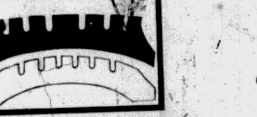

"Standard" Correspondent, Arusha

As a result of the new telephone exchange which was opened at Arusha last week, subscribers in the town are now able to dial each other directly, and also can dial direct to Moshi, on the first subscriber-to-subscriber trunk exchange with Tanganyika. 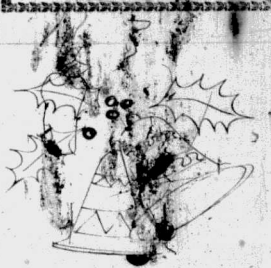

# MAKING YOUR OWN PARTY PAPER HATS

By ROSAMUND JONES

PRETTY paper hats, like balloons, are a "must" for children's parties. Have you ever thought of making them? For about four shillings and a few hours' pleasant work with scissors and sewing machine you can produce attractive and undervalued hats for a dozen or more children.

I find that the younger children like to use their party hats for games and dancing afterwards, and these home-made ones are really tough.

You will need four packets of crepe paper—choose if possible one of the stronger kinds; some are rather soft and flimsy for children.

Bright contrasting colours are most effective and you can match your hat's exterior, or all to suit.

At some of our parties we have kept a definite scheme of two colours and used "ribbons" of the paper for

decorating the table. A strong line of decorative work particularly well together. Half-patterned or star-patterned crepe paper, a plain contrast is very attractive for decorative work.

Monocolor cotton is better than crepe paper for the lining, and I use a No. 14 needle in your sewing machine when you have finished the hat. One session of hat making will insure it makes for several material afterwards.

**SEWING STRATEGY**  
Two simple hat shapes, the double-pointed and the crown style, are easy to make and give varied outlines with different trimming and colour combinations.

For each double-pointed hat you need a piece of crepe paper 28" x 11", also a strip 24" x 8" in a contrasting colour for the lining. The only decorative finish but give extra strength to the hat where it is most needed.

Fold four large pieces of paper in half, giving you a double thickness 12" x 11". Then fold over again, putting the cut edge level with the first fold. You now have four thicknesses of paper, measuring 12" x 11".

Make a straight cut from one corner to the other, diagonally.

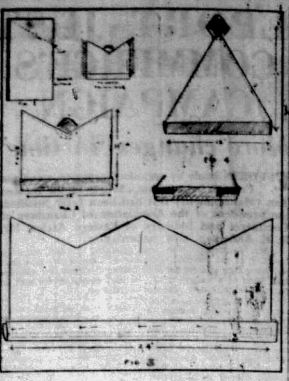

# Indian goods criticised: Exports of poor quality

India as an exporter of finished goods was not held in high esteem in Kenya, the president of the Indian Chamber of Commerce, Mr. K. P. Shah, said in Nairobi on Saturday.

He was speaking at a luncheon given for a three-man delegation of the Chemical and Allied Products Export Promotion Council from India.

Mr. Shah said it often happened that goods delivered were of the same standard as the samples seen by importers. He added that the Indian Government ought to exercise rigid control over goods exported from the country.

The leader of the delegation, Mr. C. D. Thakkar, agreed that there were sometimes complaints about the quality of goods exported to India, but he said the main reason was that the people complaining had not been carrying on a business with reputable firms.

He emphasized that it was necessary for Kenya importers to approach the established manufacturers in India to avoid having cause for complaint.

Regarding Government control and the chemical industry, Mr. Thakkar said all products had to be up to British standards and were checked meticulously.

The delegation, which is seeking East African markets for chemicals, drugs and other products, left Nairobi yesterday after spending several days in the city. It has already visited Persia, Iraq, Egypt and the Sudan, and spent three days in Uganda. It will return to Nairobi from Dar es Salaam on the way to Aden on British Airways.

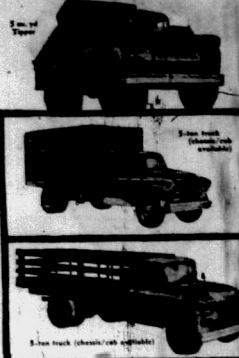
