## CUT IN INCOME TAX ALLOWANCES

### Pay as you earn may come 'very soon'

PAYMENT tax allowances are to be reduced throughout East Africa. Some of the proposed changes will apply to 1964 income and will bring in an additional annual revenue of £250,000 in Kenya and £100,000 in Uganda. Others will affect 1965 income. Legislation is to be introduced soon.

Similar changes were announced in Dar es Salaam and Kampala. Tanzania's Finance as you earn system also disclosed that the 'pay as you earn' system of income tax deduction is to be introduced in Tanzania in July next year. In Nairobi, the Minister for Economic Planning, Mr. Mboya, referred to the eventual introduction of PAYE without giving a date. Speaking at Acting Minister for Finance, Mr. Mboya said a P.V.E conference had been proposed to reduce the married allowance from £700 to £400 and single persons such as widows or widowers with dependent children from £450 to £300 and single persons engaged are to apply throughout East Africa. Mr. Mboya gave notice that the Government had decided that certain further changes to allowances which would affect the 1965 year of income.

**Passage allowance to go**

"It is thought to be wrong to reward circumstances," he said, "to grant relief for the cost of passages taken by a taxpayer for journeys abroad by himself or his family for health, recreation, or for his children for the purpose of education."

**PAYMENTS FOR 1965 COULD BE WAIVED**

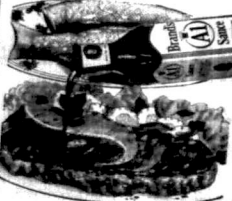

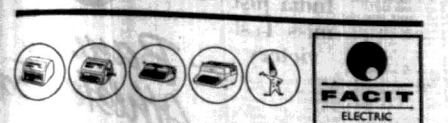

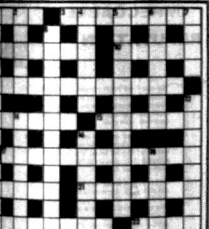
