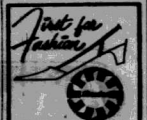

Australians kill 193 guerillas



Australian soldiers in a jungle setting, part of a military operation.

An Australian company, out-numbered by eight to one and down to its last rounds of ammunition, killed 193 Vietcong in a battle at Buoi, about 60 miles south-east of Saigon.

It was the largest battle Australian troops have fought since the Korean war and at times the Vietcong were jumping over piles of their own dead as they tried to storm the Australian positions.

The Australian company was ordered to hold the Buoi position for 24 hours. The company was a mix of regular and reserve troops.

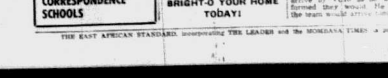
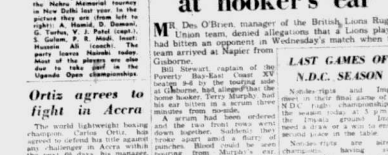

INTERNATIONAL help is pouring into Eastern Turkey where 3,000 people are feared to have died in Friday's earthquake, which devastated towns and villages.

Government plans to expand education further

Kenya's record in educational expansion since independence will still convince the administrative inefficiency and neglect shown in the whole operation of the educational system. Secretary to the Ministry of Education, Mr. J. K. Njoroge, said yesterday.

He was talking to a seminar for Provincial and County Education Officers at the Kenya Institute of Administration. The seminar was opened by the Minister for Education, Mr. Nyagah, who stressed the need for co-operation and mutual understanding between the various sections of the Ministry.

The officers will spend until Thursday in discussions on a wide range of educational methods and problems and will also visit places of educational interest and attend a meeting of a Kenya National Union of Teachers organization.

Mr. Njoroge reviewed the aspects of the Revised Development Plan relating to education, particularly the expansion of higher education including preparations for University College Nairobi, to become the independent University of Kenya in the 1960s under a £4,000,000 development scheme.

GREAT NEED FOR TEACHERS

On primary education he said the Government was studying the implications of abolishing fees in primary schools but has firm convictions on the subject and is not too optimistic. Any decision would be a matter of high policy.

Start from finding money for universal primary education was the difficulty of finding teachers — which gave added significance to the present concern.

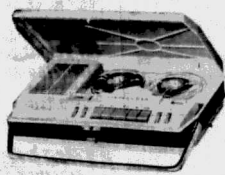

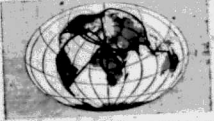

The U.S. command said it believed the chance was high that the other six crew members were killed. The ship was carrying 1,500 tons of supplies, including rice, oil, and other essential goods.
