MORE UGANDA VIEWS ON THE GIBB REPORT.

MEMORANDUM BY EASTERN PROVINCE CHAMBER.

The Railway Council.

STRONG OPPOSITION TO SUGGESTED ABOLITION.

During the course of a memorandum submitted to the Uganda Government, dealing with the Gibb Report, the Eastern Province Chamber of Commerce strongly opposes the recommendation that the Railway Advisory Council should be abolished in favour of a London Board.

It is emphasized that the control of the railway must be in the hands of the Governments of the countries concerned. It is suggested, however, that the post of High Commissioner should be abolished, and that final decisions in matters of railway administration should be taken by the High Commissioner and the railway administration, coupled with the Governors' Conference.

The memorandum also opposes country produce and distribution rates. It also states that the railway should be run as a business concern and that its rating, policy and control should not be mainly fixed for the development of other country.

Position of General Manager.

The Eastern Province Chamber of Commerce, Jinja, has submitted a memorandum to the Uganda Government detailing its views upon the recent report prepared by Mr. Roger Gibb on the question of the rating and financing of the Uganda Railways and Harbours.

In submitting the report to the Uganda Government, the following interesting letter was attached to the memorandum:

"In handing you the attached memorandum, I am directly to express the anxiety of the Chamber to Mr. Gibb, who we trust has now been fully restored to his normal health, for the enquiry shown during his visit to Jinja in spite of the fact that he was far from well."

"My Chamber also desires to express satisfaction of the able and bold manner your report deals with the various subjects on which opinions in Kenya and Uganda have been for many years at variance."

"My Chamber also feels that in dealing with railway matters it would be in the interests of the country to have a more precise definition of the manner in which the railway services have been generally affected by depression, when it was an economy to retrovert staff and economies were generally effected with a minimum of loss of efficiency which we have always been not by the General Manager and Senior Officials of the Administration whenever we have demanded to meet them."

Wireless Notes.

Practical Hints . . . The Progress of Wireless The Short Wave

This page, devoted to the interests of
Wireless, is conducted by "A" and is a
licensed experimenter with wide knowledge
of East African conditions.

It is well known to the student
of radio that history is constantly
repeating itself in the development
of this branch of science. When
wireless was still young—in the early
days of the spark coil and coherent—
it was not unreasonably imagined by
many people that its development
had reached its limit as soon as
efficiency had been obtained by
these primitive means. But just
as that time and to demonstrate
that there is really no end to sci-
entific progress, the wireless wave
came along and converted radio into
received a tremendous impetus.

Confounding the Pessimist.
Then again, after a very brief ex-
istence, there were plenty of
pessimists who declared that the
days of wireless were over although
in fact they had scarcely begun. In
fact they were wrong in their
radio activity and the great
popular enthusiasm for wireless re-
ception which did so much to bring
apparatus to its present high stan-
dard of perfection. In fact there is
no doubt that the coming of broad
casting had the foundations of a
new branch of the electrical sci-
ence and today there are millions of
pounds invested in the production
of wireless equipment in every
civilized country in the world.

A New Era.

We are now in the midst of a
new boom. The cause of this has
been the discovery of the usefulness
of the short wave. There is
nothing new about the short wave.
As a matter of fact the original
radio pioneer, Heinrich Hertz,
began experimenting with short
waves nearly 50 years ago. The
present popularity is due particu-
larly to the continuous new
development and the many sur-
prising applications of the new knowl-
edge in this constantly widening
field of practical research.

The Old Days.

It is difficult of course to avoid
comparisons between present day
efficiency and the old days when
the pioneer in wireless and in
broadcasting had to face so many
difficulties and constantly solve new
and complicated problems. The
"foot-proof" apparatus of to-day is
in sharp contrast with the very
primitive devices which the experi-
menter built up and used not so
very many years ago and there is
no doubt that the scientific method
has outdone and laid speakers of a
present day and the Health
Bibliomaniac marketable in your
year. Essentially of course the
fundamental principles are the same
and had it not been for the
patience and enthusiasm of the
pioneer electricians it would not be
possible for the unscientifically
minded today to turn a few knobs
in the wire and obtain long dis-
tance communication.

Manifest Dist.

