## KENYA RAILWAY STRIKE: 23,000 OUT

### Relief teams sent to 60 stations

MOST of Kenya's 23,000 African employees of East African Railways and Harbours obeyed the Railway African Union strike call at the weekend. Passenger and goods trains manned by European and Asian staff continued to operate, but ran late in many cases.

Relief teams were rushed to about 60 stations to ensure that all traffic is handled quickly. An all-out effort by European firemen and other workers at Mombasa and other ports is being made to handle the heavy post-traffic.

J. F. C. Williams said that the Railway African Union and Kenya Railway Union have agreed to a 10 per cent wage increase.

#### Loyal staff redeployed

The general manager of E.A.R. said that the 10,000 European and Asian staff who remained at work were redeployed to handle the increased traffic.

The Railway Administration is not yet considering putting up of a public appeal for help against the actions of a majority of the strikers. Their full return to work is expected to be completed by the end of the month.

An appointment board for the general manager of E.A.R. has been set up to handle the work of the 10,000 European and Asian staff who remained at work.

#### FREIGHT AHEAD OF SCHEDULE

MORE than 1,000 tons of freight was loaded and unloaded on the docks used by volunteers, yesterday. A railway official said that normally the docks would have been jammed until Wednesday.

Mr. Powles, who was speaking at a conference in Nakuru of delegates from cereal-producing areas, said that without profitable exports of agricultural produce Kenya could not maintain a viable economy.

One of the most important factors in the long haul from the farming areas to the port was the cost of rail transport. The railway carried agricultural exports for 12½ cents a ton mile although its average overall cost was 20 cents a ton mile.

### TARIFF SYSTEM IN DANGER

It was able to carry out its statutory duty of providing cheap transport for agriculture only by charging higher rates on other classes of goods. But the position was being endangered by road competition which was inadequately controlled under the Transport Licensing Ordinance.

The bulk of road hauliers are taking increasing advantage of the high tariff goods from the railway thus endangering the whole concept of differential tariffs. Mr. Powles said that the Government should have support to allow railway further extension of the differential tariff system, which would be a serious step.

# U.S. OUTPUT DOWN ATOMIC EYE

## National effect of steel strike



**A LOSS OF \$100,000,000** (about \$2,143,000,000) in the U.S. and \$100 million national gross output for the third quarter of the year was caused by the nationwide steel strike.

This was reported by the Commerce Department which added that the strike had caused a greater effect than expected.

Steel national output, the third of the year, was estimated to be an annual rate of about 1.7 million tons for the third quarter.

The Commerce Department said that the steel industry had lost about 1.7 million tons of steel in the third quarter of the year. The Department's announcement was based on a survey of steel mills in the U.S. and Canada.

Increased wage bill for Kenya

Kenya's wage bill in 1956 was a total of K27,300,000 compared with K25,000,000 in the previous year.

The increase was due to a 10% rise in the minimum wage rate from K1.50 to K1.65 per week. This was the result of a decision by the Industrial Relations Commission.

The Commission also recommended a 5% increase in the maximum wage rate from K10.00 to K10.50 per week.

The total wage bill for Kenya in 1956 was 10% higher than in 1955. This was due to a combination of factors, including the increase in the minimum wage rate and the overall growth of the economy.

## London market resumes on cautious note

London (E.A.) Ltd.

The London market resumed on a cautious note today. The pound sterling was steady at 4s 6d against the dollar. The market was influenced by news of the steel strike in the U.S. and the increase in the wage bill for Kenya.

## STILL DANGER OF VIOLENCE IN TRADE CAMPAIGN

THE declaration that parts of Baganda should remain "disturbed areas", in which an abnormal state of affairs exists, will remain in force until the end of February — or earlier if the Governor thinks fit.

This was decided by Uganda Legislative Council when it agreed to a motion introduced by the Chief Secretary, Mr. Hartwell.

He said that although the security situation in most areas outside Kampala had continued to show some improvement, cases of intimidation and violence were still being reported to the police. Serious lawlessness was still occurring in North Mbagala.

## 700 INCIDENTS REPORTED

Imposition of curfew, large numbers of police and the posting of K.A.R. for a short time had had "a salutary effect" but the area must still be considered as one where serious violence might break out again without warning.

The Chief Secretary said that the number of incidents arising from the trade campaign reported to the police up to the end of September totalled 404. They comprised 298 threats, 118 assaults, 83 cases of damage to crops and 105 cases of damage to other property.

Since September 196 additional cases had been reported. They comprised 68 threats, 15 assaults, 12 cases of damage to crops, 24 cases of damage to other property and 24 other incidents.

# Opportunity to expand pig industry

## Second day of hearing LIBEL ALLEGED IN GOVERNMENT PRESS HAND-OUT

EXTRACTS from a report prepared by the Kenya Pig Producers' Association, which is being published in the Government Press Hand-out, have caused a stir in the Government. It is alleged that the report contains libelous statements against the Government and the Ministry of Agriculture. The Government has demanded an apology and compensation from the Association.
