Germany Protests to Great Britain

AGAINST ATTITUDE AT STRESA AND GENEVA

"Exceedingly Strong Terms"

LEAGUE RESOLUTION POSITIVELY REPUDED

Germany has protested in exceedingly strong terms to Great Britain in regard to the latter's attitude at the Stresa Conference...

Germany claims that other Powers have no right to appoint themselves judges over Germany, and the Geneva resolution is an attempt at renewed discrimination against Germany.

Notes to Other Powers

It is learned that Germany has made a verbal protest against Britain's attitude at Geneva and Stresa.

The British Ambassador was summoned to the Foreign Office representing Baron von Strass, protesting in exceedingly strong terms against Britain's attitude.

Both the British and the Italian Ambassadors were present at the Foreign Office and it is believed they were both asked whether their countries, as guarantors of the Locarno Treaty, considered themselves responsible for exercising their obligations in the case of aggression by France.

Germany's attitude London, April 20. Germany's note of protest against the Geneva resolution was delivered today to the British Government. Similar notes were also delivered to the French Government.



From the same source we have the story of Lawley's first meeting with Rhodes, which began with a quarrel and resulted in a firm friendship. The two friends visited the railway Rhodes invariably accepted Lawley's hospitality, which was on several occasions reciprocated at Great Schuur.

After the completion of the line from Beira to Salisbury, Lawley was for many years engaged in the African railway building. He built the line from the Victoria Falls to Rhodesia and that from the Zambesi to Port Herald, on Lake Nyasa. The line from Beira to the east coast, through the very difficult country, was finished in 1922. In conjunction with the late W. E. Meyer, Lawley also built the line from the Beira (Germania) to Pretoria. It was during a holiday from railway-building that he became involved in the reform movement in Johannesburg, and was arrested on the collapse of the famous Raid. He was eventually released on payment of a fine of £2,000 and an undertaking not to concern himself further in politics.

For many years until comparatively recently Lawley had been at Beira, which he had seen grow from a tiny settlement, lodged on a sandspit, into a large, prosperous and healthy town. His position there was unique. The railway had made Beira, and Lawley had made the railway; he also built and owned the principal hotel. The whole town of Beira is the gift of a measure of compensation, which was granted to him by the Government of London. Lawley was a genial sort of man, loving life and always trying to bring comfort into the lives of others. There was hardly a limit to his generosity. Less than a year ago, for example, he spent £400 in erecting a school for the children of the stream of his giving never stopped. He had a very large number of children, and his eldest child he and belonged to eight tribes, African and English. He died in 1902 Mrs. Kay Metcalf. She died some years ago, and he was succeeded by a widow sister.

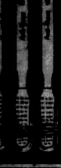

After Outlook in Tanganyika

MADE REPORT TELLS STORY OF PARTIAL RECOVERY

Increased Imports and Exports

Following Kenya and Uganda Markets in Mandated Territory

Trade Report of Tanganyika for 1934 just issued is interpreted by the Comptroller of Customs as indicating a steady return to normal conditions.

Total volume of trade exceeding bullion and specie amounted to £2,199,774 compared with £2,672,585. It is still, however, a long way from a half pounds below the peak year of 1930.

There was an increase in imports of nearly £400,000 and in exports of £102,000.

United Kingdom's share of Tanganyika produce was maintained only by the fact that most of the gold goes to Britain. Japan, on the other hand, largely increased the share of the imports into the territory.

Available feature of the report is the considerable increase in Kenya and Uganda proportion of Tanganyika exports. The latter two territories and to a steadily increasing share of Kenya and Uganda goods in the mandated Territory, helped last year by drought conditions.

A Thousand Millions Being Printed

CHANGED IN DESIGN

By WIRELESS. NAIROBI, April 24. Commemorative silver Jubilee postage stamps of 1d, 1½d, and 2½d, denominated will be available to the public for two months from May 7, during which time the sale of stamps of the corresponding values in the ordinary designs will be suspended.

One thousand million stamps of the special issue will be required and they are now being printed in photolithography.

Besides a difference in the colour of each denomination, there are also subtle changes in the design, but the fundamental character of all is the same.

Twice Normal Size

The commemorative stamps are twice the size of those now current. A medallion head of the King occupies the centre of the stamp and is flanked by shielded panels in which emblems, appropriate to the occasion, are arranged.

The stamps are arranged in a royal crown, denoting sovereignty, laurel leaves for honour and glory, and an olive branch for peace and goodwill. In some denominations an oak leaf and acorn are introduced.

