Members of a Ghanaian parliament said yesterday that they had received a questionnaire in Washington in their request that the United States step up its food aid to Ghana.

U.S.C. arranging scholarships for Rodesian exiles

The International Students' Conference organisation, which has been based in Nairobi, is to attempt to arrange scholarships for students from Rhodesia as refugees. The U.S.C., a London-based organisation, is the U.S.C.'s associate secretary for finance and is Mr. R. Bell, said that scholarships had been already provided for about 25 Rhodesian students to attend schools here.

It was hoped to arrange for about 60 scholarships to be awarded. The Nairobi conference passed a resolution strongly condemning the Unilateral Declaration of Independence by the Smith regime, which it stated was administering a 'colonial police State'. It denounced Britain's refusal to use force to settle the Rhodesian problem and condemned 'British policy based on kith and kin considerations and vested British economic interests in Rhodesia'.

It demanded the use of force by Britain to quell the rebellion. Rhodesia, however, said that Britain had failed in this respect. The conference called on Britain to hand over the Rhodesian problem to the United Nations 'to evince Chapter Seven of the Charter to restore legitimacy and determination and respect for human dignity in Zimbabwe'.

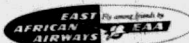

CRISIS WEEK' FOR COFFEE Kenya prices may be hit — Mr. McKenzie

Kenya is withdrawing from the International Coffee Agreement is hanging like a cloud over the conference of the International Coffee Organisation in London, the Minister for Agriculture, Mr. McKenzie, said in Nairobi yesterday. He said this week will be a crisis week for the talks. It would either see headway made or deadlock reached.

Mr. McKenzie, who has been attending the London talks, was speaking during a brief visit to Kenya between sessions of the conference. While he was talking to the Press, a member of the Kenya team telephoned him from London to say there was a possibility of concessions being made that would keep Brazil in the Agreement.

Mr. McKenzie was due to return to London last night, where he will also attend the Commonwealth conference. He said the threat to the future of the ICO was very serious indeed, but that the possibility that the Brazilian delegation might be recalled by their Government, and without Brazil there could be no International Coffee Agreement.

Kenya not cushioned
Brazil had a stockpile of 65,000,000 bags of coffee. While world consumption is around 47,000,000 bags a year, if Brazil withdrew and flooded the market with coffee, Kenya would be forced to sell coffee at what would virtually be an unremunerative price. Mr. McKenzie said that Kenya would be effectively cushioned against the shock of a severe slump in coffee prices.

The member of the Kenya team who phoned Mr. McKenzie said that Brazil was still demanding that there should be no review of coffee quotas which is one of the conference's biggest problems.

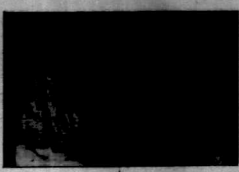

NEW DEAL IN KENYA

STRAIGHT TALKING may be unpopular with people who prefer the general and the spacious approach, but honesty of expression never did anybody any harm. There are occasions when a country needs any help. There are times when its shortcomings lie and what should be done to remedy them.

President Kenyatta used the State occasion of his holiday at the Coast to speak his mind; and what he had to say came all the more for his relative silence in the preceding weeks, and on account of his unequivocal language.

Kenya has been a worried country for some time and it is not surprising that a condition of this kind should be a matter. Come what may, he knows Kenya is a country housing people of different ethnic origins. They use community against another and the task is racial strife. Apply the hammer touch and there is hope for successful integration under unified national leadership. hope, not certainty, which remains to be contributed. Substitute racial animosity and hope winners.

End racial discrimination

The President has accomplished many miracles for Kenya but none more outstanding than the fact that he has timely advice at his disposal to be adopted by everybody having good will and ready wanting Kenya to prosper. Put an end to racial ill-will and discrimination. This is the burden of his message. "My Government" he emphasises, "will not tolerate anyone who seeks to show tribal, racial, communal or religious discord". No doubt was left that the authorities are empowered to deal firmly with anybody contravening this maxim.

Let his exhortation to report cases of discrimination work two ways. Human dignity is a right expected of and by all the communities. It would be the greatest disgrace to racial harmony of African, or any other, employees took this to be an invitation to "gang up" against employers who expect a fair return from labour for their hire.

