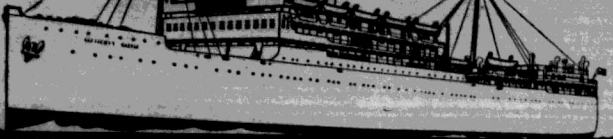

Having arranged for a safari of camels, Mrs. Long, unaccompanied by a European companion, set out on her journey towards the East. Her trip is the first of its kind in the history of the East. She had intended continuing the journey over the desert accompanied only by Arab guides but the pilot declined to leave her there alone. In view of some argument, the journey was resumed by air to Ma'an, which lies to the east of Petra, the famous ancient city of rose-red sandstone which was Mrs. Long's first objective. At Ma'an Mrs. Long hired a car and drove to Petra.

A Tourist Omit.

In recent years Petra has been thoroughly explored and has become increasingly popular with tourists. It is in the heart of the mountains which form the eastern flank of Wall's Arabs, the great valley running from the Dead Sea to the Gulf of Akaba. Walked in by towering rocks Petra, one-time headquarters of the Nabataeans, a people of ancient Arabia, was practically unexplored. Almost encircling the ruined capital on three sides are round conical mountains. The most impressive entrance is from the east through a dark and narrow gorge which is 200 feet high and only ten feet wide.

Mrs. Long camped in a cave and during a stay of several days made herself thoroughly familiar with the labyrinthine passages of the ancient city. The old town is a hill used in ancient times for sacrifices and which has been suggested by Dr. Nielsen, a well known Danish archaeologist, was the mountain on which Moses made the Tabernacle. 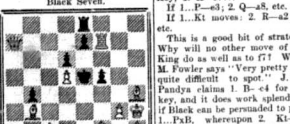

## DISCOVERY WHICH MAY PROVE BOON TO DAIRYING.

### Experiments in Britain.

EXCELLENT CATTLE FEED AVAILABLE IN TEN DAYS AFTER PLANTING.

Experiments which are at present being carried out in Britain may have an important influence on the world's dairying industry.

It has been shown that grass, supplied three times a day with water containing the most proportion of salts, the plants would absorb from soil, and produce a prolific growth of maize at a very much quicker rate and of better quality than under ordinary planting methods.

In ten days, it is claimed, excellent grazing can be produced for cattle which, fed on the results of this intensive cultivation, have shown surprising improvements in weight and milk yield.

### Encouraging Tests.

At least quantities of salts they would extract from ordinary soil. The National Institute's experimental cupboards has ten trays, all as equipped at the National Institute for Research in Dairying near Reading.

A new British firm, Intensive Cultivation, Ltd., propose to set up similar "cupboards" in its divisions in the dairying countries.

The inventor, Dr. Frank Whipple, who is a German, developed the idea of the cupboard during the last three years, from two facts. One is that grass reaches its most succulent and nutritious stage very early and then becomes less palatable, the milk of cows fed on it is inferior, and just at their most vigorous age.

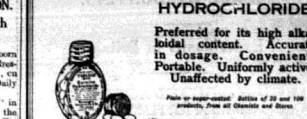

He did not object to the transfer of the political and military administration, but he demanded that the administration remain in the hands of the Indian Government. He proposed that the transfer should await the commercial decadence of Aden and higher taxation.

The Council of State unanimously passed a motion that their civil administration of Aden be not transferred. The official members of the Council members

"In the House of Commons in June, Sir Samuel Hoare, Secretary for India, gave an outline of the proposals for the future administration of Aden. He said that the Imperial Government contemplated relieving India of the annual contribution of £150,000 towards military and political administration, specially the transfer of the rights appertaining to the Honorary High Court. Thirdly, that Aden should remain a free port, and that the present standard of administration be maintained and that there be no increased taxation unless absolutely necessary. Fourthly that the proportion of Indians in the Aden Service be maintained for some years; and fifthly that the racial legislation be permitted.

Aden was occupied by the British in 1839 and it is a great coaling-station and port of call, and an emporium for the trade of the adjacent African and Arabian coasts. It is the only fortified island in the Indian Ocean, and may be regarded as an outpost of the Indian Empire.

Aden and Aden is a small unfortified island serving as a coaling-station at the southern entrance to the Red Sea, occupied in 1837. ## THE BANKRUPTCY COURT.

"Not a Club With an 'In' and 'Out' Door."

"The Bankruptcy Court is not a club with an 'in' and 'out' door," declared Mr. Justice Thomas, sitting in the Bankruptcy Court, Nairobi, on Friday.

He had been asked to grant the discharge of an Indian who owing £171, had agreed to pay 50 per cent, 25 per cent, by instalments of his 50. To this he had paid eleven instalments and the Official Receiver, who objected to the discharge, said that it would take the man another 31 years to pay off the balance.