The short wave is not confined
to its usefulness in the large field
of public entertainment. The trans-
mission telegraph which now pro-
vides a service to ships at sea and
in countries in almost every part
of the world is dependent upon
the application of the short wave.
Neither are the services which en-
able us to communicate with
each other in distant parts
of the world also it is necessary
to carry with them short wave
equipment to keep them in touch
with civilization and to give
homely a report, not only of
their progress but of their differ-
ences.

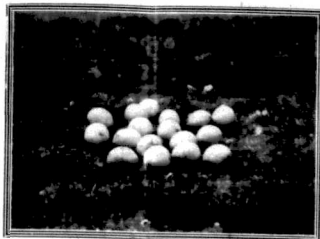

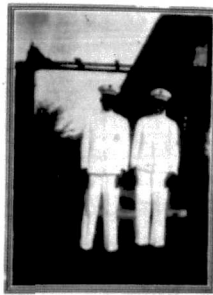

Sir G. Stewart Symes, Governor of Tanganyika Territory, gave an interesting lecture on May 17 at the E.A. Branch of the Overseas League...

Africans in the Service.

Finances were difficult but things improved; there was a shortage of raw materials and world prices were high, and they managed to market without difficulty, and as remunerative prices, every product they were able to produce, more particularly wool, they raised a loan.

Revenue of the Territory.

Goldmining Area on the Gori River.

OPENED FOR PROSPECTING ON THURSDAY.

First Issue of Permits.

LARGE NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS EXPECTED AT KISII.

Thursday saw the formal opening of the goldfields in the Gori River area for prospecting, when the first licenses entered the district will be issued by the District Commissioner at Kisii.

The District Commissioner, Kisii, which is the administrative center for the Gori River, has decided to issue no permits to enter the area until Thursday morning, when it is expected that there will be a big influx of prospectors.

Until Thursday anybody who had panned on the Gori River were a few consequences—had done so illegally, and rumor says that six men are being charged with an offence, the effect of which they are either allowed to leave during the area unattended, and have "pugged" claims.

What is present in known of the area is that it is entirely unexplored, and that there are indications of alluvial gold have yet been reported. It is by no means certain, however, that no alluvial gold exists, and there is a possibility that if the area receives many prospectors alluvial might be discovered. That, on the other hand, it is expected that there will be a big influx of prospectors.

Sir John Simon on Disarmament.

PROGRESS MADE, BUT STILL DISTURBING FACTORS.

The British Plan.

IMPOSSIBLE TO GO FURTHER WITHOUT GENERAL AGREEMENT.

An important statement on the progress of the Disarmament Conference was made by Sir John Simon, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, in the House of Commons on Friday.

Whilst he believed that real progress was being made at Geneva, he was recognized that there were extremely disturbing signs also.

He welcomed the character of the speech on Germany's attitude to disarmament made recently by Herr Hitler, but made the significant comment that it was necessary to recognize that words were not the same as deeds.

The Foreign Secretary once more stressed the big sacrifices already made by Britain towards disarmament, and said it was impossible to go further without general agreement.

America's Influence.

AMERICAN OFFICIALS' ASSESSMENT.

London, May 30. The keen interest aroused in the latest developments at the Disarmament Conference in London by the crowded benches and galleries of the House of Commons to-day, when Sir John Simon was reported from Geneva by a wireless message, was not without its cause. The Convention which, he declared, was a complete co-ordinated scheme which would be a real step towards the realization of the League of Nations, was the only effective means of securing that no time would be lost in deciding the future of the world. This was shown by the fact that the British Government had been the originator of the discussions ever since it had been proposed.

PRODUCTION OF TUNG OIL.

Market Prospects and Prices.

NO OVERPRODUCTION LIKELY.

Advice on Industry by Imperial Institute.

In view of the interest which is being taken in the Coteau in regard to the prospects of tung oil production, the following note issued by the Imperial Institute dealing with the market prospects and recent prices should be of interest.

Since January 1933 when tung oil was quoted at £69.10 per ton in London the spot price of the oil has shown considerable variation. After that month the price fell considerably until June 1933 when it reached its lowest level of £55.10. The heavy fall in price was ascribed to the lower value of oil consumed in China and was accentuated by the general fall in the price of commodities in the February of 1933. In October 1933 the price of tung oil in London rose to £62.10 as a result of the United Kingdom going off the gold standard the price increased to £63 and continued to rise till it reached £68.10 at the end of the following February when it remained steady for about a month. Since that time the quotation has varied from £62 to £63. The present price is £47.10 per ton spot.

