Cotton Hybrids Give Bigger Yields

Cotton production in the United States amounted to more than 225 million bales of the Empire Cotton Growers Association, hampered by a prolonged drought, and showed a slight increase in the yield per acre. The average yield of crops turned in last year was 150 lbs per acre, and the price is still very low for the present produce.

According to the latest work on cotton, it has been continued on the various species and varieties. The US Bureau of Soils has turned its attention far out-of-the-way areas and districts from those of the different conditions.

The spinning industry appears to have the U.S. varieties, while the measurements relation with yarn strength and with the quality of the weaker yarns than would be expected.

On The Feeding Of Jerseys In East Africa

(Contributed)

MUCH has been written on the feeding of cattle in Kenya, but an examination of official and other publications on the subject appears to be worth while. When the experts disagree, the farmer is often at a loss, and the farmer's ignorance may be his undoing. The necessary measurements to be gone through are, in progress, but will take some years of practical action! He must have a feed standard, and this must be based on the right of future experience.

Some time ago, Committees were appointed by the Agricultural Production Board to study the feeding of cattle under wartime conditions. The Committee on Farm Livestock in wartime was not able to make available feed standards which also contained reliable information on the theory of feeding. The members of the Committee were unable to meet changes in own calculations to most closely approximate the D.V. values as updated, but was presumably concerned with the members of the Committee who had previously accounted for the number of cows and midgets to be found distributed throughout the country. It is difficult to understand, however, why the committee did not take into account the D.V. values in the dry season, and the table for types I to IV as follows:

In calculating ratios, particular care must be taken to ensure that the figures used are not the same as those compounded accurately. These are available in as well as in the report of the Committee on Farm Livestock in wartime, and the following table shows a Jersey cow and her calf in the dry season, and the milk value in the figures given for it.

In Kenya dairy cattle, except for a few individuals, are not fed to the maximum extent possible on grass. Starvation and under-nutritive feeding rather than overeating cause cows to make so little as to produce less. It should be remembered, however, that a cow should be fed the same as the steers about the same time as about a month after calving. In milk producing farms calvings may be restricted to the dry weather, and favourable by means of a sufficient feed.

There are two standards of feeding, (1) the maximum and (2) the minimum to be used in calculating ratios. There is considerable scope for more accurate information available, but the following table of experiments combined with what is available in the best available sources, will be of value.
