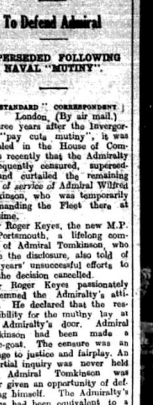

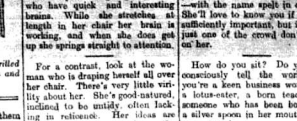
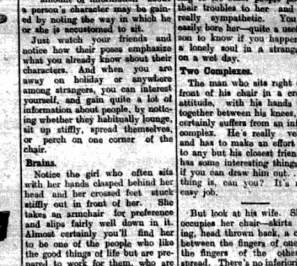

PREMIUM AWARDS.

There has recently been considerable correspondence in the agricultural press of several countries on the value of Shows to Dairy Breeders.

The following article by Dr. Andrew Seuchetti which appeared in a recent issue of "The Dairyman" gives particulars of the remarkable and progressive system of judging cattle which has been adopted in Switzerland.

There is a great deal in the Swiss system which merits careful consideration. In any case the accepted practice of a country where the development of intensive dairy farming has reached a high standard is of considerable interest.

The cattle show in Switzerland started about the first half of the last century. The purpose for which animals are shown are the same all over Switzerland but the methods and details of showing differ in various parts of the country.

"This Association favours a scheme of restriction of sisal exports."

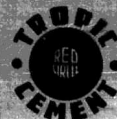

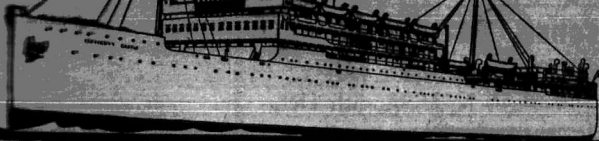

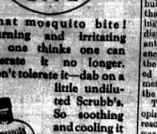

## DELETERIOUS INFLUENCE OF WESTERN CIVILISATION

### Anthropological Congress

#### PRINCIPLE OF SPECIAL COURSE FOR MISSIONARIES APPROVED

The influence of western civilisation on African marriage laws and customs formed the subject of an interesting and informal discussion at one of the sessions of the Anthropological (Africa) Section at the recent World Anthropological Congress.

Dr. L. S. B. Leakey (Kenya) suggested that all missionaries should have a course of social anthropology included in their training, and that missionary and other societies working among primitive peoples should take care not to confuse Christianity with customs of Western Europe which had been built up around Christianity. The principle of the proposal was endorsed by the meeting.

#### Confusing Christianity with European Customs

An interesting discussion on African marriage laws and customs, and the effect of contact with western civilisation, took place at the Anthropological Congress.

Dr. L. S. B. Opening the discussion, Dr. Leakey said African marriage laws, as they were to be found, were not the same as those found in all over Africa when the European influence was first felt, but were the result of conditions, and in almost every case were undoubtedly well adapted to the conditions in which each tribe lived. The coming of the white man, however, had introduced unparalleled difficulties in connection with African marriage laws.

#### Kikuyu Customs

The Kikuyu marriage laws had broken down in the face of change

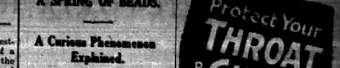

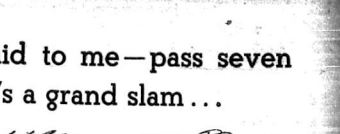

## LAMU AND JAPANESE COMPETITION

Mat Bags for Zanibar Cloves.

A STAPLE INDUSTRY.

Threatened with Severe Losses.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT].

Lamu, August 13.

The manufacture of mat bags for use in the export of cloves from Zanibar has long been an important staple industry in this district and is almost the sole support of many families. The demand depends upon the prosperity of the clove trade, but is fairly constant. Prices are very low now—compared with those of former years—but even so the quantities exported from Lamu and the revenue derived therefrom constitute a major factor to very many poor families. The figures for the last two years are—1932, 14,315 bags, value Shs. 84,798; and 1933, 14,073 bags, value Shs. 87,713.

The information that the Japanese intended competing in this line first reached Lamu a month ago, but was discounted then as no confirmation could be obtained. Now I have it from a prominent merchant of Lamu, a member of Committee that so well that it is being set on foot on our behalf and it is to be able to bring influence to bear upon the Zanibar Government to ensure the continuance of the old trade system in its own hands. It is thought might be done since Japan is not merely outside of the British Empire but also a not a lover of Zanibar produce. It may be noted that Zanibar as a very particular indeed about the packing of its cloves and I remember that an attempt made some years ago to supplant our mat bags by those of Japan was not at all favourably received by the trade and a return had to be made to the local product.

The Bortli Trade.

There is another important local industry in which we have no reason to fear outside competition, and that is the bortli export trade. It was once a purely seasonal trade, but has now become a year-round one. It is also, in some ways, quite recently but that was because the cutters were bringing in low grade poles. The efforts of the District Commissioner and the valuable assistance afforded by the Forestry Department have helped to meet the danger and the prospects for next season's export trade are now most promising.

Certain standards of length, thickness, and straightness have been imposed and are being enforced by the simple method of confining all that are not up to the mark. As a result only high grade poles are coming to the market, with beneficial results all round. Thus the cutters are getting better prices; the export merchants are pleased; more money is being put into commerce in the District; and Government is obtaining a higher revenue from the royalties collected by the Forestry Department.