Many "little stragglers" made their appearance—barn and wood pigeons, the latter being, according to the Zoological Society's report for 1933, 1 Indian fruit bat, 2 Sumatran's night hio, 2 fat rat, 6 dingoes, 1 grey hyacinth, 2 blue's birds, 1 reindeer, 3 polecats, 3 That 1 flow's snow goose, 2 masked boobies.

As Whipsnade
 Whipsnade, too, had its moments. In January the emus laid 12 eggs, the cocking hatchlings and rearing one chick. A second egg hatched out but the chick was crushed by the parent in the nest.
 The three laid 14 eggs, and three chicks were raised. A hen ostrich had two eggs, which were hatched out by the catering department. One egg weighed 3lb. 10oz., equalled to 25 hen's eggs.
 A bellbird's egg was seen, but bred only 24 hours. The brooding pair of Sarus cranes raised three chicks. A pair of young giraffes was reared, but the male, unfortunately died within 48 hours.
 The "most interesting births" included two zebras, three tiger cubs, one yak calf, one ram, 18 Irish turkeys, and one peacock.
 There were 1,030,011 visitors to the London Gardens in 1933, an increase on the two previous years. Whipsnade had 510,411 visitors, compared with 438,429 in 1932.
 The total value of the Zoo's livestock—animals, birds and reptiles—was £42,978 15s. The income of the Zoo for 1933 was £137,987, including £75,700 from Whipsnade. This was an increase of £8,357 in 1933. The Whipsnade increase was 65,447.

 [STANDARD CORRESPONDENT] London, April 17. (By Air Mail.)
 Monte Carlo Casino will declare no dividend at its annual general meeting.

Net profits for the financial year just ended are about £13,000—the smallest ever recorded for the world's gambling centre. Last year they were more than £400,000 and that was a record low figure.
 Casino shares have fallen to about £12 1/2. Four years ago they were worth £80; during the Riviera boom period they reached £216. The dividend there was 165 per cent.
 "The casino war," which has been going on for two years, is the direct cause of Monte Carlo's plight. Roulette, which used to be the principal game, is now played in all the French casinos.



ANTHRAX IN GOAT HAIR
Provisions of Order in Council
 [STANDARD CORRESPONDENT] London, April 17. (By Air Mail.)
 The Home Secretary draws attention to the fact that the Order in Council made recently under the Anthrax Prevention Act will come into force on April 22 as regards goods imported on or after that date.

The Order in Council applies to all goat hair with exceptions for certain specified classes of hair and to goods mixed therewith. Packages containing such hair goods arriving at Liverpool will be delivered to the Government Wool Deteriorating Station at Liverpool for disinfection there, under the arrangements already in operation in the case of New Indian goat hair. In the case of packages imported at other ports the importer or re-exporter, or some accessible after the packages have passed the Customs, will be liable to deliver them to the Disinfecting Station at Liverpool for disinfection. Provision is made under which packages, which before importation have been sold in Great Britain to a destination outside the United Kingdom, may

STABILISATION NEAR?

£500,000 COMPANY TO DEVELOP WELSH MINE

[STANDARD.]

London, April 19.

WITH the account safely out of the way and the week-end in prospect, it was hardly to be expected that the London market would experience any expansion of activity on Friday. As a matter of fact, business in all departments was on a very limited scale, and even the recent advances received scant attention.

Kenya Consols, falling to 9½, but otherwise, no material movements occurred in the East African shares.

"Trust," in this issue of the 19th, says that East African gold has been mostly held in the form of bank accounts, but with all these other factors, will probably, and need not have fresh buying to bid price against it. Meanwhile, the market is in a firm exception on the news that the company had received its first consignment of gold by air mail.

Mining in Wales

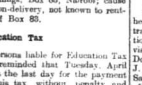

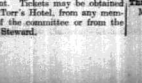

A CHESS JUBILEE.
We have received the following extract from the "Cape Times" of the 20th March, just fifty years from the foundation of the Capetown Chess Club. The many friends of the late Mr. J. H. Clark among our readers will note the interesting reference to him. Mr. Clark was at one time President of the City of London Chess Club, he was the founder and first President of the Capetown Chess Club, which he very ably conducted this column for many years.
"In the 18th of March, 1885 a little gathering of chess enthusiasts met at the St. George's Hotel, when the Cape Town Chess Club was only established. The club was taken by the late Mr. J. H. Clark, at the moment of meeting the first officers were elected, the Bishop of Cape Town, Dr. W. West Jones, being appointed president, and Mr. L. Marquand, afterwards Sir George, president. The club's early days were some too prosperous, but in 1888 the arrival of two strong players from overseas, E. Roberts and J. H. Clark, quickly brought

about a revival of interest. Mr. Clark in 1892 began the first chess column to be published in Cape Town, which appeared in the Cape Times. The club organized the first South African championship tournament, held in 1895, and was responsible for 6 of the 10 remaining national championships held to date. Other historic events in the annals of the club were the visit of the English professional player, F. J. Law, in 1904, and of the Anglo-Siamese master, Boris Kostich, in 1924.
The leading players in the club to-day are Professor W. S. Mackie (champion), W. Croker, A. Feinberg, H. Garland, M. Rieck, E. Bergendoff, D. Yeller, and H. Meinhart. A special tournament is now in progress for the purpose of selecting two representatives for the 12th South African championship contest at Johannesburg during Easter.

