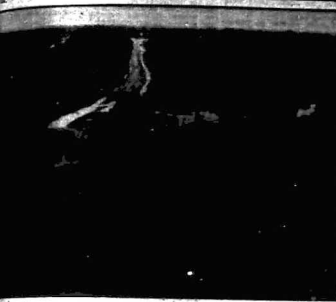

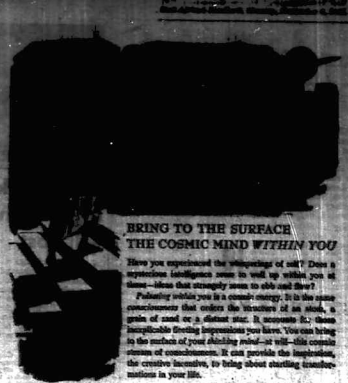


DYKE FOR SWOLLEN RIVER

TRADE FROM JAPAN U.K. trade slumps in Sterling Area

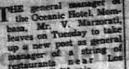

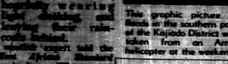

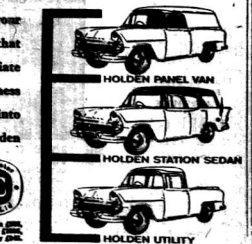
