1932 DESCRIBED AS "A PERIOD OF TRANSITION."

Programme Fully Developed.

A trading loss of £10,000 and a total loss of £500,000 are shown in the 1932 accounts of the Ford Motor Co. Ltd., says a report published in the "Financial News". The latter figure is arrived at after charging depreciation of £241,000, loss of £127,237 arising on trading operations outside the British Isles, including losses of subsidiaries for 1931 and 1932 and £100,000 for 1931 and a total balance of £412,142 and a net balance of £457,978.

Against a credit balance of £278,871 brought into the current account the company carries forward a debit of £534,445.

The major manufacturing programme of the company has been restricted in scope, and has been altered. The last year has been a period of transition, says the report. 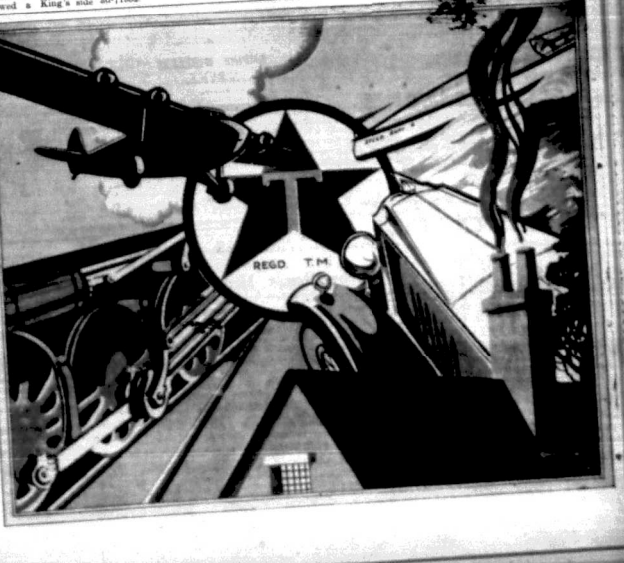

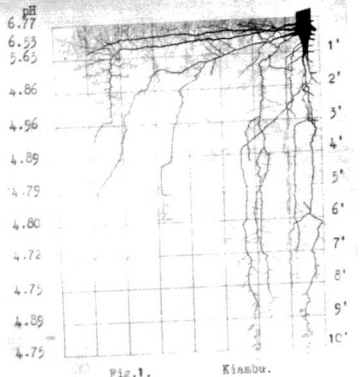


Fig. 1. Kiambu. Root system of 17 year old tree.

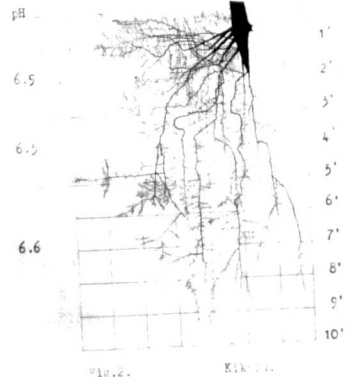


Fig. 2. Kiambu. Root system of 6 year old tree.

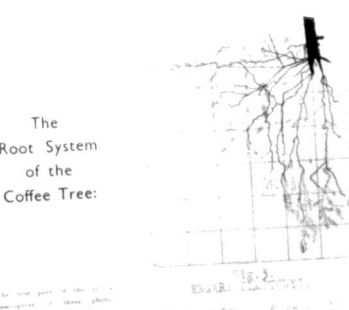


Fig. 3. Kiambu. Root system of 3 year old tree.

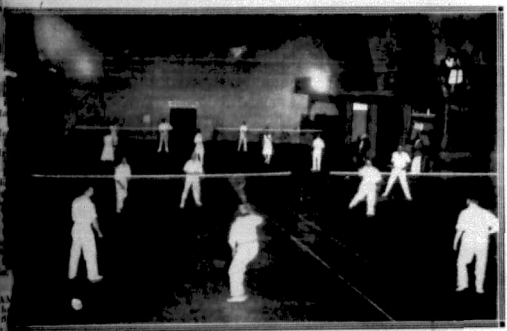

TACTICS IN GOLF.

Upkeep of the Course.

The Drought is Doing.

The drought is certainly causing considerable injury to the golf course, which main concern is the upkeep of the course. It is a difficult period for them, and while their efforts to maintain everything in tip-top condition fails to receive due reward, it is perhaps due to the fact that players are generally not so keen as it entitled. At the same time, it is a big handicap on the attention of the club to their attention upon the course, and pay not enough attention to such things as seeing that the trees, in this hard weather, are kept up to scratch, or again, trying to keep the brown at such a pitch that there is an inevitable surface presented on which to putt.