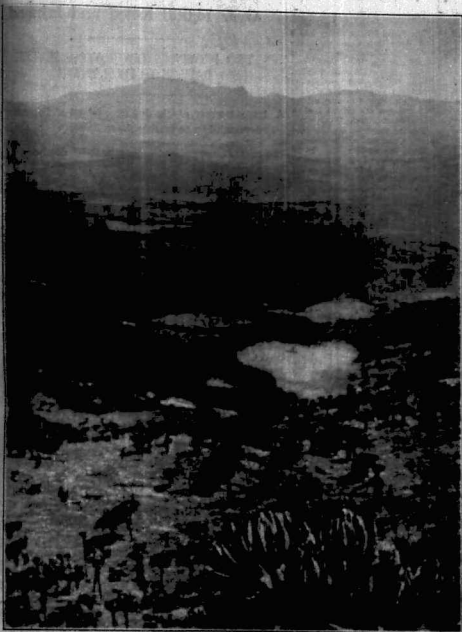

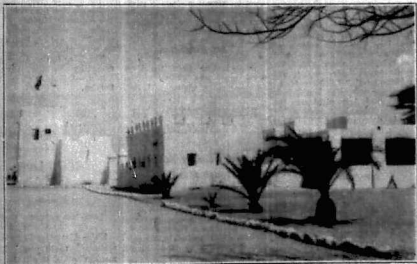

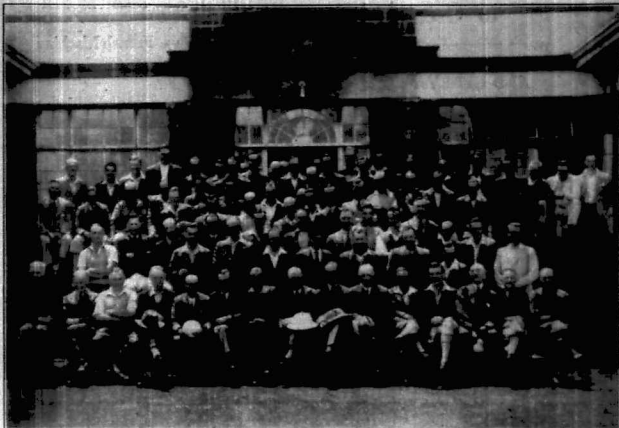

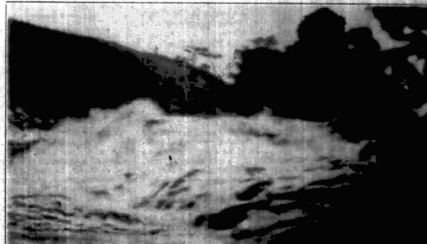

Germany Protests to Great Britain

AGAINST ATTITUDE AT STRESA AND GENOVA

"Exceedingly Strong Terms"

LEAGUE RESOLUTION POSITIVELY REPUDIATED

Germany has protested in exceedingly strong terms to Great Britain in regard to the latter's attitude at the Stresa Conference, and at the meeting of the League Council at Geneva. Notes in similar terms have been presented to other Governments concerned.

Germany claims that other Powers have no right to appoint themselves judges over Germany, and the Geneva resolution is an attempt to restrict Germany's freedom of action in Germany. The resolution passed at Geneva is repudiated.

Britain and Italy have also taken action, as guarantors of the Locarno Treaty, to consider themselves responsible for exercising their obligations in the case of aggression by France.

Notes to Other Powers

(By wireless.) Berlin, April 18.

It is learned that Germany has made a "verbal protest" against Britain's attitude at Stresa.

The British Ambassador was assured by the Foreign Office that Herr von Bunsow, representing France, presented in substance strong terms against Britain's attitude.

The Italian Ambassadors were present at the Foreign Office and it is stated that they were both asked whether their countries, as guarantors of the Locarno Treaty, considered themselves responsible for exercising their respective responsibilities in the case of aggression by France as well as Germany.

It is understood that in both cases a positive assurance was given.

Germany's Attitude
