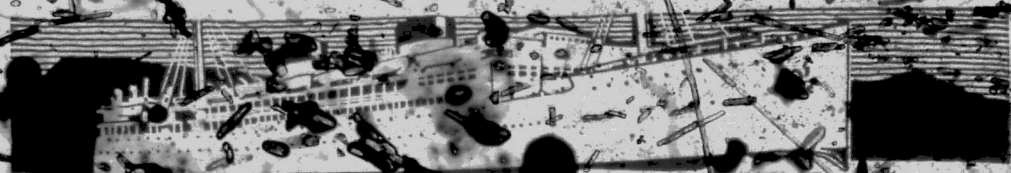

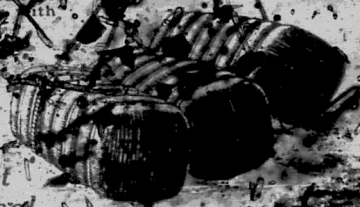

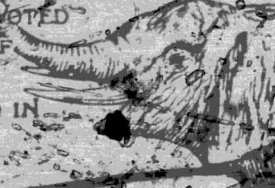

The Kisumu-Nairobi-Tanganyika Railway steamer is again to call at Malindi, the Northern Rhodesian port, only once monthly, instead of fortnightly.

The Kenya Coast lawn tennis championships, a new sporting event, opened in Mombasa on August 27. It was to take place on five local sports grounds.

Approximate gross receipts of all sections of Rhodesia Railways for the month ended 28th August, 1931, as compared with the same month of the corresponding month of last year.

The possibility and advisability of collecting revenue on the sale of liquor on board ships while in Kilindini Harbour has been discussed in the Legislative Council of Kenya.

The Customs Conference between Southern Rhodesia and South Africa, held on 17th September 1931, has been postponed until October 15 owing to the death of Mr. Jobling, the former Minister for Agriculture in Southern Rhodesia.

In the first five months of this year Tanganyika exported domestic produce valued at £882,030, as against £771,109 in the same period in 1930. Imports were £844,238, as against £680,705, and the Customs duty collected £27,425, as against £166,127.

Under the new Zanzibar Cacao Growers Association Scheme a levy of seven annas per cask will be imposed on all boxes produced in and exported from the Protectorate as from October 1st. The levy on those exporters' licences for the period from October 1st to the end of the year will be £2,250.

A Nairobi Franchise Association has been formed with Mr. H. E. May as its first chairman, and Messrs. A. E. Radwell, O. B. Pringle, H. Miles, J. E. Lloyd, E. F. Stephens and W. H. Thwaites as its first directors. The Chairman is Mr. H. E. May and the General Secretary and Mr. A. E. Radwell is the Treasurer.

The Hon. Mr. J. H. Wilson, Acting Member for the Coast constituency of Kenya, drawing attention to the fact that it is the duty of the Government to provide, particularly in regard to roads and communications, declared that at a total road vote of £1,000,000 the Government had allocated the total amount. The Acting Director of Public Works said that the Colony's total vote was £2,750,000.
