Admission Requirements

- Holders of a Bachelor's degree, with a minimum of Upper Second Class Honours, or equivalent in environment, natural and social science related fields.
- Holders of Bachelor's degree, Lower Second Class, or equivalent in the areas specified in (a) above, plus a Postgraduate Diploma in a relevant field.
- Holders of Bachelors Degree, Lower Second Class, or equivalent in the areas specified above plus three years relevant experience.
- Holders of Bachelors Degree, Pass, in any of the areas specified above plus a Postgraduate Diploma in a relevant field, and two years relevant experience.
- Holders of Bachelors Degree, Pass, in the areas specified above plus five years relevant experience.

MASTER OF ARTS IN ENVIRONMENTAL LAW

Admission Requirements

- Holders of a Bachelors degree, Upper Second Class Honours, or equivalent in law, environment, physical, biological or natural resource management and/or social science related fields.
- Holders of Bachelors degree, Lower Second Class, or equivalent in the areas specified in (a) above, plus a Postgraduate Diploma in a relevant field or with two years relevant experience.

- Holders of Bachelors degree, Pass in the areas specified in (a) above plus a Postgraduate Diploma in a relevant field, and two years relevant experience.
- Holders of a Bachelors degree, pass in the areas specified in (a) above

PhD IN ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Admission requirements

The common regulations governing admission into taught PhD programmes in all Institutes, Faculties, Schools and Centres of the University of Nairobi shall apply.

The following shall be eligible for admission:

- A holder of a Master of Arts degree in Environmental Policy, Environmental Law or Environmental Diplomacy from the University of Nairobi or any other institution recognized by the Senate.
- A holder of a Masters Degree in law, environmental studies or biological, natural, physical or social sciences from the University of Nairobi or any other institution recognized by the Senate.
- A holder of a doctoral degree from any institution recognized by the Senate.
- Other qualifications that may be considered acceptable to the Senate as equivalent to a Masters degree in relevant fields.

PhD IN ENVIRONMENTAL LAW

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The common regulations governing admission into taught PhD programmes in all Institutes, Faculties, Schools and Centres of the University of Nairobi shall apply.

The following shall be eligible for admission:

- A holder of a Master of Arts degree in Environmental Policy, Environmental Law or Environmental Diplomacy from the

University of Nairobi or any other institution recognized by the Senate.

- A holder of a Masters Degree in environmental studies, law, humanities, natural or social sciences or their equivalent from the University of Nairobi or any other institution recognized by the Senate.
- A holder of a doctoral degree in above fields from any institution recognized by the Senate.
- Other qualifications that may be considered acceptable to the Senate as equivalent to a Masters degree in relevant fields.

Participants' theoretical and practical knowledge about EIA and EA procedures including processes, legislation, methods and tools will be enhanced, including improved skills for EIA and EA report writing

Content: Framework and concepts of EIA/ EA; EIA/EA tools and methods; EIA/EA management

Target group: Candidates should hold at least a first degree or equivalent from a recognized institution. The course is primarily intended for: Trainers of trainers; Decision-makers and specialists at environmental authorities, Lead Agencies, people in industry and organizations using EIA to identify and monitor environmental impacts of policies, plans, programmes and projects, and EA as an environmental performance evaluation tool.
