SIGNIFICANT REPORT BY COMMITTEE OF  
ENQUIRY

From 1924 to 1934, the total receipts by the British beet sugar industry amounted to £27,000,000, of which over £40,000,000 was provided by State assistance. This statement is contained in the report by the committee appointed to enquire into the industry.

The report states that there is no reasonable prospect of the industry ever becoming self-supporting, and the committee cannot recommend the continuance of financial assistance.

It is admitted that the industry has had a beneficial effect on agricultural employment and transport tonnage, but the danger of continued artificial maintenance is emphasised.

## ROAD ACCIDENTS IN BRITAIN

Rain Conditions May

The British East African Meteorological Service issued the following note for weather yesterday:

Heavy rain is reported from all stations round the Lake especially the main Tana current in the past fortnight's weather note, while the rain in other parts of East Africa north of the Tanganyika Railway Line has been more or less general. In the Kenya Highlands, Eldoret received 0.86 inches, Nairobi 0.97 inches, and Nairobi 0.25 inches. In Uganda, Entebbe 1.38 inches, Mubende 1.30 inches and Masaka 1.28 inches.

Unfortunately, for the immediate future, a small cyclonic disturbance has developed near Mayotte in the Mozambique channel and this may deflect temporarily the main Tana current in the past fortnight's weather note, while the rain in other parts of East Africa north of the Tanganyika Railway Line has been more or less general.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT] London, April 11.—Particulars are advertised to-day of Tanganyika Minerals with an authorized and issued capital of £75,000 in 300,000 fully paid shares. The company has acquired 30 claims in the Lupa-Goldfields area, of which five are Menzies and Kinogua. Options also held cover Nyman, six square miles at Mwanza, and further 11 square miles at Mrugeti. If the latter is purchased the price will be £200,000 in cash or £100,000 in shares.

Tanganyika Minerals has a working capital of £48,000 which the directors regard as sufficient for the present.

#### The Price

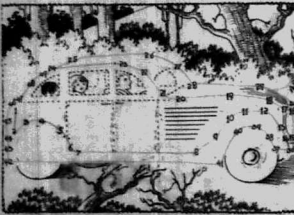

# AN ENTIRELY NEW MORRIS

## 8 H.P. Model That Supercedes The Minor

### DISTINCTIVE PERFORMANCE

### INCREASED ENGINE CAPACITY ADDS TO ITS CAPABILITIES

When the new Morris Eight was first made its appearance at Olympia attracted a very considerable degree of attention, and popularity was reflected for it, in the same measure as the Minor, but the Eight is entirely new, and bears little resemblance to its forerunner. The engine is more powerful, although retaining as a side-valve unit, while it is smoother and altogether better than any other of its class. The interior space is especially good, and indeed remarkable for a car of these chassis dimensions. The engine capacity has been increased so that the dimensions are 57 by 60 in., which gives a capacity of 918 c.c. The capacity of the Minor was 457 c.c. It has a three-bearing crankshaft compared with the ten-bearing crankshaft of the Minor, which has a universal effect giving increased smoothness of running.

The side-valve engine, together with the gearbox and clutch housing is mounted on the frame at four points, one on each corner in order to give a degree of flexibility. The usual coil and distributor function is employed, mixture is supplied by an 8 1/2 carburettor, and the fuel feed from a tank at the rear is regulated by the latest type of S.T. electrically operated pump. The whole engine is held out in design and construction to be as simple as it is feasible with a view to maintaining economy in running.

**Little Resemblance to Minor**  
As has been said, the Eight bears little resemblance to the Minor, both outwardly and inwardly, changes have been effected, the improvement is both distinct and noticeable in almost every possible way, whilst both the wheelbase and track dimensions have been increased. A three-speed gearbox is used and fitted with a synchromesh easy change mechanism for top and second.