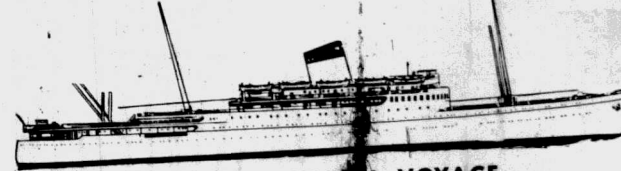

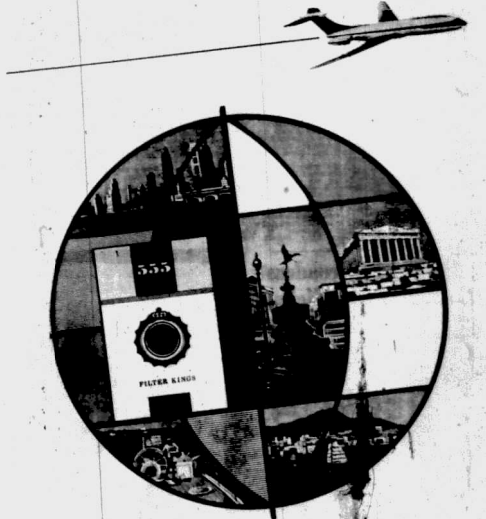

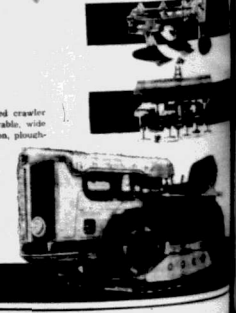

Pay As You Earn

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO EMPLOYERS

Employers who have a liability for tax under the Pay As You Earn system should be aware that the Income Tax (Amendment) Act, No. 18 of 1965, which came into effect on 1st August 1965, has amended the law relating to the operation of the Pay As You Earn system.

Under Section 11, employers who have deducted tax must make a return of the tax deducted to the Income Tax Department by the 15th day of the month following the month in which the tax was deducted.

Section 12 of the Act provides that employers who fail to comply with the provisions of the Act shall be liable to a fine of up to KSh. 500 and to imprisonment for up to three months.

Demand for action against Rhodesia

SIERRA LEONE yesterday joined Zambia in threatening to leave the Commonwealth if Britain does not speedily settle the Rhodesian independence problem.

The Prime Minister of Sierra Leone, Sir Albert Margai, told a Press conference in London that there was "quite a possibility" his country would leave the Commonwealth unless satisfactory promises of action to end the Smith regime were given at the Commonwealth leaders' conference starting on Tuesday.

The previous day President Kaunda of Zambia, who is personally boycotting the conference, reiterated past warnings that Zambia might quit the Commonwealth over the Rhodesian issue.

In Nairobi yesterday the Zambian Vice-President, Mr. Bouben Kamukama said that while in London he met Sir Albert and delivered to him a message from President Kaunda. Mr. Kamukama was staying in Nairobi for 24 hours on his way home from Polokwane and Denmark.

'Force is best way'

Mr. Kamukama said he would be asking the United Nations to take action if the Rhodesians refused to accept the terms of the Smith regime.

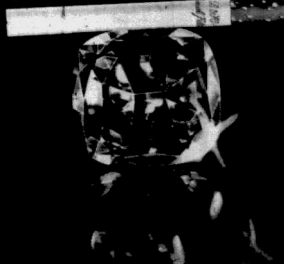

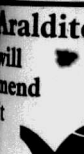

Africans must be given a part in new industries

It is vital for any foreign investor in Kenya with a definite interest in the stable economic future of the country to understand the need for his active participation in the industrial and commercial life of the country. Mr. Barrage Wanjau, General Manager of the Industrial and Commercial Development Corporation, Mr. Wanjau told the United Kenya Club in Nairobi yesterday.

MANAGER OF TOURIST BODY APPOINTED

Mr. Wanjau said Government policy was not to nationalize industries or to use its limited resources to buy shares in existing industries and sell them to Africans. The most effective way of getting the Africans into the industrial economy was by enabling him to participate in the new ventures established jointly by foreign investors, the corporation and Africans.

Mr. Wanjau said the corporation looked for foreign investors and local major industrialists and persuaded them to form joint ventures with Africans and the corporation. This was often very difficult and delayed implementation of several projects that could be started immediately if management and technical talents were available from African sponsors.

The corporation was established in 1964 under the Industrial Development Act and signed its memorandum of association in February, 1965.

NAME TO BE CHANGED

The Act gave the corporation the name "Industrial Development Corporation" but for better reference to its purpose and functions of the corporation legislation had been introduced to change the name to "Industrial and Commercial Development Corporation". He said that with the approval of the Minister for Commerce and Industry the new name had already been brought into use for some time.

The objects of the corporation were to facilitate the industrial and economic development of Kenya by the initiation, assistance or expansion of commercial and other undertakings or enterprises in the country.

Section 2 of the Industrial and Commercial Development Corporation Act states that the corporation shall be empowered to assist in the development of Kenya by the initiation, assistance or expansion of commercial and other undertakings or enterprises in the country.

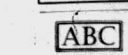

Air chief's warning to African States

Chief of the Royal Rhodesian Air Force, Air Vice-Marshal Harold Hawkins, yesterday warned African States that Rhodesia could go offensive if she was about to be attacked.

In a broadcast interview, Air Vice-Marshal Hawkins said that apart from what was available in South Africa, there was nothing to compare with the Royal Rhodesian Air Force this side of North Africa. They had the weapons and the bombs.

