1. MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I am pleased to present the annual report for the College of Health Sciences covering the period 2012.

The report captures the events of the mentioned period including learning and research activities, physical infrastructure development, staff development, finances, publications by staff and students, conferences, consultancies, outreach programmes, collaborations and links established.

The College's extensive curricular continued to attract students from around the country and across the globe to immerse themselves in a vast array of medical subjects, gaining essential knowledge and practical experience through an ever-growing collection of experiential learning opportunities. During the period, 1212 new students were admitted into our various programs and around 672 healthcare professionals in the fields of medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, nursing and biomedical sciences graduated. During the period, the College organized a colourful graduation ceremony for the first 12 graduates of the University of Nairobi HIV Fellowship. The fellowship program's aim is to mold future leaders for the Kenya HIV response in the three areas of management, Health Economics and Health Informatics.

Through Prime-K project, the College continued to extend the reach of medical education outside Nairobi by developing decentralized clinical experiences. This was achieved by training and accrediting local medical doctors and specialists in identified provincial and district hospitals; to be directly responsible for our students sent to decentralized sites for rotations.

The College's rich intellectual life was also evident in the faculty's scholarship and engagements which resulted in 297 research publications and 270 staff attending scientific conferences and other academic fora. Our research portfolio was over Kenya shillings one billion with activities spanning from basic to applied and operational research with strong platforms for clinical trials, traditional medicine, quality assurance of medicines, vaccine developments and Tropical and Infectious diseases.

The College maintained extensive collaborations with national and international institutions and organisations. It had also numerous collaborations and linkages with Universities within Africa, North America, Europe, Middle East, Continental Asia, and Australia.

I am happy to report that during the period 2011/2012, the College organized four Scientific/Academic conferences where participants shared experiences as part of continued effort towards academic excellence, research results dissemination and networking.

On infrastructure, the College acquired state of the art teaching and research facilities among them Nairobi Surgical Skills Centre, Multipurpose Skills laboratory and Telemedicine and telepathology studios. During the same period, our Vice-Chancellor presided over the ground breaking ceremony for the New School of Pharmacy Building.

As part of our Community outreach, the College in partnership with Starkey Foundation, USA, provided more than 20,000 hearing aids to those with impaired hearing in the region. The MARPS program through ten sites (Dices) spread across Central and Eastern regions, contributed to significant reduction of HIV transmission among most at risk populations. Our Staff continued to offer specialized services at Kenyatta National Hospital, Mathari Hospital,

as well as at the University of Nairobi Dental Hospital. Other services to the community include outreach programmes and medical camps held throughout the Republic of Kenya.

The College is committed to offer unparalleled customer-centered service through exemplary training, research and community outreach programmes to meet the needs and aspirations of our stakeholders.

I invite you to read the report and provide feedback on the issues covered to enable us improve on service delivery.

2. INTRODUCTION

The College of Health Sciences of the University of Nairobi is the leading tertiary healthcare training centre in Kenya. The College was created in 1985 and had its origin in the Faculty of Medicine which was established in 1967. It currently comprises of five Schools, namely the Schools of: Medicine (1967), Pharmacy (1995), Dental Sciences (1995), Nursing Sciences (2004) and Public Health (2010); and one institute, University of Nairobi Institute of Tropical and Infectious Diseases (UNITID) (2003) and the Centre for HIV Prevention and Research (CHIVPR) (2006).

The College has 21 teaching departments and 11 thematic units. The College also has state of the art teaching and research facilities including the Nairobi Surgical Skills Centre and Multipurpose Skills laboratory.

The College operates with its vision as an international centre of choice for training of high caliber healthcare professionals for innovative research and provision of quality healthcare in a safe environment.

The University of Nairobi Institute of Tropical and Infectious disease, (UNITID) is the third facility of its kind in Africa that undertakes research and training geared towards management and control of infectious diseases. It had an ultramodern Level 3 Laboratory supporting research into emerging and re-emerging pathogens especially the viral haemorrhagic fevers. The Kenya Aids Vaccine Initiative (KAVI), currently hosts one of the only three vaccine research laboratories in Africa and is the first site for phase 1 and 2 HIV and AIDS vaccine trials in Africa.

Staff at the College offer specialised services at Kenyatta National Hospital, Mathari Hospital, as well as at the University of Nairobi Dental Hospital. College staff also provide exemplary service to community through outreach programmes and medical camps held throughout the Republic of Kenya.

The governance of the College comprises of College Management Board, College Academic Board, School Boards down to individual departments. The above organs incorporate students and other stakeholders as per statutes.

14.15. FACILITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE FOR LEARNING

Clinical teaching was conducted at the following facilities:

1. Kenyatta National Teaching and Referral Hospital which had a ward capacity of 2000 beds, clinics, operating theatres, laboratories pharmacies, accident and emergencies.
2. Pumwani Maternity with a ward capacity of 350 beds,
3. Mathari Hospital, Nairobi with a ward capacity of 700 beds.
4. Mbagathi District Hospital with a ward capacity of 200 beds.
5. Community outreach and decentralised training takes place in Mombasa, Garissa, Kisii, Karatina, Busia, Kajiado, Mwingi, Kitui, Kiambu, Muranga, Thika, Nyeri, Meru, Machakos, Embu, Kirinyaga, Naivasha, Bomet, Makueni and Sabatia.

University of Nairobi-College of Health Sciences

Facilities include teaching rooms/laboratories, outpatient clinics, operating theatres and other areas as shown in Tables 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9.

The library provided formal and informal opportunities for instruction through continuous user training, library guides, student orientation, library open days, and a physical and electronic help-desk.

- The library provides well planned and secure space for three hundred users which is adequate for college students in their clinical years of study. Those at pre-clinical level have direct and remote access to the Chiromo library.
- There are plans to extend library building by two floors, which will be used for expansion of e-resources in line with changing demand for e-based services.
- Besides the main College library, there are satellite libraries at the schools of Pharmacy and Dental Sciences
- The CHS library had 60,000 books in print format, 50,000 e-books and 3,000 e-journals.
- There are two computer laboratories equipped with 47 computers and internet connectivity, with 65 more computers which are in the process of being connected.
- The library had access to wireless internet connection for laptop use.

16.17. COMMUNITY OUTREACH

In conforming with our core value on Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), the College undertook community service such as medical camps and other community outreach programmes.

Community outreach had be enhanced by bilateral and multilateral collaboration at varying levels such as the Kibera Based Psychiatry and counselling clinic, students organized visits by the School of Nursing Sciences as well as preventive and curative services to the community. The College regularly supports medical camps and provides subsidized mortuary services to the community.

The College continues to enhance promotion of individual health and lifestyle by establishing clinics for HIV /AIDS prevention, treatment and referrals among most at risk populations (MARPS) in Central and Eastern Kenya as one of the contribution towards the realization of Vision 2030. There are currently ten Dices and constituent clinics spread in the two regions.

Programmes such as Medical Education Partnership Initiative (MEPI) work with rural health facilities to facilitate students training in resource limited settings. Through MEPI, the College engages other strategic partners such as AMREF to increase access to training by healthy workers in hard to reach areas.
