH

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir,—It is always edifying and refreshing to listen to or read General Smuts. His speech reported in your columns of yesterday set forth the ideals of a Commonwealth in a most admirably and as he suggests that the British Commonwealth of Nations represents those ideals, it would seem that the members nations that Commonwealth including South Africa desire to have nothing new.

But is the picture painted by this idealistic politician of the South true? A prominent worker in India writes to me some time ago that I should look upon General Smuts as a friend of India; the latter regarded as Mahatma Gandhi to accept the White Paper on the Indian Constitution and make the best of it. Sir, I am myself a dreamer and dream of a World Super-State and Super-Church. But there are any signs in the present trend of British policy or statement of these dreams ever materialising? General Smuts says "Our country was founded not on force or compulsion, but on freedom, equality and loyal friendship among its component members." I should very much like to know how this sentiment is reconciled with the treatment of Asians in the Union in which General Smuts has so much influence practically supreme. And how about the holding in South Africa of a referendum on the Union, constituting a great majority and living in the Union as one of the soil—not as immigrants? I shall not refer to the recent proposal for annexation of African Protectorates in the Union of South Africa as what has been proposed is not sufficient to indicate the play of the sentiments of freedom, equality and loyal friendship in the very home of the speaker.

Applying the test of General Smuts to Imperial policy in India I cannot but recall the expression of friendship for my country by the Premier and politicians of Canada and Australia some time ago. India was mentioned that she possessed loyal friends, amongst nations of the Commonwealth. And surely the maintenance of British troops in Egypt and in India is a demonstration of force which the associated members of the British Commonwealth unanimously appear to hold unwilling people in the belief of that Commonwealth? The Union of South Africa fought war against Britain, rebelled against British right in the midst of the War, had a latter Flag agitation, and had the problems of Defence and fiscal autonomy to grapple. The Ministers of the Union could be satisfied only when all these questions were solved to the satisfaction of the Union. And still the South African policy in case the next War was the defence of the Union's own territory are antagonistic to Imperialism as they are antagonistic to the

War Office in London. I should ask if the Constitution of the Union or any other Dominion were contained in the course of their evolution from Colonies to free Sovereign States associated voluntarily in a great Commonwealth, the safeguards now being found in British law are not all the Dominions in the course of their history chafed under whatever control was exercised "in their own interests" from London, threatening secession breaking out into rebellion and revolt and continuing to be both frequent and rebellious until the Powers in London were desperate and helpless and agreed to action which degenerated into the lachrymose of Westminster?

If General Smuts represents the mental attitude of the Boers between 1902 and 1909, he is entitled to be regarded as a general idealist and idealism he reads like the postprandial speech of a general old conqueror after their triumph but heavy drink. In the platitudes and shibboleths of success and idealism he reads the past and misrepresents the future. And the realisation of his error will come into him when the next historical occurs and he is called upon to act.

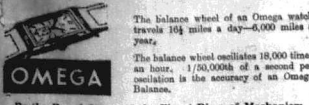

PROMOTION AND RELEGATION PROBLEMS
The Case of Bolton Wanderers

SPURS FATE PRACTICALLY SEALED

Annual, while by no means champions yet, are well on the way. They have a comparatively easy programme to get through; most of the clubs to be met being at the other end of the table. Sunderland have a rather rash before them if they are to become champions. At the same time, the annual programme can be said to be only won on paper. Teams fighting to get clear of the relegation zone are generally harder nuts to crack than those more happily situated in that regard. The Highway race has now said to meet Millwall, Birmingham and Leicester City before they can say the flag is theirs.

The fate of Spurs appears to be sealed. The point that remains is to decide who will go down with them. Leicester Birmingham and Millwall are all in a fair way to claim the White Hart Lane seat next season. The last two of these works has some Leicester City risk in an amusing fashion, although the team that has provided the greatest surprise is West Ham. A few weeks ago they were struggling in the danger zone; to-day they are in the top half of the table. It is strange how a team which has experienced considerable success in the Cup-cups, once they get out of the competition strike a lead in the league. This is the case with Bolton Wanderers. They have not any easy passage with them to conclude the season. Burnley are right on top with West Ham runners-up, but the "Hammers" have played two more games than the Wanderers whom they lead by a couple of points. Oldham Athletic and Notts County are also in the danger zone.

Charlton Athletic and Doncaster Rovers look certainly as going down to the bottom. It is worth pointing to that of Barnsley last year, the only team to avoid relegation last year. Chesterfield led the field for practically the whole of the season, and then in the last few weeks frittered away their chances with their habit of conceding goals before a single point had been scored. The unfortunate this year is Millwall, who have been leading for the greater part of the season, but recently they have been very inconsistent, and their championship slipper away from them. Scythian league top position, Ayton United have jumped from the bottom one year ago to the top. Falkirk, Dundermine Athletic have also improved their position. The following are the tables up to date.

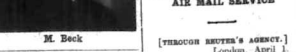

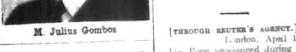

CLUBS AND THE LIQUOR LAW

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir—Your correspondent "dent" accuses clubs of a good deal of abuse in the past. In view of the fact that the privileges granted to them in the past, which I believe typical, and a few verbal alterations to its rules have been found necessary, partly to enable it to take full advantage of the privileges allowed in the present Act, and partly to curtail further the already strictly limited stipulations it can extend to neighbours so hard hit by the present depression as not to be able to afford a club subscription.

But the Licensing Act further appears to forbid lending the club buildings for Public Association meetings, any form of Public meeting or frolic housing the Public. Of course "Roadside" may consider that such use of the club for public purposes (even though no possible alternative exists within 20 miles), is an abuse of their past privileges, but I can not think he will find much support for this view.

I would suggest that it might have been better had "Roadside" referred to the Licensing Act before rushing into print on the subject, as he would have found that a club is forbidden to give any entertainment or refreshment to other than its members or their guests; and that the Anglican feast he uses some half column of your valuable space in advocating would be just as much against the law as the public cocktail party which I wish to refer to.

With reference to your editorial comment I would suggest Sir, that the wholesale and unmodified application of regulations formerly pertaining to a very few proprietary clubs only to numerous clubs may not be entirely desirable, but I would not think the very real prohibitions would "recommendation" which the clubs believe in its legal

status include any kind of help from a night's lodging to the home of a library to which a member may be taken, even if he does not, absolutely refuse to attend. It is more strictly defined and limited in accordance with many desirable and social activities of a public nature of small clubs in countries abroad and that refreshment should be limited to a simple treatment and that it should be made possible for children, entertainments and children's parties from the general club, and not public entertainments as they are.

I could not say that these recommendations are entirely in the public interest and not in that of the clubs.

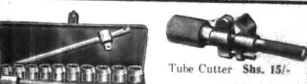
