



Prof. Per Cramer

Per Cramer is full Professor of International Law and holds the Jean Monnet Chair in European Integration Law at Goteborg University. He was director of the Centre for European Research, CERGU 2005-2009 and is, since 2010, Dean for the School of Business, Economics and Law at the University of Gothenburg.

Professor Cramer is a member of the Board of the Swedish Institute for European Policy Research, SIEPS and the National Network for Research in European Law. Since 2012 he is a member of the EFMD Steering Committee.

His main areas of research concern the external identity of the European Union with a special focus on the relationship between the Common Foreign and Security Policy and the Common Commercial Policy of the EU. In the context of the Union's relations to non-member states Professor Cramer has initiated and conducted a number of research projects addressing legal aspects of the Union's external relations. Professor Cramer has furthermore written a number of articles on aspects of the constitutional development of the Union. All these projects have benefited greatly from the multidisciplinary platform created by CERGU. Together with associate professors Sara Stendahl and Thomas Erhag he has recently concluded a four-year joint research project analyzing the development of regulation for the handling nuclear waste and spent nuclear fuel in the EU.

Furthermore, Professor Cramer is collaborating with associate professor Daniel Naurin in a multidisciplinary research project starting 2009 on the effects of Member State interventions at the European Court of Justice.

Over the years, Professor Cramer has established an extensive international network for academic co-operation for research in European law that includes, the European University Institute, Florence; the Centre for European Legal; Studies at Cambridge University; the Centre for European Law at Tartu University; the Graduate Institute for International Studies, Geneva; the Liverpool Law School etc.