Continuing, His Honour pointed out that by filing his petition the debtor had deliberately released his liability to his own and only creditor, and added: "It seems to me almost an absurd notion of the Bankruptcy Court to file a petition where there is only one creditor who is quite content to receive his debt in regular instalments. Having, under an order of the Court, paid eleven instalments, the debtor considers that he should get his discharge. In that case I see no reason why the debt should not eventually be paid in full. It is essential that at least 50 per cent should be paid before a discharge is given."

During the hearing of the application, it was stated that the man was in regular employment, and that his creditor had been willing to be paid so much monthly.

The Judge therefore refused the application.

## TIME SIGNAL.

Apparatus Soon to be Installed.

DEATH OF VISCOUNT GREY OF FALLODON.

HISTORIC SCENES IN HOUSE OF COMMONS RECALLED.

11 Years at Foreign Office.

FAIR-SEEING STATESMAN WHO TRIED TO AVERT THE GREAT WAR.

One of Britain's most famous statesmen and an outstanding figure in the war crisis of 1914, Viscount Grey of Fallodon died early yesterday morning after 12 days illness.

Lord Grey (better known to the public as the war days as Sir Edward Grey) was Britain's Foreign Minister for eleven years and his tenure of office constituted a record.

He used every human endeavour to avert the catastrophe which overtook the world in August, 1914, but when the time came to make a decision he stood by the pledges that his country had undertaken. To him there was no other course to follow.

Lord Grey was a man of curiously diverse interests. In his youth he was a keen athlete, in his mature years he threw himself into the maelstrom of world politics, yet always his keen love of nature was demonstrated in his care for birds. He was unique in the world.

Modern St. Francis of Assisi.

Viscount Grey of Fallodon died shortly after six this morning at his home in Fallodon, Northumberland. He was taken ill on Tuesday (two days ago and although he rallied occasionally, he died in his bed at 10.15.

To overcome the handicap of the limited state of his health, he learnt Braille and also continued to follow as best he could his own knowledge in a grave manner, particularly fishing.

His death removed a great and well loved man from the ranks of British statesmen.

Notable Tributes.

Many notable tributes were to-day paid to Lord Grey. The Foreign Secretary, Sir John Simon, said: "None of us in the news of his death received with profound sorrow or with a keener sense of loss than inside the walls of the Foreign Office."

The Prime Minister, who is playing with the King and Queen at Balmoral, said he represented with great distinction the dependable solidity of England.

The leader of the opposition, Mr. George Lansbury, in a letter to the House of Commons said that he had been glad to have tried to live up to the very best traditions that they associated with the name of Viscount Grey.

The subscription to the Kenyan Horticultural Society is £10 a year and should be sent to the Hon. Secretary, P.O. Box 27, Mt. Kenya. All correspondence for the Hon. These notes are based on gardens in Nairobi and similar areas, where there are two rainy seasons in the year, the full rainy season from approximately 5,000 to 7,000 feet.

**PROPAGATION.**

Now is the time to propagate your varieties for the next season. Plants are easy to grow and do well in boxes or tubs, if you have not a suitable bed, and young plants always produce the greatest and best blooms, now is the moment to put in the cuttings. These are found at the base of the plant and may be detached by a downward pull, when they will come away with a leaf which will require little trimming with a knife. Hollow shoots are of little use.

The best soil is good garden soil, a genuine garden soil, or a mixture of soil and sand. Fine material, such as peat, is not to be used, it is really better than soil and sand, which contains too much soda for this purpose, unless thoroughly washed. Many cuttings will strike in sand alone, but when rooted must be taken out in the soil most suited to them. Place the boxes in a shady place and keep moist, damping overhead repeatedly to keep down red spider and thrips, which are the worst pests with these delicate flowers. Mildew must also be guarded against. Cuttings may be raised from soil also in the usual way and afterwards pricked off in boxes, three to four inches apart all ways. Excelsior, Master perlite, Trinidad Peat, or Perlite and Perlite are the best, and if grown in semi-shade produce stems from six to nine inches in length.

**Petunias.**  
Petunias of particular variation and colors may now be propagated. Again the best sort for this purpose are from the base of the plant and should be removed with a knife, trimming afterwards with a very sharp knife directly underneath a leaf—always keep them clean out in necessary—but be careful not to bruise the delicate stems in the operation. Put into the same compost as for pansies with plenty of grit, and place in the shade until rooted. Do not transplant until the plants are really wonderful and this is the only way in which any variety may be propagated with certainty. These leafy plants are attractive both in garden and on the veranda. If raised from seed, which, in the case of the double varieties, is very expensive, they must be taken out in tubs the first week after sowing the seed, afterwards covering the tubs slightly with soil from above.