The lines of the new model are very pleasing, and the increase in track width has afforded more seating space. There is plenty of leg room. Bucket seats are provided in front and both are easily adjustable. The gear lever comes easily to hand. On the right hand side to the steering column the controls are grouped. These consist of the electric horn, traffic signals, etc., thus leaving the wheel entirely free.

Locked hydraulic brakes are fitted, and these are very powerful in action. The instrument board is situated in the centre, the dial being neatly grouped together. There is a speedometer, petrol gauge, oil-pressure gauge, mixture control, and starting switch by hand. On each side is a separate cylinder lock. Very wide doors are fitted giving easy entry to both front and rear compartments.

#### Performance

As for the car's performance it can be immediately noticed that the engine is livelier, though remarkably smooth and quiet. The engine had now been timed, speed at 1000 revs had increased more than the mere dozen miles, so that one could sense a marked tightness. Still, the car behaved wonderfully well, showing that it is possessed of plenty of power on hills, while with the throttle just open

it cruises along at a nice 35 m.p.h. The maximum speed is stated to be in the region of 60 m.p.h., and while this speed was never attempted, one could well understand the mental picture within a couple of miles of that figure. The engine has a very pleasing note, and when speeded up, develops a truly delightful roar, evidence of the reserve of power which can be called upon in acceleration. It remarkably good. It runs smoothly at any speed, and is a delight to handle. On corners it is steady; the excellent springing is to be noted, the car riding them in a manner which can well hardly be expected from a car of its size.

#### Easy Gear Changing

The gear changing is easy, and there is no need to touch the clutch, a simple depression of the clutch and a movement of the lever being all that is required. The gears are very quiet. The handbrake, when off, lies almost flush with the floor of the car, and is retained well out of the way. Altogether a very pleasant car, economical to run, and easy to handle.

The fittings are remarkably complete. The upholstery is of good quality, and the seating the same of comfort for such a small car. The wider track provides more room for the passengers, and driver and passenger do not need to rub elbows.

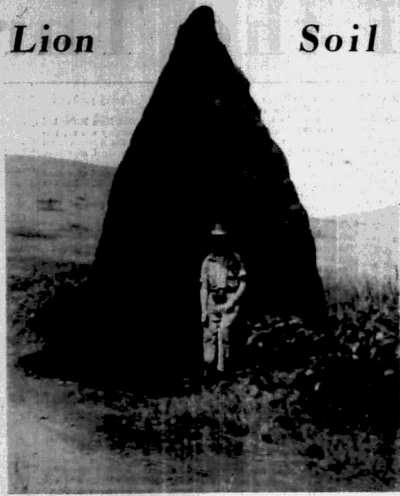

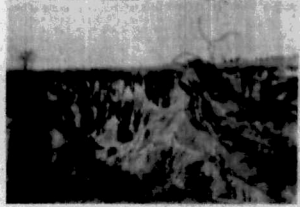

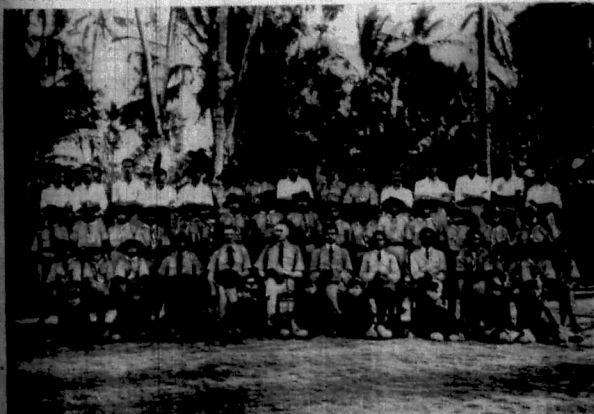

The Kenya Land Bank Report for 1934 discloses the following transactions during the year—

**Applications Granted:**

The completed applications were cut down by the Board by £18,925.

Owing to exhaustion of funds no applications were granted after October.

The Report pays a tribute to the manner in which farmers are meeting their obligations. Of the principal due during the year 86 per cent. was paid and of the interest 92 per cent.

