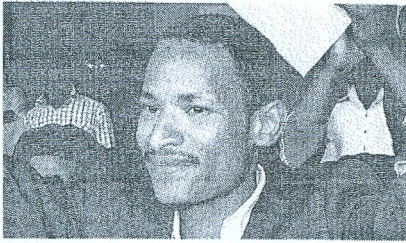

Sonu chairman wins back seat

Paul Ongili alias Babu Owino (above) is back at the helm of the Students Organisation of Nairobi University.

In elections held yesterday, the second year law student got 10,225 votes with his closest opponent, Philbert Kong'ola, managing 3,000 votes.

Babu made history by becoming the first student to be elected twice for the same position. He won amidst a chaotic election and highly charged campaigns.

University management tried and failed to bar the former ODM aspirant for the Westlands Parliamentary seat from vying for the second time.

Through his lawyer, LSK chair Eric Mutua, Babu managed to stop the UoN administration from amending the Constitution which could have barred him from contesting.

Speaking to the *Sunday Nation*, Babu said his win was expected since he had no competition.

Irene Kendi and Linda Gwantai were elected vice-chairperson and finance secretary respectively.

Government insists security operation v continue nationwide rid country of crimi

More than 60 people v rested in Nakuru on night as the anti-te operation was extended I Nairobi's Eastleigh district operation largely targets for living in Kenya illegally and suspected of committing crimes like robbery, carjacking murder.

CLARIFICATION - ELECTRICITY CONNECTIO

Further to our earlier advertisement on new connections, Kenya Power wishes to clarify as follows:-

1. All prospective customers who are within 600 meters of a distribution transformer, and whose actual connectivity cost is Kshs.135,000 or less (particularly those who require 25kVA) will only pay Kshs.35,000 to Kenya Power for power connection. Kenya Power shall pre-invest Kshs.100,000 for electricity connection for customers who are the majority of the applicants.

2. All prospective customers whose actual connectivity cost is more than Kshs.135,000 will pay the full cost of connection to Kenya Power.