"If anyone attacks us... if we were certain that anyone was about to attack us, then we reserve the right to defend ourselves... by using our offensive force." However, he emphasized that Rhodesia had no aggressive intention against anyone.

The Royal Rhodesian Air Force could assist the army and other security forces in repelling a fairly large land-based assault against Rhodesia. If he could use one of the three squadrons which Rhodesia could not meet, Air Vice-Marshal Hawkins retorted: "No, I just hope that no one is misguided enough to pose one."

Incidents expected

In another broadcast interview yesterday Rhodesia's Minister of Law and Order, Mr. Larbert-Butler, said there might be one or two incidents in Rhodesia when the Commonwealth Prime Ministers' conference began in London next week. However, he did not think they would be serious.

He said that whenever an important event such as the conference took place outside Rhodesia, misguided individuals they should create some scenes in Rhodesia to bring the country into disrepute in the eyes of the world.

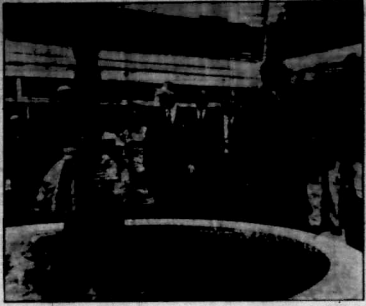

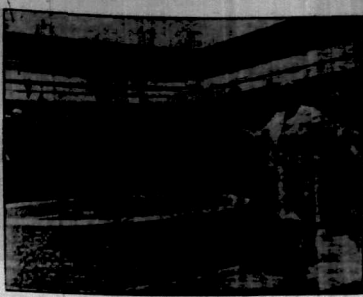

Kenya had a tremendous opportunity to become the "food basket" of the continent, the head of the planning division of the Ministry of Agriculture, Prof. S. Sinclair, said yesterday when he opened a two-day Agricultural Show.

"You have the potential for the production of large quantities of very high quality products including coffee, tea, pyrethrum, rice, wheat and maize," he told the farmers in the main arena, which was flooded by more than an inch of rain which had fallen only a few minutes before the opening ceremony.

The show was highly commensurate to its exhibits and the good turnout of farmers despite the bad weather. Prof. Sinclair said that by providing substantial capital Kenya's agriculture over the next five years should be producing what was making every effort to increase farm production.

The investment would not only be in land settlement, land improvement and the provision of the materials, but would also include facilities to teach Kenyan better farming.

Speaking optimistically about grain production and commercialization, Prof. Sinclair said Kenya could become one of the first developed nations to contribute towards the food needs of other countries. The success of the Kileleshwa show was evidence of working in the true spirit of hard work.

Commending the farmers in Western Kenya for the high quality of their animals and crops, the professor said that during the short time that he had been in the country he had seen a high standard of agricultural production.

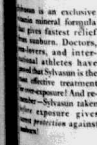

ZAMBIA EXPECTED TO FORCE DEBATE

Commonwealth heads arrive for talks

COMMONWEALTH leaders converged on London over the weekend for what has been described as the most crucial Commonwealth meeting to date. It is expected that when it opens tomorrow African, particularly Zambia, will try to force an immediate debate on Rhodesia.

Kenya's Vice-President, Mr. Murumbi, left Nairobi for the conference yesterday with "certain proposals" for Rhodesia, but he said he hoped the conference would also discuss the "aggressive tendencies" of the South African Government, which he said was threatening the neighbouring countries of Botswana and Bechuanaland.

Another East African leader to leave for London yesterday was Uganda's President, Mr. Obote, who promised strong words on Rhodesia but said he would sound such dramatic gestures as a walk-out. Uganda wanted to make sure that United Nations action was kept in mind as a feasible alternative for dealing with Rhodesia.

Compromise move fails

In London, what was seen as a last-minute attempt by the British Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, to reach some compromise with the delegates from Zambia and Sierra Leone — both of whom have threatened to walk out of the delegations — failed when the leaders of the delegations refused an invitation to spend the weekend at his country home, Chippingwood.

The Zambian Foreign Minister, Mr. Kapwepwe, said he had accepted the invitation would have smacked of hypocrisy, as members generally appear unwilling for any sort of pre-conference discussions but will prefer to go straight into the attack tomorrow without revealing their tactics beforehand.

Whether the conference will open with the Rhodesian issue remains to be seen. The 22 delegates of the Commonwealth Heads of State Government will meet to discuss the Rhodesian issue at the end of the week.

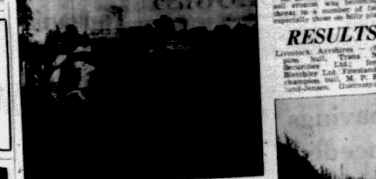

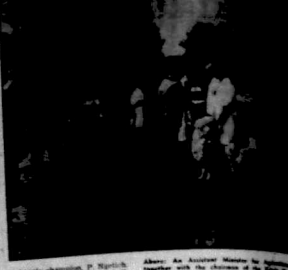