On the representations of the Board, the Secretary of State has agreed to a reduction of the interest on loans made under the Agricultural Advances Schemes from 8 per cent. to 6½ per cent., with effect from January 1, 1935.

### Agricultural Advances Interest Reduced

The 1934 report of the Land and Agricultural Bank of Kenya has just been issued.

During the year a change took place in the Chairmanship of the Board. Mr. G. B. Stanford, O.B.E., being replaced by Mr. H. O. Walsh, C.B.E., on his appointment as Treasurer. This change occurred in January, 1934. The Hon. Mr. Stanley, O.B.E., was also acting as substitute for Mr. W. C. Hunter, at several early meetings of the Board.

Two Ordinances amending the original Land Bank Act were passed during the year. One of these empowered the Board to make Silver Term Advances up to a maximum of £500 per acre over three years and also provided for advances to encourage scientific and for the working of projects by agriculturists. In furtherance of the Board's objects, the Board has by means of a simple instrument. The second amending Ordinance provided that the Bank might be appointed and act as agents for Government.

**The Farmers' Struggle**  
The importance of agricultural production was increasingly realized and early in 1934 a scheme of systematic visitation by the Bank's staff was inaugurated. Nine inspectors were appointed, each with a district, and 222 requests were made at a cost of £711. The information obtained has been of the greatest assistance to the Board. With nearly 2000 requests made, the Bank has been able to deal with until further funds were available.

### Agricultural Loans in the Seychelles

The Government of the Seychelles has decided to establish a Land and Agricultural Bank, and the steps which have been taken with regard to the organisation of such bank were outlined by the Governor, during the course of a statement to a meeting of the Agricultural Board, of that Colony.

The Governor also reviewed the present position of loans made by Government for agricultural purposes, which, he stated, had very considerably improved.

He announced that the draft Land Bank Ordinance would be handed over to the Director of Agriculture, so that all persons interested could examine its terms.

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.] Seychelles (by mail). An interesting but brief statement on agricultural finance, made recently by His Excellency the Governor, Mr. Lechen, at a meeting of the Agricultural Board of Seychelles.

Dealing with Government loans and the steps now being taken in regard to the establishment of a Land and Agricultural Bank, His Excellency said that the results of an intensive examination showed that the Government had outstanding in capital and Rs. 13,000 in interest.

At the date of his speech however the beginning of March, Rs. 80,000 capital had been recovered and the interest had been relieved to Rs. 4,000.

His Excellency said that at the September meeting of the Legislative Council he had forwarded a draft ordinance by which each

loan would be considered on its individual merits, easier terms being granted in deserving cases, but in a certain number of cases in which the position was definitely unsatisfactory, action by Government to press for satisfaction would be necessary and fair in the general interests.

### Improved Position

Mr. Lechen said he was glad to report that in nearly every one of these "bad cases" a composition had been arrived at so that the debtors would remain on their properties on certain conditions which the Government's debt had been secured. This had not been done without difficulty, but he believed the results were salutary to all concerned. In two cases only was he now under a debt.

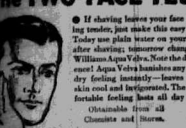

other hand in 20 cases of the total of 41 a composition had been arranged or nearly arranged, by which long terms for payment had been granted with interest at only 5 per cent.

It was probable that many loans would remain which it would not be possible to compound, but it was already clear that where security remained good and interest was paid, regularly reasonable terms for payment could be allowed and anxiety on this score need not be felt. It should only be in the case of a most exceptional character that Government would require to exercise its rights under the law.

One thing he did wish to emphasize—these things demanded no little time and he anticipated it would be many months before he could report that arrangements were complete. Legislation would also be necessary at the next meeting of Council.

**Classified Applications**

In regard to the Land Bank Mr. Letchem said that applications amounting to nearly Rs. 200,000 had been received. These had been classified. **GERMANY'S DEMAND FOR COLONIES**

**Anxiety Expressed on the Continent**

London, April 11.

