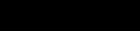

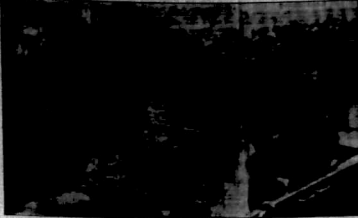

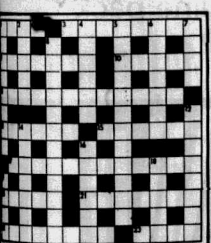

He was stabbed to death two days after his 65th birthday by a man believed to be of Greek descent who was employed as a Parliamentary messenger, named as Dimitri Stefanides by the South African Broadcasting Corporation.

M.P.s grappled with the Prime Minister's assault on the floor of the Debating Chamber and he was arrested soon after the attack.

As Prime Minister, he was Leader of the South African Republic and chief proponent of the policy of racial separation, the issue on which he took his country out of the Commonwealth. He survived a previous attempt on his life in 1966, when two bullets were fired into his head from close range.

Dressed as messenger
Dr. Verwoerd was fatally stabbed three times in the heart soon after taking his seat in the Debating Chamber while the bells were ringing to start the session debating the Prime Minister's vote. He was approached by a man dressed in a black and green uniform of a Parliamentary messenger. Though the man's duties do not normally take him into the Debating Chamber, nobody suspected his motive and he was allowed to approach the Prime Minister.

As though expecting the messenger to speak to him, Dr. Verwoerd turned towards him. He was then stabbed three times in the chest with a revolver. The assassin fled through a door in the Chamber and was arrested by police shortly afterwards.

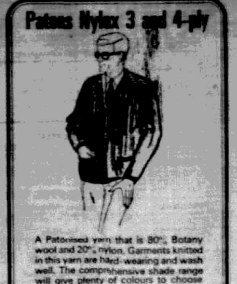

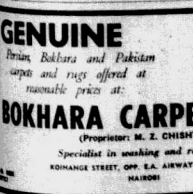

Party undeterred by assassination

After the assassination of Dr. Verwoerd, the Parliamentary group of South Africa's ruling National Party declared yesterday its determination to continue the course set by the country's dead leader.

The party's 163 Members of Parliament and Senators expressed "deep horror at the dastardly assassination" and deep appreciation of "valuable services" Dr. Verwoerd had rendered South Africa. They did not discuss the thorny question of a successor to Dr. Verwoerd. It was also announced that there will be a State funeral for Dr. Verwoerd in Pretoria on Saturday.

Police in Johannesburg rounded extra patrols in African townships around the city after the assassination, a precautionary measure, but had no reports of violence or anything unusual. The Justice Minister, Mr. John Vorster, said that present information indicated that the assassination was the work of an individual.

Mr. Vorster said in a Press statement that all charges would be minor, were being followed up and the law would take its relentless course. He warned people not to attach exaggerated importance to rumours.

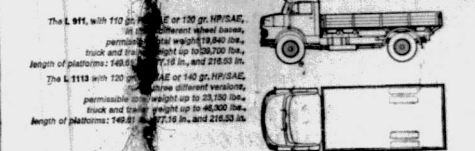

POLITICAL VENGEANCE

ALL OVER THE WORLD people will want to scribble a motive and assess the consequences after the first shock of horror at the circumstances of Dr. Verwoerd's assassination has passed.

Whether they support or oppose apartheid, most people are bound to see an immediate evolution, because murder produces no enduring solution and, an history proves, generally causes a more rapid and unexpected reaction is contained in a summary of reasonable evidence. Apartheid has been the subject of continuous and hostile debate in the U.N. since 1962, during previous conferences to turn the South African Government to a course condemned as abhorrent by virtually every country in the world. But the general feeling was "let Dr. Verwoerd be carefully detained by many U.N. delegates for apartheid, few drew any satisfaction from his violent death".

One of the basic reasons for abhorring his policy is the very violence of the methods of apartheid. Yet Dr. Verwoerd had an abiding belief in the righteousness of his policy that blinded him to the structure of a frightened people. He was so fanatical, according to the Canadian Prime Minister, Lester B. Pearson, that he regarded the failure of the attempted assassination in 1960 as an act of divine provocation. Could anybody be more misguided?

But he was considered moderate judged by the standards of many of his colleagues and advisers. He is also realistic enough to comment that Mr. Smith's assurance of independence in Rhodesia brought the inevitable crisis ten years nearer for South Africa.

His assassination is another shocking illustration of the resort to violence which has become a characteristic of the contemporary world, reaching out from sheer crime to political vengeance. 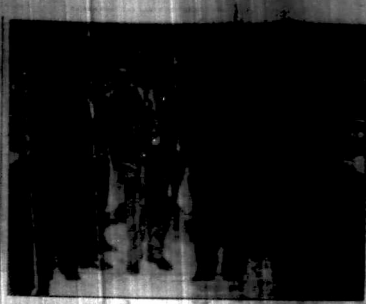

Two assessors in the murder case against William Kinsey, the former Cango prosecutor who denied killing his wife, yesterday considered the death as the result of an accident which Kinsey had committed and that he was not guilty.

The assessors are a soil conservation expert, Mr. Carl Bagley, and a Fisheries economist, Mr. Fred Macdonald.
