The Korean government invitation program for undergraduate students from major partner countries 2013 was jointly hosted by the NIIED (National Institute of International Education.), Chung-Ang University and the Korean government through the Ministry of foreign affairs.

Its main aim was to introduce the student from invited countries to the Korean economy, business, culture and society with the aim of strengthening the trade ties between the various countries that were represented in the program. It took place from the 9<sup>th</sup> of July to the 19<sup>th</sup> of July 2013 and hosted 60 students from over 25 countries. The continents represented included Africa, South America, Europe, and Asia.

#### Introduction To Chung-Ang University.

Chung-Ang University, established in 1918, is a private comprehensive institution. Across two campuses in Seoul and the nearby suburban area of Anseong, Chung-Ang University enrolls over 30,000 students with 982 faculty members between 11 colleges and 15 graduates' schools.

He also introduced the students to what NIIED through a power point presentation. He emphasized that this was a way of bridging the gap between Korea and its major partner countries. He officially welcomed us to South Korea and wished us a safe and exciting stay in Korea. Other dignitaries who made their remarks included Choi Do Lim, the vice president of Office of International Affairs Chung-Ang University and Hong Jun Hyun, Dean Office of International Affairs.

This was followed by a welcome party at the same institution.
