Mr. Obote and Dr. Nyerere for Nairobi

LEADERS of the three East African territories agreed yesterday to meet in Nairobi tomorrow for talks, the nature of which has not been disclosed.

The Kenya Minister for Justice and Constitutional Affairs, Mr. Mboya, called journalists together at Nairobi Airport yesterday morning while they and members of the newly formed Kenya Government were waiting for the arrival of President Sekou Touré.

He said arrangements for Wednesday's "important meeting" had been completed by telephone.

President Nyerere of Tanganyika and the Uganda Prime Minister, Mr. Oboto, had agreed to come to Nairobi, where they would have talks with Mr. Kenyatta in the Prime Minister's conference room, beginning at 11 a.m.

Although emphasizing that it was "an important East African meeting," Mr. Mboya would not elaborate on the topics, the three leaders are to discuss, and asked when asked if federation would be on the agenda.

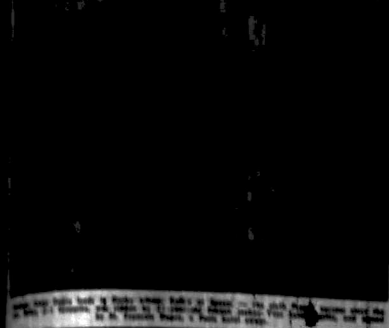

SPREAD-OVER BUDGETS EASE TAX RISES

Tanganyika sisal duty only shock

TAXPAYERS who had been expecting the danger into these budgets were pleasantly surprised yesterday when Budgets presented by the Finance Ministers of the East African territories, Uganda and Tanganyika, showed that individual income tax, beer, wine and spirits, cigarettes and tobacco and petrol were unaffected.

The biggest single revenue increase throughout East Africa was a new export duty on sisal in Tanganyika, announced by the Finance Minister, Mr. Bomanji, in Dar es Salaam. This will raise £2,500,000. Mr. Bomanji explained that it would be used for a major development programme.

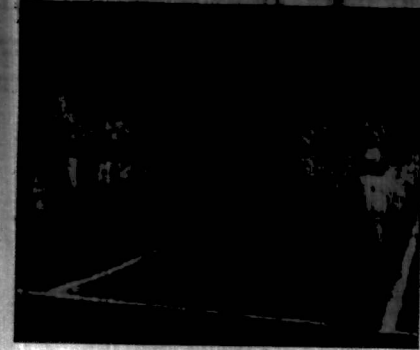

Crowds waited hours for great moment

CROWDS started to gather outside Parliament Buildings in Nairobi early yesterday to watch the pageantry which preceded yesterday afternoon's formal opening of the National Assembly.

The ceremony started with the arrival of the Governor, Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, dressed in the dark-blue uniform and plumed hat of a noble governor, who was greeted by a guard of honour mounted by the G.A.R.

At the entrance to the building he was greeted by the Prime Minister, Mr. Kenyan, and then escorted to the Chamber of the House of Representatives by its Speaker, Mr. MacDonald and the Clerk of the Senate, Mr. Chakwe, whose new robes, richly decorated with gold, made a striking contrast to the more sombre dress of the others in the procession.

Two new swords

Another splash of colour was provided by the Ministry's judges in their scarlet and grey robes who entered the Chamber shortly before the Governor.

The Governor and his A.D.C. were escorted at grandiose intervals to the chamber in the House. Normally the only man to carry a sword is the Sergeant-at-Arms, Mr. M. G. Elliot, who, by tradition, carries it to greet the Speaker.

A number of Ministers donned special robes for the occasion. Contention among them over the Parliamentary Secretary for Commerce and Industry, Mr. Kenyan, wanting a scarlet and gold robe and a sword and hat.

Skin cloaks

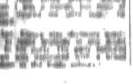

He will visit detainees arrested for six months in connection with the Franco-Algerian war. The International Red Cross has set up a special mission in Algeria to deal with the problem of the detainees and missing.

Opposition ended to Malaysia merger

THE Indonesian, Malaysian and Philippine Foreign Ministers yesterday announced complete agreement on problems arising out of the merger.

A communique issued after four days of talks in Manila said the three Ministers agreed to accept the idea of a confederation "as a means of bringing together their countries into the closest association."

They agreed to recommend to their legislatures that machinery be set up for regular consultations at all levels on problems of common interest, and to coordinate social and economic development.

They also agreed that Malaysia, Indonesia and the Philippines shared a joint responsibility for maintaining peace and stability and for the development of the area from subversion and terrorism.

It is understood that the Philippines had proposed to hold a conference under the auspices of the United Nations and a neutral agency to determine the will of the people of Singapore, Malaya, Sarawak and North Borneo before joining Malaysia.

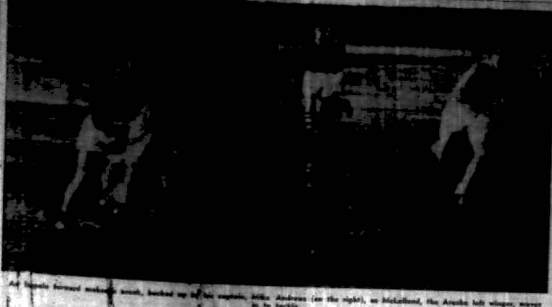

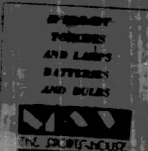