**Dahlia.**  
Dahlia, when about over the top of the soil, should be cut back half the cuttings which they will produce an abundance of cuttings. These may be pulled off downwards with a heel, or may be cut with a knife, each being about six inches long. The first method results in a heel requiring little trimming afterwards, and may be put straight into deep beds or prepared beds. These cuttings soon take root, and when ready may be planted out in nursery beds or put into banana receptacles ready for sale or planting out. If you label the old plants when in flower the plants which they are, and you will know which they are. If they get lanky pinch the point out about four pairs of leaves up and this will keep them stocky and delay them for planting out which may be necessary as we do not get rain at the right time. Place in the shade until rooted, watering thoroughly at first to keep them fresh so that they do not drop.

**Carnations.**  
Carnations may also be raised from short cuttings not more than three or four inches long. Do not use a knife for these, but snap them out with the fingers, and they prove to be very brittle stems. In this choice of the cutting they require very gritty soil, or even old sharp sand or fine mountain sand. Break the bottom of a well-drained soil into twelve inches, four inches apart. See that they are well trimmed, but do not bruise the stems, and water well at first, planting in the soil until they start growing, then remove into a higher place, and when strongly enough, plant out into beds.

When ready may be planted out in nursery beds or put into banana receptacles ready for sale or planting out. If you label the old plants when in flower the plants which they are, and you will know which they are. If they get lanky pinch the point out about four pairs of leaves up and this will keep them stocky and delay them for planting out which may be necessary as we do not get rain at the right time. Place in the shade until rooted, watering thoroughly at first to keep them fresh so that they do not drop.

Others may be dug up when the tops have died back, and placed in the shade. Keep them dry for a time, then water them and they will push forth their tubers in boxes with the eye level with the surface of the soil, and water moderately when they have grown about two or three inches. Plant out into permanent quarters, for this is the surest way to increase your best varieties. Throw away those that are not worth while, for although they may be good in Europe or the Cape they do not succeed here. It is advisable, though, to save a few pots of seed from each of these varieties, as good results have been obtained from seed. The Kenya varieties are much better here, especially the true blue variety.

**Berberis Dufala.**  
Berberis Hybrid or Berberis Dufala may be sorted out according to colors which are found in the London market. They require very gritty soil, or even old sharp sand or fine mountain sand. Break the bottom of a well-drained soil into twelve inches, four inches apart. See that they are well trimmed, but do not bruise the stems, and water well at first, planting in the soil until they start growing, then remove into a higher place, and when strongly enough, plant out into beds.

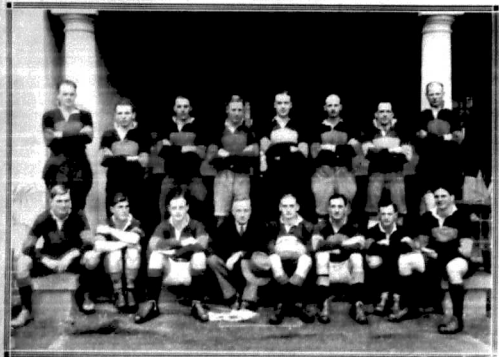

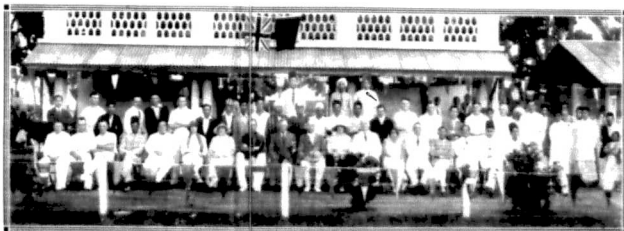

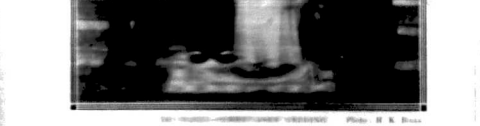

### Export of Gold From the United States.

#### EMBARGO LIFTED BY THE PRESIDENT.

President Roosevelt has raised the embargo on the export of gold from the United States, in order that gold mined in the country may obtain the highest prices. The Treasury will handle the gold for export.

The raising of the gold embargo, however, is interpreted in New York financial circles as a definite step towards the devaluation of the dollar, as the Treasury will be able by its transactions on the world gold market to control the price of the dollar.

#### Treasury Control.

Washington, August 26. (REUTERS' AGENCY.) The American press is rejoicing that the President is ready to invoke his powers under the National Emergency Act, to set price levels by dollar devaluation. Roosevelt will only use this inflationary weapon as a last resort if the gold embargo fails to check the inflationary pressure. Mr. J. D. Rockefeller, junior, in a report for the wide-wide co-operation for the success of the National Recovery Act, declares that the gold is worth nothing at almost any cost and sacrifice.

#### An Upward Turn.

New York, August 26. President Roosevelt has called the national recovery drive as a new step, in a speech today to Congress. He asserted that the downward drift had definitely turned and that recovery is now well under way. He urged full participation in the organizing plan. He declared an end to unproductive and unproductive activities and appealed that interest should be given to recovery. He stated that the nation is in a position to be restored to health and prosperity.
