WATER ACT 1961

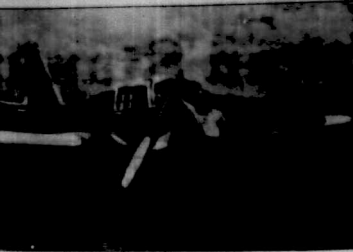

HOW THEY CELEBRATED THE FIRST FOURTH OF JULY

Liberty Bell heralded birth of new nation

ON July 4 each year United States citizens celebrate their national independence day — a tribute to that brave band of patriots who made up the Continental Congress and approved the Declaration of Independence in 1776.

The first celebration set a pattern which is still followed, with adaptations to suit modern times. John Adams of Massachusetts, who led the fight in Congress for adoption of the Declaration, was so impressed by the meaning of the document, proclaiming America's liberty that he wrote to his wife: "I am not in favour that will be celebrated to some degree on the day of deliverance to some area of dominion, by God Almighty. It ought to be celebrated in pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, races, ball, music and dancing, and every kind of contentment of the other."

The Fourth of July celebration has become a national holiday. The first celebration of the Fourth of July in the United States was held in 1776 in Philadelphia where the Continental Congress, adopting the Declaration that ended the British rule as a group of separate colonies and marked the birth of a united nation.

Religious against British tyranny, the Congress approved the famous document written by Thomas Jefferson that set out the new nation's principles. We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

July 4, 1776, was a day of brilliant sunshine in Philadelphia. Thomas Jefferson, 33, youngest member of the Virginia delegation, noted the celebration in his diary.

Jefferson was not joined by John Adams and with Franklin they joined their chairs on a small group beside one of the writing tables. Adams felt his feet. In a sudden release from his seat, they rose from their seats, clasped one another on the neck, and embraced in a

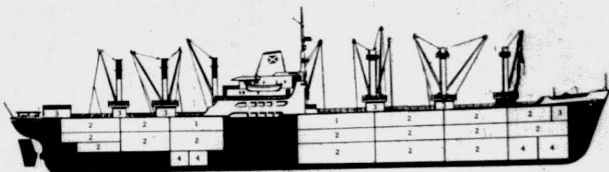

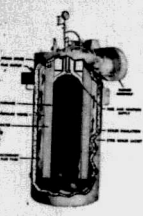

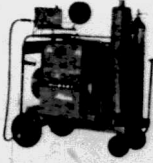

CO-OPERATION IN SPACE

Major international cooperation in space exploration was accomplished in the 14-month International Quiet Sun Year (IQSY), which ended on Dec. 31, 1962, that in all, 20 nations and 200 scientists and engineers from 12 countries worked together to share knowledge and make common use of the Earth's orbit.

In the past, it was pointed out that the major activity of the IQSY was the launch, orbit and recovery of the Earth-orbiting satellite, the Van Allen probes, which were launched in every 100 days from January 1, 1962, to August 31, 1964.

Many subjects have been included in the IQSY—manned space, atmospheric, astrophysics, and geophysics. The United Nations Office for Outer Space Affairs, Economic and Social Council, World Health Organization, and others participated in the IQSY. The International Council of Scientific Unions was the main co-ordinator.

Somalia talks after aid to shifra ends

Kenya was willing to hold talks with Somalia at any time and at any place on the ending of shifra raids and on a 'good-neighbour policy' but would not agree to discuss alteration of boundaries, the Minister of Defence, Dr. Mungai, told a Press conference in Nairobi yesterday.

Dr. Mungai reiterated that Kenya would not surrender an inch of her territory to Somalia or any other country. It was an open secret, he said, that Somalia was financing shifra bandits in the North-Eastern Province. This must stop before talks could begin with any hope of success.

Some Kenya Somalis have been taken to Somalia, trained, armed and harboured there. We can display to the Press the weapons captured by our armed forces.

Dr. Mungai was also concerned on Press reports that the Prime Minister of the Sudan, Mr. Nimeiry, who is mediating a border dispute between Kenya and Somalia, had asked Khaldun that Somalia was ready to negotiate with Kenya.

