# TRAINING OFFERED TO STUDENTS FROM AFRICA

"The Congress is of the opinion that it is vitally necessary to promote full understanding between the African, Arab and Indian communities and that periodical steps should be taken as early as possible to create an organisation to work for their general advancement."

THIS was the resolution adopted at the 11th Session of the East African Indian National Congress held at Mombasa in September, 1966. Emanating from this resolution two suggestions were made by African leaders who were invited to attend the session for better relationship between the Indians and Africans as well as African students in the universities of India as soon as it is practically possible and (2) that special facilities be made available for African students for technical, commercial and agricultural studies in India at the earliest convenient time.



On the basis of the above some prominent African leaders wrote a personal letter to the Indian Prime Minister, Mr. Nehru, and sent it through Raja Sir Maharajahendra who has recently returned to East Africa in 1966 for some official work.

In the letter the Africans said: "As the demand for all round education is all round and the immediate objective of the standard of education is the most sincere desire of our people, we are sure that the Government of India will be glad to consider the request for the establishment of a system of cultural scholarships to help students from Africa to study in India. 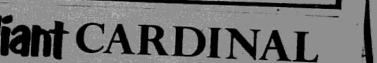

# Aviation costs expected to increase

## JET PLANES WILL PUT UP AIRLINES' BILL

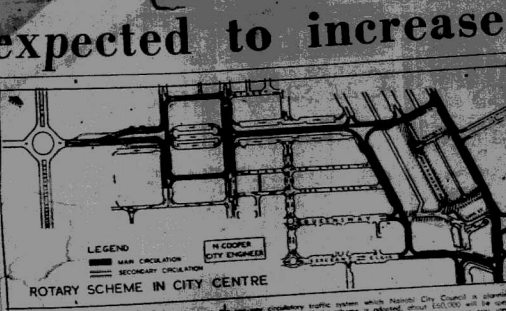

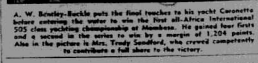
# BOLLY LOCKE INJURED IN CAR CRASH

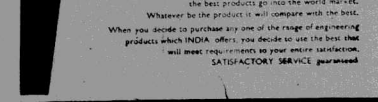