During the last week or so I have been struck by the manner in which some courses deal with their lawns. The sand is sifted some two or three times a week, while in other cases there is a continuous sifting of the lawn, so that every so often by the way with the main. Rain washed brown presents difficulties to the successful player, but they do offer a better putting surface. Under the present dry conditions many of the lawns in fact could be improved by a fine sand sifting of the sand. 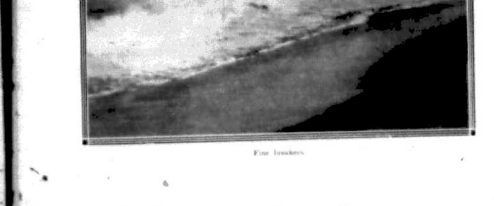

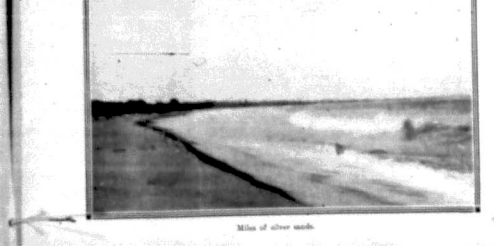

Frank Reply to Planters. DENIAL THAT CURRENT EXPENDITURE IS STILL TOO HIGH.

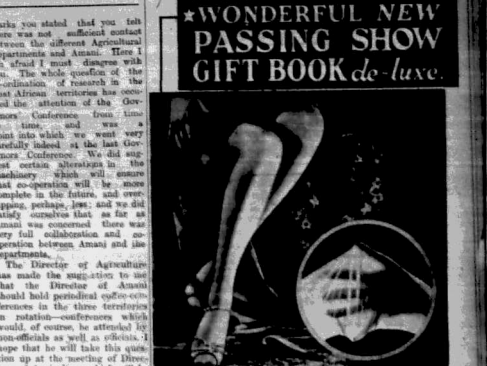

NEW TAXATION BILLS TO BE INTRODUCED AT BEGINNING OF AUGUST.

He said it was clearly desirable that the public should have ample opportunity of studying the Bills.

The Secretary of State has made several comments which necessitate discussions with neighbouring territories and involve their co-operation.

In an outline of the present financial position of the country Mr. Moore said that during the first four months of 1952 expenditures on the Government account were £58,159. The comparable figure for this year was £6,639. Except during March when loan interest had to be paid monthly revenue had so far exceeded expenditure.

In view of drought conditions the policy of stringent economy would continue to be pursued throughout the year.

Acting Governor's Review.

Kenya Legislative Council met on Monday and on 20 minutes on Monday was then adjourned by His Excellency the Acting Governor (Mr. H. M. Moore) until August 2. Only a few members of the public were present.

MEALY BUG CONTROL.

For the 12 months ending December 31st our loss on working was £105,000. For the 12 months ending April 30th our loss was £20,000. The revenue collections during the first four months have been on the whole satisfactory. Actual customs revenue for the first three months exclusive of excise duties amounted to £147,566 and the expenditure on the same was £20,000. April and May are estimated at £90,000. These results may be considered as satisfactory. In this connection it is interesting to note the marked improvement in the Colony's exports during the year. For the first four months of 1952 exports amounted to £274,973 in value and for the corresponding period of this year they amount to £269,640, an increase of over £5,000. This improvement should be reflected at any rate in the revenue account. It is hoped that the results will be accepted as fully representative of the year.

Rabies Control.

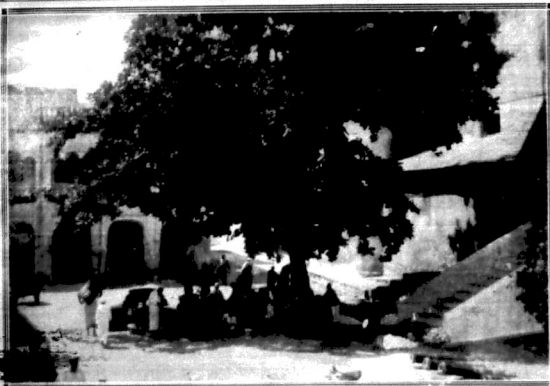