Dispute 'only in imagination'

The Minister went on: "President Kenyatta has made it clear that the Kenya Government is willing to talk with Somalia on ways of maintaining good neighbourhood and the ending of shifra raids. We are not, however, prepared to discuss any alteration of our present boundaries with Somalia."

In Kenya we know the truth about the boundaries. We hold that the present border dispute between Kenya and Somalia is not valid at all. No such dispute existed in the territory in question, as indicated by Radio Mogadishu.

52 IN KENYA TEAM FOR GAMES

Kenya will be represented by a team of 52 at the Commonwealth Games in Jamaica next month — 21 men, 14 women and 17 officials. Three swimmers and 11 athletes are the main members of the team.

Nuclear Test Criticism
FRANCE HAS REPLIED in round terms to the world wide denunciation of her nuclear test explosion in the Pacific, suggesting the industry "erectified" with the collateral intention of hypocrisies on the part of other countries.

The French authorities had anticipated an explosion of a large scale and went to the immense trouble of collecting copious information before the test in order to avert the danger from radioactive fallout. The considerations of making the test above the surface in the island in question was drilled 1,000 miles distant from the nearest populated area. The French are to be congratulated for having accepted the fact that nuclear tests are a necessary evil, and those to come will be conducted by just a few per cent of the amount released by American tests above ground.

It will be noted that the USSR and China have remained silent. President de Gaulle has recently remained aloof from the issue, which was a principal signature to the Partial Test Ban Treaty more than 100 nations have signed this year, but not France or China, so that France can claim immunity from treaty obligations. Nonetheless, the intention of the treaty is to prevent more tests in order to confine the country of nations in which France is an honour and respected member.

To this intention the French can reply that they have long favoured disarmament on the understanding that disarmament be total and effective. An President de Gaulle once said the day after Americans and the controlled destruction and handing of their own nuclear weapons. He said that the Minister pointed out that there were shortages in nearly all the sectors important for rapid development— including high-level manpower, domestic savings and foreign exchange earnings.

Development 'up to Kenyans' was the Minister's theme. He emphasized that Kenya had an extremely depressive record since independence two and a half years ago and reviewed the progress made over the balance of the economy and national life.

During the debate on the Revised Development Plan, Mr. Mboya said it must be recognized that the big task of development was still one for the Kenyans, adding "We cannot sit in the sun and depend on the aid of other countries to sustain us."

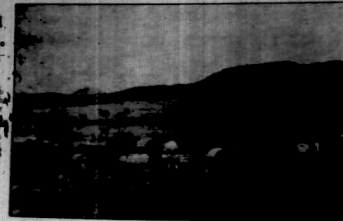

THE British seamen's strike cost Britain's reserves the best part of £49,000,000 and permanently deprived exporters of many overseas contracts. The loss was shown in the Ministry's monthly statements of reserves of gold and other convertible currencies.

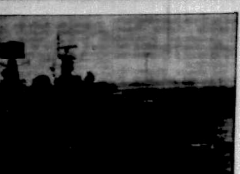
They dropped from May's £125,000,000 to £179,000,000 — the lowest since January. The real loss to the country's foreign reserves was greater — probably by many millions of sterling.

To isolate the Foreign Office under pressure during the strike, the Bank of England fell back on a 1962 arrangement with the Federal Reserve Bank of New York under which British bills of l'exchange can draw on American reserves.

The British reserves also lost millions of sterling through loss of overseas trading income when hundreds of British ships were unloading in the ports.

Other factors operating against the reserves during the month include uncertainty following India's devaluation of the Rupee.

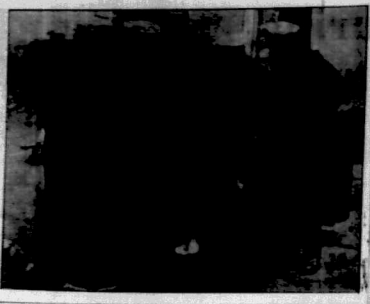
