Economic gloom in Kenya over, says Dr. Kiano

After days of economic gloom in Kenya are over, the reign of the prospects in the country and zest for progress is now the spirit which characterises the Minister for Commerce, Dr. Kiano, said in Nairobi yesterday.

The Minister, who was opening a new business in the city, the Electronics Radio Corporation, owned and managed by the Electronics Radio Institute, added that he was kept busy by prospective investors seeking guidance or licences or protection for new industries. He could say with confidence that Kenya was at the beginning of a new era.

Money transferred overseas during the unhappy months of depression had begun to come back and there would be even more after independence.

WAITED TO SEE THE DAWN

Owners of foreign investment funds had waited for the dawn of the new Kenya and could also, Kenya's stability and fair play.

Banking institutions could help tremendously in brightening the coming era of prosperity by expanding credit facilities and lowering interest rates.

Creating wealth for the masses is the main objective of the Government. It is not sufficient to have a few rich men, but to have a large middle class and a vast number of people who are just getting started.

It is the Government's policy to encourage the growth of small and medium-sized enterprises. This will create jobs and provide a steady stream of income for the masses.

The Minister stressed that the Government is committed to the principle of non-alignment. Kenya will remain friendly to all nations and will not allow itself to be drawn into any bloc.

Dr. Kiano concluded his remarks by saying that he was confident that the new Kenya would be a land of peace, stability and progress.

Report suggests ways to end labour unrest

INDUSTRIAL relations between Manufacturer and a registered trade union must be resumed without delay, the Board of Inquiry appointed to inquire into labour unrest at the mine says in its report published yesterday.

The board, the chairman of which was the Rev. A. C. Hake, was set up in February because of labour trouble which led to a strike at the mine in late December and January. It suggests that there seems no good reason why the Kenya Quarry and Mineworkers' Union should not continue to represent employees because the mining industry is not large enough to sustain a viable trade union on its own.

Mr. Hake said that the board believed that industrial relations were improved by a multiplicity of small unions. The need was rather for steps to raise the efficiency of the Board of Inquiry.

A meeting must be held between the two bodies to help in the process of reaching an agreement. Meanwhile, in order to pave the way for the meeting, there were positive steps that could be taken by both sides in a spirit of reconciliation and good-will.

The report suggests that the management of the mine could make gestures which probably would go a long way towards creating a climate of opinion in which the wounds of the past could be healed.

The report states that in its opinion the basic cause of labour unrest at the mine was not to be found in the failure of the management of the company to give adequate attention to what could be called "human factors".

On the other hand, it states that a more effectively organized union, with more opportunities for representation, would have contributed more constructively to the removal of the basic causes of unrest. The union's failure to adjust to the changes and to conform to the new conditions of the industry was a major factor.

Re-organization of union leaders would be a long way to make up for mistakes in the past and create the atmosphere of reconciliation which could be achieved. The industrial relations of the mine should be based on a new basis of trust.

NOTE FOR 165,000 ADULTS

Ballot paper is now set for the fourth election in Zanzibar on the basis of 165,000 people voting for the first time on the basis of the 1958 census. This number represents more than 50 per cent of the population of 300,000 at the 1958 census. There will be 2,000 more women than men voting.

Polling for the 31 constituencies will take place on four days, in Pemba today and Tuesday and in Zanzibar on Friday and Saturday. Ballot papers will be counted on the morning of July 15, the elections have been planned in the interests of security, bearing in mind the riots which accompanied the last elections in June, 1961.

The normal police garrison of 150 on Pemba has, for the period of polling, been reinforced by a further 250 policemen, together with almost the whole of the 2nd, 3rd and 4th battalions, with scout cars, spotter planes and helicopters.

CONTROL OF MOVEMENT

Movement between constituencies during polling will be strictly controlled by road blocks, while police and armed patrols will disperse any assembly in constituencies where voting is taking place.

No motor-vehicles are allowed within 500 yards of polling stations, which will be ringed by barbed wire. Newspaper reporters and photographers will not be allowed in the constituencies until after the close of the polls.

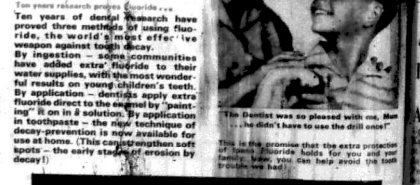

PROGRESS for Kenya would more than double the pace of economic growth and deal a fatal blow to unemployment, the Minister for Commerce and Industry, Dr. Kiwako, predicted yesterday.

NEW AFRICAN STATES call for U.N. action

TANGANYIKA, Uganda and 30 other African States yesterday warned the United Nations that South Africa's apartheid policy and the situation in Portugal's African territories threatened intrusional peace and should be dealt with by the Security Council "as early as possible".

SIR ROY CLOSES KENYA A MISSION
On apartheid, they asked that the council should take necessary action to find a solution, "due to the systematic refusal of the South African Government to comply with resolutions of the General Assembly and the Council."

The African states also appealed to the Government which had diplomatic assistance and relations with South Africa to break off those relations and to cross any other form of encouragement to the policy of apartheid.

Against their expulsion
They said that in some of the Portuguese territories there was a state of war constituting a "definite breach of peace and security in the African continent as well as a threat to international peace and security."

This month's president of the Security Council, Mr. Ahmad Benhima, of Morocco, began consultations yesterday with the other members about a draft for a meeting before Thursday. Two leading members, France, Dean of Britain, and Mr. Stevenson, of the United States, are both opposed.

A U.S. spokesman at the U.N. in New York last night indicated that his delegation would cast a negative vote which "would block the adoption of any security Council resolutions imposing sanctions against South Africa, and against, or recommending their expulsion from the world body."

ARREST OF MOZAMBIQUE LEADER DENIED BY BOTH FACTIONS

A MYSTERY report of the arrest in Mozambique of the exiled Liberation Front leader, Dr. Eduardo Mondlane, was denied last night by his party officials in Dar es Salaam and by the Portuguese authorities in Lourenço Marques, the Mozambique capital.

Dr. Mondlane was known to have been in Mozambique for some time. He was reported to have been arrested by a Portuguese official in Dar es Salaam. One official said: "I was with him this morning."

The report, alleged by some from the Mozambique Liberation Front, was denied by the Portuguese authorities in Lourenço Marques and the southern district of Mozambique.

Later today it was announced that the Government spokesman in Lourenço Marques denied the report of arrest, and this was backed up by a denial from the Mozambique office of the United Nations.

Dr. Mondlane, a 42-year-old Mozambique native, was arrested in 1962 and took up the post of chief of the Mozambique Liberation Front, which was elected in Dar es Salaam in June 1962.

Army royal visit to London ends on a quiet note

KING PAUL and Queen Frederika of the Hellenes left London for home yesterday after the most turbulent Royal visit to Britain for many years.

The Greek Royal couple had a quiet send-off in contrast to the demonstrations which marked their three-day detention of Left-wing political prisoners in Greece. Once the demonstrators even booed Queen Elizabeth in an unprecedented incident in modern British history.

This happened when the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh went to a London airport to see off the King and Queen.

More than 1,000 demonstrators jeered and screamed abuse at the Royal couple when they arrived. There were more boos when the King and Queen Elizabeth left the theatre area to return to Buckingham Palace instead of attending a Government reception.

200 arrests

Before the Royal visitors left yesterday, more than 200 MPs of all parties had signed a Motion expressing their good will to King Paul and Queen Frederika.

The motion, urged the House of Commons to commend the Hellenes from the "irresponsible and unbecoming reception" which they had met in London.