The grave anxiety on the Continent regarding German policy has been fully appreciated in London. There appears, however, to be the opinion that before Britain considers further commitments the aims of the German policy should be further explored. Should such a situation prove adverse, and Germany is not prepared to contribute towards European security, British approval would be conferred on other Powers effects for mutual security.

In regard to Herr Hitler's views that Germany is in an inferior position so long as she is without colonies, there is no tendency in London to regard Germany as unduly possessive colonies, but there is no disposition to handily territory for political reasons.

**Position Explained**

Berlin, April 12.

Referring to Sir John Simon's statement in the House of Commons on April 9 that Herr Hitler had said that Germany would not return to the League while in a position of inferiority and that she was in such a position as long as she was without colonies, the "Revue Zeitung" which is probably inspired by the Wilhelmstrasse, says that Herr Hitler's statement was taken too literally. Germany, the Journal says, chiefly demands the withdrawal of the assertion that she is unfit to possess colonies, and the recognition of her right and fitness to exercise a mandate.

The general impression in diplomatic circles is that Herr Hitler did not intend to stipulate the return of her late colonies as a condition of her return to the League.

**The Collective System [BY WIRELESS]**

Rugby, April 12.

The Three Power Conference was resumed this morning on the

Isola Bella and a further session will be held this afternoon. It is anticipated that Signor Mussolini, who presides over the conference, will today give an extension of the Italian views on the European situation.

The first day's proceedings of the conference are believed to have been propitious and useful. They included a clear statement from Mr. Macdonald giving the main outline of British policy.

**Demonstration of Solidarity**

It is authoritatively stated that the British Prime Minister expressed the British desire at the Conference is to demonstrate the solidarity of purpose between these Governments represented at Stresa and to remove all doubts that any country can assume in furtherance of its own interests that Britain, France and Italy can be divided in any policy which can strengthen and secure European peace. One of the main objects of the tour undertaken by the British Ministers was not to display complacency with regard to Germany's recent policy, but to discover whether a reasonable hope existed of persuading her to resume legal co-operation with the League members in constructing and strengthening the organization through which the association should be conducted, and effect given to international agreements with this object.

The principle of the collective system is in the forefront of British policy and she is willing to make her contribution to that principle in every way that is possible and practicable.

It will continue to strive for an international armistice agreement and is prepared to accept arrangements supervision by the League of Nations.

While Britain is extremely anxious that Germany should return to the League, this object should not be attached on conditions that would do more harm than good by diminishing European confidence which is the only basis on which peace can be built up in Europe.

It is understood the French and Italian delegations were gratified by the Prime Minister's statement which showed the three Powers were agreed on the broad principles—British Official Wireless Service.

Small pneumatic rubber rollers are run over the surface continually for months and whenever stones get scattered leaving the smooth road bed exposed, the rollers come along and re-press the stones. The idea of this invention is probably that pneumatic rubber rollers will injure the road material less than the old-fashioned heavy iron ones.

One might think the method is very expensive, but the truth is, so, at least from the point of view of the road builder, for every use of the road supplies a set (or sets) of rubber rollers, so that the expense is distributed over the public in an equitable manner. If this method could be adopted in other progressive countries, it would be a great help to the Rubber industry. Yours etc.

It has long been realized that the Colonial Office wished to form an Empire unit composed of Uganda, Tanganyika and Kenya, with of course be a Black Empire.

Importants again wished to add Nyasaland and the two Rhodesias and form a White Empire.

Both these ideas are held up by the situation as regards Tanganyika. It is well known that two big mistakes were made at the Peace Conference in 1919-1919. (1) An army of occupation should have been sent to Berlin at least a year and (2) some derelict duty should have been left to Germany for her overflow as regards men and energy.

Before 1914, Tanganyika possessed no strategic value, but the coming of the long distance telegraphic has changed all that. It is therefore formed as base in Tanganyika similar to Singapore.


