Kenya Farmers' Most Difficult Year

ANNUAL REPORT OF DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

1932 Problems.

KAKAMEGA SAVES SOME SETTLERS FROM COMPLETE RUIN.

According to the annual report of the Department of Agriculture, 1932 was the most difficult year ever experienced by farmers in Kenya.

It is recorded that owing to the exhaustion of their capital and the impossibility of obtaining further financial assistance, a number of farmers were compelled to cease farming. Their position, fortunately, was eased by the existence of the Kakamega food diggings.

Agricultural Credits.

The difficulties experienced by all branches of the agricultural industry stimulated the Government to take steps for the purpose of expressing my thanks to the Kenya Government for services rendered by the Director. It has not been possible to meet many of the requests for assistance, particularly those involving travelling and the extension of investments. Strike Among Farmers in United States.

PROTEST AGAINST POLICY OF GOVERNMENT.

An Unsound Programme.

PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT BROADCASTS APPEAL TO NATION.

The Farmers' Holiday Association in the United States has declared a strike as a protest against the policy of the National Industrial Recovery Act, and with the object of compelling the administration to formulate a code for agriculture.

The leader of the movement stated that the Government's programme was neither economically sound nor corrective of farmers' ills. It is expected that the strike will be supported in the Middle West where the plight of farmers is very desperate.

In an endeavour to placate the two million indigent farmers, the farm Administration has suggested immediate loans on wheat, the speeding-up of farm re-financing and the establishment of Debt Conciliation Boards.

During the course of a broadcast address President Roosevelt appealed for patience in regard to the ultimate effect of the recovery plan. He commented, however, that the present rise in farm prices was not satisfactory.

2,000,000 Indignant Farmers.

The farmers' dissatisfaction with the National Recovery Association, evidenced in many parts of the country, has culminated in the Farm Holiday Association calling a general strike to start at noon to-morrow, with the object of compelling the Administration to formulate a code for agriculture and also to raise prices as the result of the stoppage of production.

The directors of the Association have drafted a nationwide ultimatum declaring that:

1. Farmers will not pay any taxes or interest until they have first acted for their families.
2. The strike will not interest bearing debts until they have received the cost of production.
3. They will buy only necessities.