Demand Increasing.

As regards the market prospects of tung oil it may be stated that there does not appear to be any great likelihood of overproduction for some years to come. In spite of the world-wide trade depression the demand for the oil is slowly increasing in the United Kingdom and in other European countries while in the United States of America it is also hoped that new uses will be found for the oil which will result in considerably larger quantities being consumed.

In the Empire Marketing Board publication on the production of tung oil in the Empire the opinion was expressed that the increased production of tung oil would naturally tend to reduce the price but it was considered that the reduction would not be so great as to render the cultivation unprofitable. In view of the extension of the cultivation of tung trees in the Empire and elsewhere during the last three years the sub-committee recommends increased production on the year at a recent meeting.

Caution Recommended.

The sub-committee agrees that their earlier opinion still holds for countries where tung trees have been planted under conditions as favorable as those mentioned in the information available and in view of the various factors mentioned to state that it will apply to all countries where the trees are being grown experimentally. They consider that, in view of the large scale planting which has been going on in some parts during the last three years or thereabouts, it should be recommended that the sub-committee should be requested to recommend the establishment of a tung oil plantation. It is thought that it would be a better plan for owners to concentrate rather than the present method of their selecting plantations by the sowing of heavy seed and long trees, which need much to be made good and need to be continuously poor yields.

THE KIKUYU CENTRAL ASSOCIATION.

A Dispute Regarding the Presidency.

ALIBOED DEFACTION.

Unusual Case Before a Nairobi Court.

Henry Thuku, a well-known member of the Young Kikuyu Movement—defeated by Government ten years ago and subsequently allowed to return by its repeal—brought a charge of defamatory libel against George Kariki in the Resident Magistrate's Court, Nairobi, on Friday. It is believed this was the first case of its kind to be brought by a Kikuyu with natives interested in the case. Only a few were admitted into the court hall.

Thuku claimed to be President of the Kikuyu Central Association, and said that the defamatory libel was contained first in a pamphlet published in Kikuyu and secondly in a letter, both signed by Kariki as Vice-President for Kwesi Beda, general president of the Kikuyu Central Association. Kariki had never been elected from the Kikuyu Central Association. Thuku had been collecting and using his funds for his own use, that he was neglecting the rites of the Association, and that therefore he was expelled as from April 12.

"Committee's Instructions."

Assumed admitted that the pamphlet was published on the instructions of the committee, who had directed him to send the letter to seven day notices of expulsion. The statements were printed in an Indian printer who printed the pamphlet on the instructions of Kariki and produced the original in writing. A thousand copies were printed.

Absent Eight Years.

In cross-examination Thuku said he was not in this country from 1922 to 1930, but on his return he was, in 1932, appointed President of the Young Kikuyu Movement. He was not in the country for eight years.

Arising out of other questions by Kariki, the Resident Magistrate wanted to know how many committees existed. It appeared there were two, and that Kariki published the pamphlet and letter on the instructions of his committee.

Secretary's Evidence.

Ndaga, general secretary and treasurer since 1962, claimed Thuku was President since the same year. He was not in the country and he had never seen Thuku. He also stated that the allegations were untrue, and that Thuku had been given no money from the Association for his personal use, or to be used for anything else. Kariki had never asked to see the accounts.

A Kikuyu member of the executive committee said Thuku was still President, but had never been de-factored from the Association for his own personal use. 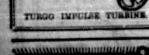

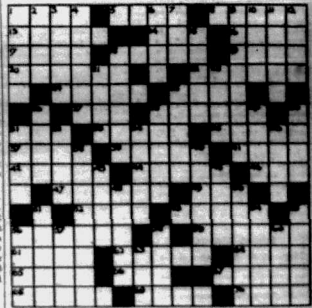

Spirit of Moderation.

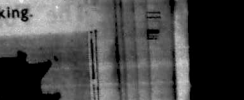

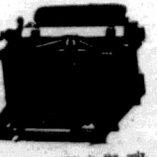
