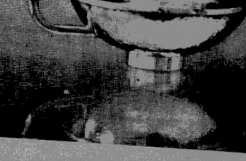
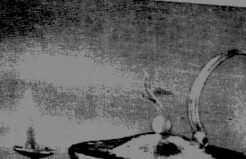

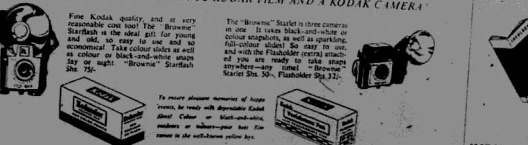

**M. BUTLER**, the Home Secretary, rejected in the Commons a suggestion that the Prime Minister in London should withdraw an invitation to the South African Premier to visit the United States. Mr. Butler faced a barrage of questions relating to the invitation.

He said that he would be glad to give every opportunity to the Prime Minister to discuss the matter with the South African Premier. # U.N. Commission deplores apartheid policy

## AFRO-ASIAN DRAFT TABLED DURING DEBATE ON RIOTS

**DRAFT** resolution deplores last week's riots in South Africa and the apartheid policy in the United Nations Security Council on Thursday night.

The resolution was sponsored by Ecuador, a member of the Council, on behalf of the 20 African-Afro-Asian group of countries in the United Nations.

Immediately after the lunch break, the draft resolution was tabled. The South African representative who lobbied the resolution, said his country would not support the matter without first being heard on it by our representatives in the Security Council. The draft was then postponed until the morning of Saturday.

One of two changes were made. One of them was the word "deterioration" in relation to South Africa's racial policy "degraded" after some members of the Afro-Asian group had feared that an outright attack on the apartheid policy might come from one or more of the non-African members of the Security Council.

Chairman Paulista and Guinea were the three countries reported to have urged the use of a stronger language made in the resolution with asking Mr. Koenig of the Security Council to report back to the United Nations on the South African Government's progress towards the implementation of a date—June 30, 1960—for the complete termination of racial discrimination. This was finally agreed.

**Explosive situation**

People of Africa were asking for immediate cessation of the Union, Mr. Quaquebua declared.

The situation was so explosive that the United Nations could not produce a "white paper" on the subject.

The governing National Party and its policies were the cause of the trouble, the speaker said. The South African Government's policy, Mr. Quaquebua said, was "not only a racist policy, it is also a policy based on force and lies." He said that the United Nations would always act on the basis of truth.

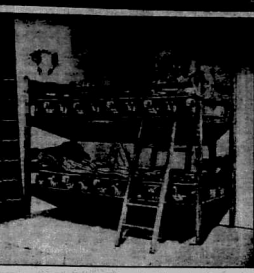
