

East Africa... DEFEAT FOR N.F.D.

But delegates differ on the results

CONFLICTING opinions on the East African "summit" meeting in Addis Ababa next week will be finding a backbone in the Northern Frontier District problem were expressed in Nairobi yesterday by delegates on their way to Ethiopia.

Tanganyika's Minister for External Affairs, Mr. Kamboja, said he was going to the conference without a prejudicial mind on the N.F.D. "We will try to find a solution which is for the betterment of Africa." He was a "good sign" that Somalia and Ethiopia would be meeting at the conference.

On the other hand Uganda's Minister for Foreign Affairs, Mr. Mager, said: "This is a responsibility for Britain," adding that he had not been asked by any party in Kenya to raise the issue.

Kenya to raise question

Kenya's Divisional Commissioner, who is to be led by Xani's vice-president, M. A. O. Dering, intends to raise the question of the N.F.D., according to the executive officer of the Northern Frontier Association, Mr. O. A. Ataru. He said he had discussed with the Kenyan Governor, Mr. Kenyatta, how the latter should present their case to the conference. Xani had promised full support.

The M.P.U.A. is sending eight observers, including a memorandum accusing Somalia of being responsible for the N.F.D. trouble. Secret plans worked out by Somalia to help accessions would be divulged to the conference, which would be asked to judge who was right, Mr. Ataru said.

There was a minister

There was a minister from Africa at the summit meeting in London yesterday when Ministers of African countries met to discuss the N.F.D. problem.

The Ministers from Tanganyika, Kenya, and the Congo were attending the meeting which will draw up an agreement to meet the conference in Addis Ababa next week.

Mr. Mager said every delegate from Kenya, Uganda, and Ethiopia will be invited to the conference. He said that the four countries plan to have a common front.

Mr. Kamboja said the main theme of the conference must be peace. Only through this can the N.F.D. problem be solved.

THE U.S. Attorney-General Robert Kennedy said yesterday that the colour bar exists in Birmingham, Alabama, and "extremely" in Oklahoma and Texas. However, that a racial trend agreed by Negro and white leaders there last week would continue in spite of the weekend bombings and riots.

President Kennedy has ordered Federal troops to the scene because of his "deep concern" over the threat of a race riot in Birmingham. The Attorney-General said the President acted because of "responsibility under the law and the Constitution."

The riot-torn areas seem more peaceful today than they were yesterday, but Birmingham was quiet and calm. The riots were reported to have been caused by a group of about 100 Negroes who were burning a white man's house. The riot was broken up by a group of about 100 white men who were armed with clubs and rocks.

Sir Eric appeals for peaceful election

Kenya's nine-day General Elections begin today with polling for Members of six of the new Regional Assemblies. The elections are being boycotted in the north-eastern regions.

Voting for the Assemblies continues tomorrow. The Senate elections are due to take place on Tuesday and Wednesday and those for the House of Representatives next Saturday and Sunday. Final results are expected to be announced on Monday, May 27.

On the eve of the poll the Acting Governor, Sir Eric Griffith-Jones issued a statement appealing to leaders and members of all parties, independent candidates and the public to ensure that the election is peaceful and orderly.

"This is the most important election in Kenya's history," he added. "Let it be a true and honest expression of the will of the people and let it not be marred by any disorder." Leaders of three main parties have also appealed for calm.

In all, 222 candidates will contest 222 Regional Assembly seats this weekend. Another 38 constituencies have returned candidates proposed — including 28 Kenyan and 10 East African — but none have been put forward for the nine double-member constituencies in the North-Eastern Region and for most of the seats in the Mandari and Isioya Districts of Eastern Kenya.

Keen contests in West Apart from the Northern Frontier District, the quietest parts of the country should be Nairobi, which has no regional assembly, and the Kiliku area. In the latter, 19 of the 30 constituencies have returned candidates, 18 of whom are only 22 candidates are contesting the remaining 11 seats.

Actively will be keenest interest in the new Western Region, in which 89 candidates are contesting 27 seats and no one has been returned unopposed. Eight constituencies have returned candidates but only 22 candidates are contesting the remaining 54 seats.

Summit's first task

Leaders' summit conference in Addis Ababa opened yesterday with a call from Emperor Haile Selassie in support of African people 'till dominated by foreign exploitation'

As we said, we name as our first great task the final liberation of Africa, still dominated by foreign exploitation and control. We call for the Rhodesias, in Mozambique and South Africa, to withdraw from the support and help of the African leaders.

Leaders of 11 independent African States met yesterday at the summit conference in Addis Ababa to discuss the single African Charter before the conference of Saturday. Foreign Ministers who prepared the summit meeting have recommended that the Charter be adopted if they should pass the work of drawing up such a charter to a committee of experts.

Calling for what observers regarded as a reversal of the decision of the Foreign Ministers to postpone drawing up such a charter, the Emperor said "Let us not put off to later consideration and study the single African Charter which must emerge from this gathering if it is to have real meaning. This conference cannot close without adopting a single African Charter." This biggest and most important meeting of leaders of independent African States began more than half a century ago at a tropical restaurant near the top of the circular conference table. Presidents and Prime Ministers ranged themselves around the centrally placed table facing the diminutive figure of the Ethiopian Emperor.

Common defence system

African states must act on the areas in which they agreed to exploit them to the fullest, said Haile Selassie in his speech lasting nearly an hour.

He also called for steps to establish an African defence system, permanent arrangements to assist in the peaceful settlement of disagreements between African countries, and for Africa to be a continental zone, and for a programme of progressive world disarmament and arms and nuclear tests.

GREETINGS FROM U.S. AND RUSSIA

PRESIDENT Kennedy and Mrs. Krushchev were among the leaders who sent greetings for the African summit conference opening in Addis Ababa.

The President hailed Africa's "historic independence and the part of man's history" in the human dignity and progress.
